JN 7:38 "He who believes in Me, as the Scripture said, 'From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water.'"

#### The Battle Belongs to You

Throughout 2020, my prayer and the prayers of the staff of JHBC have continually been for the physical health and spiritual growth of those who worship here. And while the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons can be a hard time for some, for most, I believe, they are a time of rejoicing and reflection on the good memories of the past year and the years past.

Personally, 2020 has been a positive year. I'll admit, it's been unlike any other year any of us has ever experienced (I refuse to use the term 'unprecedented'), but throughout it, God has continued to show Himself faithful and kind. However, I know that there are those whose experience is much different than mine. Some have suffered through sickness, the loss of loved ones, and learning to work (or go to school) in a whole new way. And even though there is the anticipation of a vaccine to deal with Covid, there remain a host of challenges that we will face in the new year.

I think that is why, as I was trying to decide what new song to introduce in January, that this one really jumped out at me. The title is "Battle Belongs". It was written and sung by Phil Wickham. He has written a couple other songs that we have recently incorporated into our worship services, "Living Hope" and "Great Things". Those songs, like this one, do a great job directing our attention toward Jesus, who, if not to oversimplify things, is our Living Hope, and has done great things for us. I encourage you to go to www.jhbcworship.org and watch Phil present the song.

So, here's how I see this song being a blessing for us. We are in a season where, no matter where we look (on this earth), there is chaos, confusion, and in many ways an assault on the things and people of God. It is easy to be drawn into this quagmire of despair, and allow our focus to be drawn away from God, and placed on the battle itself, not Him who is Lord over the battle.

The biblical illustration that I see in the words of this song take me to the story of David and Goliath. If you haven't read it in a while, check it out in I Samuel 17. What is clear from reading this story is that David's motivation was to avenge the man who defied the armies of the living God, and that it would be the Lord Almighty that delivered Goliath into David's hand, not his strength or spear, because he had neither. And that is exactly what happened.

For all those who for days had listened to the Philistine boast of his great power and Israel's weakness, the battle seemed overwhelming, as if they were trying to move a mountain. Maybe you have felt the same as the last year has drug on, wearing you down, and drawing your attention away from God. This song is for you. It says that when all we can see is the battle, God already sees your victory. When you're staring down what looks like a mountain, God is waiting for you to ask Him to move it. This challenge is no larger than the ones He's already walked with you through. After God gave the lion and the bear into David's hands, he had no problem believing that God would do the same to the giant who defied the Lord Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel.

Make no mistake, this is a battle cry, and the cry is "the battle belongs to You". The challenge for us it to keep our focus on the Lord, not the things going on around us. God will take care of those, because, as the song says, "Nothing can stand against the power of our God." So, when we sing this song, sing with boldness and confidence, not because we are strong, but because He is.
