On the 29th of November we once again enter into the season of Advent. On each of the four Sundays before Christmas we light a candle representing *Hope*, *Peace*, *Joy*, and *Love*. Then on Christmas Eve we will light the Christ Candle.

Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love seem like pretty audacious words considering all we have gone through over the last nine months. Certainly many of us will celebrate Christmas differently than we have in days of yore. And even though we take comfort in celebrating Christmas with a sense of tradition, I can't help but believe that stripping away some of chaos and distraction might actually make this Christmas more meaningful than ever. DEACON'S CORNER

On Monday, November 2 at 6:30 PM, Chairman John Hall welcomed the Fellowship of Deacons to our monthly meeting.

Roger Vance led our time of devotion reading from Matthew 11:28-30, referencing that as we carry heavy burdens Jesus is always with us in our work.

Prayer requests from our Family Deacon Ministry were shared by all. We have had several members with recent surgeries and stressful family situations over the past month. Roger Vance closed this portion with prayer.

Minutes of the October meeting were reviewed and approved.

Pastor Cal Sayles shared his monthly report. The annual Hanging of the Greens will be held on Sunday evening, November 29, at 6:30 PM. On Thursday, December 24, our staff is planning the annual Christmas Eve Service. There will be two (2) Christmas Eve services this year - one service will begin at 5:00 PM and the second service will begin at 6:30 PM. The two Christmas Eve services were approved by the Fellowship of Deacons this year to keep our attendance under 100 people per service. More details will be shared in December.

On October 11, 2020, the demolition of the Annex building was approved. The demolition should be completed by mid-December with favorable weather.

Ron Rouse reported that the Church approved the Title and Job Description of the Associate Pastor of Families and Education. He reported that this position has been posted so we can now receive applications.

On Saturday, October 31, JHBC held a Trunk or Treat event for the children and families of the community. There was approximately 100 in attendance.

Under Congregational Feedback, Carolyn Marsh asked about when we could expect the return of children to services. After some discussion, a date of Sunday, November 29 was possible at the 11 AM service.

In closing, the Fellowship of Deacons approved the month of November as "Staff Appreciation Month". The mailboxes have been placed in the hallway in front of the offices for our congregation to put cards, a personal note, or a gift of appreciation for each staff member.

During this challenging era, it is all the more important that we hold on to our precious traditions, perhaps add a few new ones, and stay connected with one another. In that light, I want to share some information about two special events in December.

JHBC Scavenger Hunt and Christmas Tree Lighting

On the 5th of December at 3:30 PM, we will meet at JHBC for a Scavenger Hunt and Christmas Tree Lighting. We hope to have a tree on the new property adjacent to the church which we will decorate together. Would you be so kind as to bring one decoration for the tree? Please don't bring the one handed down through the generations – you may not get this one back! Just bring one simple, colorful decoration to make the tree beautiful.

Once decorated, family groups or pods, will do a scavenger hunt in downtown Sanford. I won't share all the details because we want it to be a surprise. BUT...it will involve ice-cream, chocolate and cookies, so...WIN! Everyone will have a different order to prevent overcrowding.

We will meet back at the church no later than 5:30 PM to light the Christmas tree and sings a few carols. Please make sure to bring your mask and maintain your distance. Let's have fun and be safe!

Christmas Eve Services

Of course the Christmas Eve service is slightly more complicated than usual...like everything else! Even so, we want to have a beautiful service and encourage as many people as possible to come, celebrate and worship.

After some study, we feel that we can keep our social distance if we allow no more than 100 people in the sanctuary. Thankfully, over the past few years, our Christmas Eve attendance has increased to well over 150. So, to allow the greatest number of people to come and celebrate the birth of Jesus, and maintain our maximum of attendance of 100 people, we will have two services; one at 5:00 PM (our normal time) and another at 6:30 PM.

This will require people to sign up in advance for one of the two services. On the 29th of November the signup will begin on the Family Life bulletin board. Then throughout the week you can call or email me to make your reservation as well.

Both services will include the Lord's Supper so a deacon will greet you at the door and hand you one fully contained cup of the elements. As is our tradition, we will 'walk to the manger' at the end of the service. But this year we ask that you take everything with you and not re-enter the sanctuary. In between the services we will sanitize the sanctuary to be as safe as possible.

I understand that this is a little more complicated than usual, but it truly is our desire to have a wonderful, worshipful Christmas celebration, as safely as possible. Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation.

Gifts of Advent

Can you believe it? Christmas is almost here! For many, that means getting going on their present purchasing, so they don't get stuck running around, frantically trying to find 'the perfect gift' with only a few hours left before family shows up, and at the last moment, admitting defeat by stopping at the gift card display. It might also mean breaking out the mixer and turning the kitchen into Santa's bakery enveloped in a cloud of self-rising flour. And, it could, in a worst-case scenario, look like that play a football team does as the clock is running out and it needs to score. A player gets the ball and advances it as far as they can, and just before they get tackled, attempt to lateral the ball backwards to one of their teammates, who attempts the same thing. On and on they go until almost invariably, they get tackled, the other team gets ball, or it goes out of bounds. It looks like, and usually is, a disaster. Does any of this sound familiar?

Let me paint another picture, the one we as Christians often aim for in the distant months before December when we remember last year and vow to 'do Christmas differently this year'.

The season of Advent begins on Sunday, Nov. 29 as the time of expectant waiting and preparation for the coming of the Christ-child at Christmas. The roots of Advent also include, and maybe were even more greatly centered on anticipating the second coming of Christ. Both of these involve looking forward, expecting great and wondrous things.

So, I'd like to encourage us (you AND me) to look forward, anticipating Christ and His imminent return, and offer the following as gifts to Him.

- 1. **Excitement**. I know it's hard in this time of Covid to be excited about much of anything, but I am excited about what God is going to do at JHBC as we move forward, into a post-Covid era. I am praying for a season of growth, something that we've not seen in 50 years. Not just in numbers, but in faith, and service, and impacting our community. I'd like people as they drive by on a Sunday morning to say, "Something must be going on at Jonesboro Heights! I haven't seen that many cars there in years! Maybe we should stop in and see what's up!" Anybody want to join me in that prayer?
- 2. Passionate Worship. Many resonate with the song "I Can Only Imagine", wondering how they will respond when they find themselves before the throne of God in heaven. Ask yourselves, "What does that mean about how we worship here?". Will you raise your voice in worship there? You should do that here. Will you lift your hands in worship there? Why not here? Will you kneel in worship there? Go ahead and do that here. I'd like to see us as the body of Christ engaging in worship that is both passionate and sincere. The way we anticipate worshipping in heaven should be the way we worship now. The geography may be different, but God is the same.
- 3. **Unified in love**. One of the Song of Ascents, Psalm 133 includes this statement, "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!". I love that the psalmist ended that with an exclamation point, noting the importance of the thought. The Apostle Paul in Colossians 3:12-14 says this:

"Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity."

My prayer is that our church would be characterized by these qualities and that the cancer of disunity would be eliminated. Can we expect the blessing of God without it?

What wonderful gifts these would be to give to the Father this Advent season.


