

Summer's here! Well, maybe not officially, but for all practical purposes—weather and otherwise—when Memorial Day has passed and school is out, it's summer.

For most of us, summer is a season that involves some changes. Days are longer, allowing more outdoor activities. Students are out of school, unless they're catching up or trying to get ahead, or as with a few programs of study, summer classes are required. Schedules often change for the summer, including church schedules (see the Children's Ministry article for what our JHBC children will be doing this summer). Some things stay the same—our schedule for our worship services on Sunday mornings, evenings, and Wednesday evenings will be unchanged for the most part.

Along with schedule changes, for many families and individuals there will be a change of pace, because along with summer often comes some vacation time. And that's a good thing. We all need to take some time to step back from our regular routine, to relax and reflect and rest. My family and I will be doing that as well, the good Lord willing.

But when you go on vacation, it's important to remain faithful to Christ and his church. *There is no vacation from following Christ.* Paul's advice in Colossians 3:17 is good for all of life, including vacations: "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (NIV).

You know what I mean, don't you?

Sometimes when church members are away from home, they may tend to behave a little differently. They may engage in activities they wouldn't take part in back home where other folks know they profess to be Christians. Rest assured, though the folks back home may not know, the Lord they profess to follow does. There's nothing wrong with relaxing from our regular labors; that's what the concept of the Sabbath was about. But there is something wrong with relaxing from our commitment to Christ! Our commitment is to be constant—"And *whatever* you do . . . do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus . . ."

I want to encourage you who will go on vacation this summer to be conscious of your commitment to Christ. Continue to live out your faith daily. Find a church to worship with while you are away. Take some time to reflect on your relationship with the Lord while you're in a more relaxed setting.

And don't forget your church here at home. Pray for us while you are away. And when you return—or even before your go—make up on your tithes and offerings for the time you will be away. Christian stewardship of our possessions is a year-round grace. The ministries of our church continue on, and funding is needed in the summer as well as the rest of the year.

Now while summer is the time for vacation, it's also a time for work! When I was growing up working on the farm, summer was a very busy time, especially during the tobacco harvest. A lot will be going on here at JHBC during the summer as well. Beginning Wednesday evening, June 9, we will be studying Paul's letter known as 2 Corinthians in Mid-Week Worship. There will be some Sunday evening special events throughout the summer, and Vacation Bible School for all ages. And we will be making plans and laying the groundwork to begin the implementation of our new outreach ministry to the Jonesboro community in the fall. Please be praying for our leaders in this process, and for the other services and activities as well.

I pray your summer will be both relaxing and productive as we follow Christ together as JHBC. Grace and peace.

CONNECTIONS

People visit churches for a variety of reasons, but they are always looking for something important. They are looking for connections with a community. That shouldn't be a great surprise for us. The great majority of us live very busy, hectic lives. We feel very boxed in by the demands of our work and everything else in which we are involved.

"Free time" is considered a luxury and, thus, is parceled out carefully. Families have bought into the idea of "quality time." It implies that since we feel a bit guilty about the small amount of time we spend with our family, we need to make sure that we cram every experience we can into that time. I think it's an extremely flawed notion. It's just as important to your family that you are with them in your living room or around the dinner table as it is that you are taking them to some event. There is no substitute for time. That's the way connections are made and real relationships are formed.

Most churches don't understand that because they have lost touch with the culture in which they find themselves. It's not at all unusual to hear Christians talking about how awful our culture has become and that we should consider it our enemy. Well, that's one way of seeing things.

But, WHAT IF we sought to understand our culture? WHAT IF we embraced the good parts of our culture and made connections with it? The church is the voice of Jesus in our world and brings a vital world view to the table, but it is unheard if we hide inside of our buildings.

If we really sought to understand this culture, we would seek to understand those most influenced by it, our young people and young families. We would consider them to be central to our mission.

I'm not much of a fisherman, though Jeffrey Gaskins and Kevin Ozee are trying to help me out. One thing I do know, though, is that to catch certain types of fish, you need to use a certain type of bait. That's true for churches, too.

Young families don't wait around very long to see if anything important is going on. If visitors to our church don't make significant connections within a month, they will go somewhere else or nowhere else. If they get the idea that the culture of JHBC is hard to break into or that the past of the church is more important than the present or the future, they will move on.

I wish I had a dollar for every time church members have asked me why we don't have more young families. I'd be rich. It's a complex issue and many churches are struggling over it. Generally, though, I'd have to say that we are fishing with the wrong bait.

Now, don't get excited. I'm not talking about Jesus. I'm talking about the structure of the church: the formality, the ATTITUDE about a more diverse style of worship, the fear of any type of change. These things are like billboards posted in churches saying: "We want you to come, but it's our way or the highway."

Over the years, I have often delivered sermons about how we love to go to foreign countries and minister to people. We adapt to their style of clothing, their style of music, their food and family customs. We learn to speak their language and we live among them and socialize with them. BUT, we aren't willing to do those things in our own culture. We need to wake up and I mean soon!

What does that mean here at JHBC? Our church leaders must make time to really listen to our young people and families one-on-one, not just in large forums. We need to meet with new members and find out their thoughts on our church. What are we doing well and what needs work? We even need to talk with people leaving the church and encourage them to help us evaluate.

We need to stop complaining about things that bother us if we aren't willing to sit down with our leaders to discuss things. They are busy people, too. They need to know what you are thinking. I find myself constantly asking people what they think about this and that. I need to know. Deacons, pastors, and church members, you need to know, too. There is too much at stake to continue to ignore things that hold our churches back from reaching young people. Love your church and your Lord enough to be a part of the process of removing stumbling blocks.
