MK 6:31 And He (Jesus) said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a secluded place and **rest a while**." (For there were many people coming and going, and they did not even have time to eat.)

By the time you read this, Sandy and I will be back from vacation in Colorado. But as I write this, I am anticipating, with joy, departing next Sunday! I am excited! I look forward to seeing my mom and spending time with old friends from high school! (My, how THEY have aged!) I look forward to walking in the Garden of the Gods, my favorite place on the planet! I'm excited about walks in the mountains and the cool night air. We didn't get much of a vacation last year and we want to make up for it. When I was in youth group, I loved going to camp. It was so fun to meet people from all around the state, and to even make a few new friends! Camp is a great intensive time to "recharge" or even to start a relationship with Christ for the students, if done well and followed upon by the church to further that discipleship process.

I remember one year at camp, I kept running into a particularly interesting situation. If you've ever been to a church camp, you know that one church that brings like 40 students. They are always identifiable by their "T-shirt of the Day", as I call them; you know the ones, the group where everyone wears the red church shirts on Monday, the blue church shirts on Tuesday, etc. I started to notice a trend within this group, that they would randomly throughout the day say to each other "Hey! It's almost 4:30."

I would look at my watch (back in the days before every teenager had a cell phone), and think to myself "It's nowhere near 4:30... we just finished lunch!". Finally, one day, after hearing it several times from this group, I asked one of them what was the meaning behind it. They explained to me that it was something that their Youth Pastor had started with their group. If they hear anybody saying anything that is not encouraging and uplifting to someone, they call out to each other that little mantra. Most of you are probably just as lost as I was on this, while some of you may know where I am headed.

This Youth Pastor was referencing Ephesians 4:29, which says:

No foul language should come from your mouth, but <u>only</u> what is good for <u>building up someone</u> in need, so that it gives grace to those who hear. (Eph 4:29, CSB)

My JHBC family, first and foremost I would like to thank you for welcoming me so dearly over the past month. The kind words, messages, and visits to the office have meant the world to me! I am so very glad God brought me here, and I am incredibly excited for what He has planned for me and for JHBC! I hope you are too.

Let this just simply serve as a reminder to continue what you have already been doing.

Sometimes, Christians are the worst about shooting their wounded. Unusual for my 'article', this month I'd like to talk about a couple different things. First, I'd like to say how much I enjoy having the Choir join in leading worship again. It's great having their voices and faces along with me, as we as the body of Christ at JHBC sing the praises of our wonderful and gracious God.

It wasn't long ago (June 27), I began singing a song while the Choir made their re-appearance in the Choir loft. The song is called "Old Church Choir". Yeah, it's fun to sing, but that's not why we sing it. There are a lot of songs that are fun to sing, but that is not the standard I use when selecting songs to include in our services. The message of this song is about the joy that comes from having the gospel of salvation in your life. The assurance of knowing that nothing can steal us from God's hand, of knowing that even when we face unclimbable mountains, He will never leave us. There is a rhythm, a driving force that you can hear and feel within your heart that allows you to clap your hands and stomp your feet, as the power of the gospel causes you to lift your eyes toward heaven and sing for joy in any and every situation, challenging or magnificent. That's what it means to say,

"I've got an old church choir singing in my soul.
I've got a sweet salvation, and it's beautiful.
I've got a heart, overflowing, cause I've been restored.
There ain't nothin' gonna steal my joy.
No, there ain't nothin' gonna steal my joy."

Second, I would guess that many of you are familiar with the concept that George Blackaby proposed in his book "Experiencing God" that we should find where God is working, and join Him there (my simple paraphrase). Here's what I have seen in the last few months. People are joining the church, folks are returning to worship, adults and children are being baptized, and visitors are showing up every week in our worship service. Someone even made the comment to me the other day after seeing several raised hands in worship, that they wondered if they were in the right church (then, laughed). I assured them, they were in the right place. For the record, let me say that whether folks raise their hands or clap in worship is between them and the Lord. But, it does excite me to sense that people have come to actively engage with God and feel comfortable doing so.

What I take away from this is that God appears to be blessing us with His presence and His power. So, the question is, "How do we 'join Him' in what He's doing?" I have a few ideas I'd like to offer. Read them over and if you feel God leading you to latch on to one of them, then do so with all the strength He gives you.

- 1. Be friendly to everyone, particularly those you do NOT know. God has a purpose for every person He brings to this place. Make sure they feel welcome so they stay long enough to find out what that is.
- 2. Worship intently and with freedom. If that means singing louder, do it. If that means praying with more intensity, do it. And if you are led to raise your hands or clap during or after a song (for the Lord), then do so.
- 3. Reconsider what role God has for you at JHBC, and recommit yourself to it. If it's to pray for its ministries, we need it. If it's reaching out to those outside the church, most definitely, be bold. If you are led to join the Choir, show up on Wednesdays at 7:25 pm. You will be blessed and be a blessing in all these ways and many others.



6:00-7:30 pm Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church McDowell Fellowship Hall


Awana is a Children's Ministry for Children 3 years old up to 5th grade. We meet on Wednesday nights during the school year.
