Change is something that is inevitable in our lives, and I'm typically not a fan. And when too much change happens around me, I feel like I'm a ship in a storm.

As I was spending a large amount of time on the road the past couple of weeks, I was listening to my music, and one of my favorite songs popped up. The words of the second verse, chorus, and bridge hit me with a reminder.

"When darkness seems to hide His face, I rest on His unchanging grace.
In every high and stormy gale, my anchor holds within the veil.
Christ alone, cornerstone, weak made strong in the Savior's love.
Through the storm, He is Lord, Lord of All.
On Christ the Solid Rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand,
All other ground is sinking sand."

When our faith, hope, and trust is placed where it should be (in God, and not in man), we can rest in the fact that He has us, that He is "the same yesterday, today, and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

We are walking through this season of change together. I am so very excited to be a part of this chapter of JHBC's history... but I am also nervous (and a little stressed, if we are being honest) with all of these changes happening in my life. But praise the LORD that He is a constant in our lives, and that He is walking right next to us the entire way!

I have had a little sticky note with a scripture written on it on my desk for the last couple of months, ever since I mentioned it in one of our services. And, yes, that may say something about the tidiness of my desk. But I left it there intentionally, with the hopes that as I continued to see it day after day as I worked, that the message would sink into my heart and mind.

This is what it says:

"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." - I Thessalonians 5:16-18

Quite possibly the shortest three-verse passage in the Bible, but very powerful instructions for us as God's people. That's what I like, succinct, easily-understood instructions. Unfortunately, not all instructions given to us make quite as much sense. Take these product-use instructions, for example.

- Clothes washer (like you find at a laundromat) "DO NOT put any person in this washer."
- Sun Shield (for your car's front windshield) "Do not drive with sun shield in place."
- Vidal Sassoon Hair Blow Dryer "Do not use while sleeping."
- Jabra 'Drive 'n' Talk' Bluetooth Speaker "Never operate your speakerphone while driving."
- Fox/Bobcat Urine Powder "Not for human consumption."
- Superman Costume (note on company website) "Warning: this costume does not enable flight or super strength."

I looked at this scripture passage and noticed that if you took the first letter of each of these three instructions, you get a possibly helpful way to remember this message.

R - Rejoice always

P - Pray continually

G - Give thanks in all circumstances

As a fan of high adventure movies, I immediately recognized this acrostic, RPG, which stands for Rocket-Propelled Grenade. I'm sure many of you would have done the same. Others are now questioning my sanity. So, in the strange and unique way that I think, I imagined that you could use the acrostic to remind yourself of how to destroy the Devil's schemes that are designed to separate you from God, by using this RPG.

First, rejoice always. There something wonderful, but sadly unique about people who have embraced this first instruction. These people stand out from the crowd because of this commitment, and that's what it is. It's not that these people don't face the same things that seem to steal our joy, they just deal with it differently than most of the rest of us. I thank God for people like Dan Kerr (a friend from Iowa) and Ann Alford for reminding me, not that this is possible, but that it is a great sign that they have a hope in Christ that is bigger than anything the world can offer.

Second, pray continually. Prayer is a rare gift, in providing a means for us to have an ongoing conversation with God. I say ongoing, because it is possible for us to walk in fellowship and communion with God at any time or place in our day. We are only limited by our own desire to stop this conversation. Something I'm not sure why I do, when I know that God is concerned with even the smallest matter in my life. So, let's keep that prayer-line open.

Lastly, give thanks in all circumstances. We can be grateful, even when things are not going the best, because we trust God's word when it says, "And we know that in **all** things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Romans 8:28). I heard Pastor Cal say recently that there will come a time when we may be able to understand why certain things happened in our lives. But until then, let's just trust that the God who made us, loves us, and sustains us deserves our thanks in every situation.

Sunday school will be returning to our regular classrooms on Sunday, June 20. We look forward to once again meeting with our regular Sunday School classes. A special thanks to those that provided Sunday School for us during this transition.

Tommie Angel offered prayer and the meeting was adjourned. The next Deacon meeting will be held on Monday, July 12 at 6:30 PM.

Continue to pray for our church and leaders daily that we may continue to grow and share our love of God with others in our community and beyond.
