FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . .


Prayer is an integral, critical part of the Christian life. As disciples of Jesus, we simply can't do without prayer. If we are following Jesus, we are seeking to be like Him. And He was a person of prayer. Over and over in the Gospels we see Jesus slipping away to a quiet place to pray. Sometimes we see Him praying in the presence of His disciples, or even in the presence of the crowds. The Gospels make it clear that Jesus spent much time in prayer to His Father in heaven.

Sometimes in the midst of crisis, we hear someone say (or we say it ourselves), "All we can do now is pray." The fact is that praying is the most powerful and most important thing we can do in a crisis or otherwise! It should never be a last ditch attempt. We should begin with prayer and bathe all we do in prayer. As the old saying puts it: "Pray for a good harvest, and keep on hoeing."

Activists that we Baptists are, we often simply want to *do something*. And there's a time and a place for us to do something. The earthquake in Haiti and its aftermath are teaching us that sometimes there's only so much we can *do*. Only certain kinds of aid and workers are being allowed in at this point. Many who want to go to help would not be allowed in at this point—later, maybe, but not now. But *nothing* can stop us from praying—from asking the God of the universe to work on behalf of those who are suffering because of this incredible disaster.

I'm grateful to be able to report to you that over the past several Sundays, the Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church family has given over \$4,635 to be forwarded to North Carolina Baptist Men for their disaster relief work in Haiti. And that is very important. Right now NCBM is only taking medical personnel to Haiti. But these funds will be used in this work or in later recovery work, works that will be done in the name of Christ and as a witness of His love. It will be interesting to see just how God will work through this awful disaster in the years to come to turn people in Haiti to Himself. Thank you for your support of this special offering.

But remember, as important as all the other efforts are—and they are—the *most important* thing we can do in this situation is to *pray* for Haiti and its people. Pray for the survivors. Pray for those who grieve over the deaths of their loved ones, and for those who lost their limbs though not their lives. Pray that those who are ministering to the survivors' physical and spiritual needs will have the physical and spiritual strength they need to carry out their task. Pray that as the survivors experience the love of Christ through these workers they will open their hearts to the gospel so that many will be saved and a spiritual awakening will come to Haiti. Pray that the rebuilding of this nation that will have to take place will help it to rise out of its poverty and destitution. Pray for God's grace to have an incredible impact on the Haitian people in life-changing ways.



FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . . (Continued)

There are some other things we need to be praying about as a church. As you know, late last year we acquired the Mann property at the corner of Woodland Avenue and Globe Street. The staff, the Deacons, and now the Missions, Outreach, Building and Grounds, and Facilities Planning committees have been in prayerful consideration and discussion of how we believe God wants us to use this property. Would you join us in prayer about this matter? The congregation will soon hear a proposal about this matter. Pray that God would guide our leaders and that He will give us a congregational consensus and a spirit of unity. The way for us to know what God wants us to do with this property is to be in earnest prayer, both corporately and individually, seeking God and His will in this matter. May we never be guilty of simply deciding to use any property on the basis of personal preferences or benefit!

Another concern I would invite you to pray about is our military and the civil servants and civilian contractors who work with them. Over the past several years, our church has been no stranger to having folks in these roles deployed to Iraq or Afghanistan or in supporting roles elsewhere. There is always some degree of danger in these deployments. We need to pray for all those who defend us. Our military also plays other important roles as well. Over the past several weeks, the U.S. military has been very actively involved in a humanitarian mission in Haiti, helping distribute food and water and giving medical treatment. We need to pray for these troops as well. Whether it's what they see and experience in the battle zone or the disaster area, these brave souls have a lot to deal with physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Pray for their safety and for their spiritual and emotional health.

In February, we have traditionally focused on Christian higher education in our Baptist schools. While the relationship between our North Carolina Baptist universities and college and the Baptist State Convention has changed, these schools continue their work of Christian higher education. I urge you to pray for Baptist schools—for the students, faculties, administrations, staffs, and the trustees. Our schools are not perfect, but they are excellent. We will be blessed to have as our guest preacher on Sunday, February 21, Dr. Mike Cogdill, Dean of the Campbell University Divinity School. Dr. Cogdill will be stepping down from his role as Dean in May (he will continue to teach in the Divinity School), so pray about the search for a new Dean. This is a vitally important position in so many ways, and the search committee needs your prayers.

And finally, there are so many people who are hurting in so many ways. For some, it's a strained or broken relationship. For others, it's a health problem or grief. Still others are facing incredible financial pressures because of the economy or a lost job. Pray for these hurting people. All of us have something to deal with. We all need each other's prayers.

So let us pray . . .

Family Ministry



Nobody ever promised that being a parent would be easy and that's a good thing, because it surely isn't. There's so much going on all around us, even inside our homes. Everything seems to be trying to wrestle its way into being the NUMBER ONE PRIORITY. It's like we are listening to salesmen all day telling us how badly we need their product in our lives.

Most of the things we try to make room for have value, but not all are necessities. Having worked with children, youth, and their families for much of my life, I've been frankly troubled by the priorities so many have chosen. To cut to the chase, whatever is in competition with spiritual matters (church, Bible study, prayer, etc.) almost always wins. You know I'm not exaggerating. It's always amazed me that

parents have their children at every sport event, but church or youth worship is, at best, sporadic.

I wish that I could say that I stand on high ground, but I can't. My family wrestles with priorities as much as any other family. We decided up front that if God allowed us to have children, we would not let sports, music, jobs, or anything else come before church. That hasn't been a problem for us. The wrestling match in our home is over how our time together is spent; over what brings us together as a family and builds us up versus what robs us of important time.

I've always told you that I have no desire to make you think our family is "perfect" or that we don't have problems like everyone else. So, I'll share a bit of our world with you, hoping that it will make you look at your home life under the same microscope.

We eat meals together, away from the radio or television (except on rare occasions). We talk about things in our lives. We listen to each other. If your family doesn't share meals together and turn off everything else, you're making the first major mistake families make. So far, so good. However, from this point, it's all downhill. Next, we go into the den (many call it the family room. Imagine that!) We plop down on the sofa and in our favorite chairs and turn on the television. Terri has several not-so-affectionate names for that innocent appliance; names I won't mention here. We look for something important or interesting to watch (seriously?), but always settle for something unimportant and mind-numbing.

That woman that God gave to me (as my ancestor Adam called Eve) always reminds us what we are throwing away. She tells us that we could (and should) be playing music and learning new songs, reading a book out loud together, playing board games, having a nightly family Bible study and prayer, etc. You know; all that stuff that's virtuous. I absolutely 100% know that she is right and that irreplaceable family time is being squandered, but night after night, month after month, and year after year (I'll stop there. It's too depressing) slip away. Why? Because my "want to's" and "know- I -should's" are not my priorities. Terri is right. No contest. I hang my head as I write this!

It all comes down to what's important to you; what you want for your family. It's not like we have to become Amish to have family priorities, but maybe we could learn a lesson from them. Most of us think the Amish are a bit weird because they don't have TVs, cars, food processors, or other modern essentials like microwave ovens or nose hair trimmers. In a book about the Amish, I read about a tourist asking an Amish man why they don't have TVs. The Amish man asked, "Do you have a TV"? The tourist replied that he certainly did. The Amish man next asked, "Do you find that it's good for your family? Are your children better off because you have a TV...or are they worse off?" The tourist admitted that it was not really a very good thing for his family. The Amish man said, "That's one of the very important differences about us. We look at EVERYTHING to decide if it will build our family up or tear it apart."

One of the children of a JHBC family told me that they had recently cut off their satellite dish. She said it was because TV was taking away from more important things. Out of fear that some of you may form an angry mob and storm their house with torches and pitchforks, I won't say which family it is. I will say, though, that I am "cut to the bone" by their courage and, yes, love for their children.

Do you or I love our children, our family enough to do away with anything that keeps us from what is essential? That's not a rhetorical question. Ask yourself this very minute! Do you? Well, then, what are you going to do? Are you going to continue to let sports trump church for your children? Are you going to continue to let _____ (you fill in the blank) win the wrestling match.

Most parents will read this, throw it aside and go back to thinking happier thoughts. Maybe you won't. All I can do is write what God has put on my heart. I can't make you do one or the other. But the big question for me is, what am I going to do?




