From the Desk of the Senior Pastor

JOS 1:9 *"Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous!
Do not tremble or be dismayed,
for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."*

I went to the doctor recently to address some knee pain I was having. I had self-diagnosed the problem (*I am a doctor after all!*) and was ready to consult with the MD. But, it didn't take long for him to point out I was incorrect and gave his 'medical school' diagnosis. Then he said words that are still ringing in my ears; *'after all a man of your age should...'* Wooooo, hold up there doc! I didn't hear anything after, *'a man of your age.'* No one had ever said that to me before and I didn't like it. At all!

I have never thought much about age probably because it has never limited anything I wanted to do – until recently. There has never been a job I was concerned about tackling, a mission trip I turned down...until recently. Recently, I have had to think about physical limitations as I consider doing this or that. And I don't like it.

The truth is I have started to think about it, and probably too much. I worry about health, mine and Sandy's. I have felt a new insecurity creeping into my life and again, I don't like it.

2nd Corinthians 10:5 says *'...we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ,'* I have come to believe I need to take this new thought, this new insecurity captive and replace it with a better one.

I have discovered that the best way to take a thought captive is by replacing it with a new Scriptural thought. For instance **Joshua 1:7** says *"Only **be strong and very courageous**; be careful to do according to all the law which Moses My servant commanded you; do not turn from it to the right or to the left, so that you may have success wherever you go."* These are the same words that our Father spoke to Moses; **Deuteronomy 31:6** *"Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid or tremble at them, for the LORD your God is the one who goes with you. **He will not fail you or forsake you.**"* Would you consider something amazing? God loves and promises to provide for you, every bit as much as He did for Moses and Joshua.

When I think back, every age has its unique problems and opportunities to respond with courage or with fear. The good 'ol days are often not as good as we remember and the future isn't as frightening as it seems. Why? Because no matter the enemy; college exams, parenting young children, putting those kids through college, job insecurities, or knees that just don't work like they used to – the one thing that will not change is God's love and provision; **He will not fail you or forsake you.**

I know it isn't easy – it wasn't easy for Joshua. Did you notice that God has to say to Joshua three times; *"Do not tremble or be dismayed"*? That tells me Joshua was trembling and dismayed! But the Word of the Lord reminds us we don't have to because He is with us wherever we go. So take that thought captive and enjoy the precious gift of life!

Worship Notes from Scott

You know how sometimes when you listen to music, a song gets in your head and you just can't get rid of it. You find yourself strangely humming it or whistling it hours, maybe even days later? Well, lately that's happened to me. Thank the Lord, it wasn't "Father Abraham" or "The Song That Never Ends". I don't remember exactly how I came across it. It was likely either when I was getting ready in the morning (I often have the iHeart Radio app on my phone playing Air1 Radio, a contemporary Christian music station), or something I ran across as I was selecting music for one of our services. But, however I came to hear it, I have to say, it has stayed with me for several weeks as my 'go to' worship video on Youtube.

The song is called *Way Maker*. The version I listen to is sung by the band Leland. The leader is Leland Mooring. You may not have heard of him, but you are probably familiar with one of the songs he co-wrote, *Lion and the Lamb*. I enjoy watching a Youtube video of *Way Maker*, which appears to have been recorded at a live concert. I learn stuff from watching other worship leaders and I can personally worship at the same time. If you watch it, you'll immediately notice that the setting is much different than we are used to at JHBC, and I am totally fine with that. Two critical elements that must be present for corporate worship are these: 1) us, and 2) God. Beyond that, everything else is negotiable (fog, lights, pulpit, pews, etc.). I will save the rest of that discussion for another time.

First, let me talk about the content and the context of the song. It is a song completely directed towards God. In fact, every part of the song is conspicuously filled with the word You. It talks about who God is (our perception of Him as He has and does interact with us His children). And it talks about what He is doing, noting how He impacts those who engage with Him.

Often before our service on Sunday, whether with the worship band or the choir, I will include in my prayer the hope that the Spirit of God will be active in our service, drawing us in and working in our lives. The verses of this song detail a number of ways that may occur, moving and working in us, touching and healing our hearts, turning our lives around, and mending our hearts. And throughout this accounting, the lyrics repeat "I worship You, I worship You".

The chorus of the song simply says, "You are, Way Maker, Miracle Worker, Promise Keeper, Light in the darkness. My God, that is who You are." How true! God made a way for us to know Him by sending His Son, Jesus as the atoning sacrifice for our sins, so we could have this personal relationship with Him, the Maker of the Universe and the Lover of our Souls. And He was all those other things, and more. That is who our God is.

The song also goes on to confidently proclaim God's faithfulness in the midst of our limited ability to know and observe His actions, saying, "Even when I don't see it, You're working. Even when I don't feel it, You're working. You never stop, You never stop working." Again, how true!

Let me encourage you, the next time you enter the sanctuary during our worship service, to use that time to seek the Lord's Spirit and confidently claim this verse.

"For where two or three have gathered together in my name,

I am there in their midst." Matthew 18:20 (NASB)

And without flowery words, or a familiar tune, simply say, "I worship You. I worship You."

We can surely say, God has been worshipped MORE in Albanian this year! Jesus said to us that even if people stop worshipping, the rocks will cry out in worship (Paraphrased from Luke 19:40). Though sometimes serving in places where people don't know Jesus, feels like living among dead stones, God promises that He can even raise rocks to cry out and worship God!

With our music ministry, we began saying, that even if nobody out there will come to sing with us, write songs with us, or listen to these songs we are releasing; God still deserves to be worshipped in Albanian. That alone has been the driving reason for us as we have served God this past year.

We rejoice because this year many new songs were written in Albanian for Jesus!
