

**FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . .**



Thanksgiving has passed. Christmas is coming! And Advent is already here!

This is the Gaskins family's sixth Advent and Christmas with you. As I've reminded you before, Advent is *not* a matter of celebrating Christmas early. It's a season of penitence and preparation, of anticipation and expectation, as we prepare our hearts to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus, the Messiah, and as we look forward to His return in glory.

*Advent gets us ready for Christmas.* We think about how God broke into history, sending His Son to save us from our sins. We think about the preparations He made—some in miraculous ways, some through the ordinary events of history—and the promises He gave of salvation and deliverance. But we also look ahead to the fulfillment of the promise that Christ will return in glory to judge the world, to right all the wrongs, and to create new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness dwells. And as we look ahead, we prepare our hearts so we'll be ready when He comes.

So that's what we're focusing on in our worship during the Sundays of Advent 2010. We often complain about the commercialization of Christmas that makes it so easy to lose sight of what it's really all about. Advent is the antidote to that. It helps us focus and stay focused, reminding us that these are *holy days*. It puts Bethlehem in the context of God's great eternal purpose of redemption, reminding us that the baby in the manger was God the Son in the flesh who came to die on the cross and rise from the dead to save us, the King of kings and Lord of lords who will come again to bring His kingdom in its fullness, redeeming even the creation itself in new heavens and a new earth!

For a century or more now, Baptists have done something at Christmas that makes all the sense in the world—we have received an offering for foreign or international missions. And we'll continue that good Baptist tradition again this year. As in recent years, you may give to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions (Southern Baptist International Mission Board) or to the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship Offering for Global Missions, or both. Also, if you missed giving to one of our other mission offerings throughout the year (Baptist Retirement Homes, Baptist Hospital, Baptist Children's Homes, North Carolina Missions, World Hunger, or North American Missions through Annie Armstrong or CBF Global Missions), you can still give for this year and we will forward the funds to the appropriate recipients. As the economic recession and its aftermath have dragged on, this is a time of great need and great shortfalls in giving to many of these efforts and others. So you might even want to consider asking your family to make their Christmas gifts to you in the form of an offering to a worthy mission cause in your honor.

As important as missions giving is—and it is!—too often we act as though that's all that missions support is about. But it's not.

Our WMU regularly reminds us of the importance of prayer support. There is no substitute for lifting missionaries and their work in prayer to our God. Both giving and prayer are essential.

But even these two crucial ingredients aren't enough in the mix of being on mission with Christ in the world. Substantial giving to missions and dedicated prayer for missions are both good signs that a church is *mission-minded*. But we really have to go a step farther to be truly *on mission with Christ*—His mission must permeate everything we are and do! We have to order everything we do as a church around His mission, so that *His mission* becomes *our mission*. And the way we've chosen to express our mission as the Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church is that "by the grace of God and the power of His Holy Spirit, we will embody the presence of the crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ to Sanford and the world through our worship, our witness, and our way of life as His disciples." That means living out the mission of Christ here and around the world.

I believe that as a congregation, we're making some significant strides in this crucial aspect of being a church. Our involvement in efforts like Operation Inasmuch, mission trips, and *Mission Jonesboro* indicate that. Our commitment to grow in our budgeted missions giving is another positive indicator. Many of you have stepped up to the challenge and been obedient to the Lord in these areas. And as your pastor, I am appropriately proud of you! It's a genuine joy to see our congregation on mission with Christ!

**FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . . (CONTINUED)**


If you're not already missionally involved, I want to challenge you, especially as we prepare to celebrate how our Lord Jesus Christ came on His redemptive mission into the world, to consider how God wants *you* to be a part of His mission. Is it greater financial or prayer support? Is it more direct participation in some kind of local ministry that proclaims the gospel in word and deed? Is God calling you to be involved in *Mission Jonesboro*? Is He calling you to participate in a short-term mission trip? Is He calling you to plant your life in another place to carry the gospel to those who haven't yet heard it? Is He calling you to some kind of vocational ministry? Does God want you to be a prayer warrior for His mission, praying for those who serve, those who hear, and for workers for the harvest? He has given us so many gifts in our congregation, and He calls us to participate in His mission in many different ways. Are you striving to use your gifts in God's mission as a member of the body of Christ? Or are you too occupied with other things?

I wonder . . . What if Christ had been too busy with other things to come? What if the apostles had been too involved in other things to be consumed by the passion of His mission? What if no one had ever shared the good news of Jesus Christ . . . with us?

Finally, just a reminder about our services during December . . . Please see other articles in this edition of the *Announcer* about this year's musical presentations. As we've done in recent years, the Sunday before Christmas (December 19), our whole church family will come together at 11:00 a.m. for a combined Christmas worship service (no Celebration Service that morning). Then on Christmas Eve, we'll gather at 5:00 p.m. for our Christmas Eve Communion Service. This will give us the opportunity to worship together in celebration of Christ's birth, then go to participate in our own family festivities. I hope you'll all make plans to join us for each of these opportunities for worship and fellowship.

Jo Ann, Jeffrey, Jonathan, and I wish you a blessed Advent and a merry Christmas filled with God's grace and peace—and a continually deepening sense of *His* mission.

## POLICY CHANGE RECOMMENDATIONS

The following policy change was presented at the November 7, 2010 Business meeting as a recommendation from the Buildings and Grounds Committee and Fellowship of Deacons. These policy changes will be presented at the **January 16, 2011** Business Meeting for a second review and possible action. If you have any comments please contact Church Administrator David Webb, or a member of the Deacons or Buildings and Grounds Committee.

Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church  
Safety and Security Policy  
(Draft Date- August 7, 2010)

### A. General Safety Policies

1. The Board of Deacons shall appoint a staff member or church member as Safety Coordinator who shall oversee the safety policies and procedures of the church, assure their implementation, and make recommendations for enhanced policies and procedures.
2. The Board of Deacons shall appoint a Safety Team comprised of representatives of the Deacons, Church Council, Buildings and Grounds Committee, and Sunday School Council. All church staff shall serve on this team as well.

### B. Building and Fire Safety

1. The Safety Team will coordinate with the Buildings and Grounds Committee staff to conduct a fire and safety inspection of all facilities. This will be done at a minimum on an annual basis. The committee shall use the fire safety checklist found in the Operations Manual.
2. Fire extinguishers shall be available and maintained, as well as other appropriate fire-fighting equipment.
3. Staff (paid and volunteer) shall have adequate training covering fire safety, evacuation, and the use of alarms and equipment
4. Special inspections shall insure that fire hazards are avoided, including care in the storage of flammable liquids, improper use of extension cords or electrical equipment.
5. An evacuation plan shall be in place, including the posting in all facilities of exit directions, and clear signs and functioning exit doors. Evacuation training shall be provided all staff and teachers, including fire drills when appropriate.
6. The Safety Coordinator shall assure the church is in full compliance with fire regulations, and shall seek the counsel of fire department personnel, and insurance company recommendations.

## **POLICY CHANGE RECOMMENDATIONS—Page 2**

### **C. Accident Policies**

1. The church shall assure the prompt availability of first-aid supplies in all church facilities.
2. The church shall provide first-aid and CPR training for church staff and leaders, especially those who work with children and youth. The church shall have available the names and means of contacting persons with medical assistance skills.
3. The church shall prominently post the contact numbers for police agencies, medical assistance, ambulance service, poison information offices and other appropriate persons or agencies.
4. Accidents shall be promptly reported to all appropriate persons including the church's insurance carrier.
5. The Safety Coordinator and those present shall assure that the Accident-Incident Report Form is promptly completed.
6. The Safety Coordinator and appropriate staff and committees shall investigate all accidents, and take or recommend such steps as they think appropriate to minimize future risks, and review as well the church's response to the accident and any ways to enhance the response.

### **D. Safety Training**

1. The Safety Team shall assure that all staff and church leaders have adequate safety training and appropriate refresher training in many dimensions of safety for personnel and those who utilize the facilities of the church.

### **E. Security/Safety of Participants**

#### **General Measures**

1. The Safety Team shall develop and recommend to the church specific measures to provide security for church facilities and those involved in the church's ministry.
2. The Safety Team shall develop an incident response plan with the local law enforcement officials.
3. During periods of services, the Safety Team shall coordinate with the Ushers to monitor all entrances into the building and coordinate an appropriate response.
4. Entry security policies shall include key-control systems, door and window locks and systems, and appropriate landscaping and lighting to impede unauthorized entry.
5. The committee shall also consider the appropriateness of internal security measures such as visitor registration, video and other monitoring, and fire, smoke and entry alarm systems.

**POLICY CHANGE RECOMMENDATIONS—Page 3**

F. Personal Safety and Security Review

1. The Buildings and Grounds shall annually, as well as whenever concerns are expressed or the church requests, review the security of the building and grounds for persons using, entering or leaving the facilities, and assure that appropriate personnel, locks, lighting, security and other systems and procedures are in place to assure to the extent feasible the safety of all those who participate in the life of the church and come on its premises.
2. They shall make a written record of any recommendations to the Board of Deacons and Church Council, with steps taken and responses to specific concerns expressed by persons of church bodies.


