## Welcome to VBS 2021!













How exciting! Last year we were unable to have VBS, but this year we are back! *Knights of North Castle* kicks off 13-17 June from 6 -8PM nightly! Each night kids will check in outside the chapel and then the fun and blessings begin. Every night has a different theme, so *Armor Up!* Kids will learn about Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, David and Goliath, Mary, Paul and Silas, and best of all; JESUS!

At Knights of North Castle VBS, kids will enjoy an interactive, energizing, Bible-based good time as they go on a quest in search of the King's Armor. They will become Knights and discover how to serve God and God's mission for their lives.

Your Knights will discover a Banner Verse (Bible memory verse) that will remain with them in their faith long after VBS.

"Music" and "Worship". Two words that are sometimes used interchangeably when talking about what happens in churches around the world every Sunday morning. Music can be used in services to worship God, but just because music is happening doesn't mean God is being worshipped. And clearly, worship can happen without the use of music.

Semantics aside, what is worship? In the book <u>Seven Words of Worship</u>, written by Mike Harland and Stan Moser, they define it this way.

"Worship is our only reasonable response to God's revelation."

In his book Worship Essentials, Mike goes on to say,

"The idea is simple - worship is not something we initiate or conjure up for the purpose of convincing God to act on our behalf. It's not an exercise that dictates a reaction from a deity, nor a personal discipline intended to produce tranquility in our lives. It's not a philosophy or an approach to spirituality, nor a belief system among many belief systems attempting to bring meaning to our existence. We worship in response to our God, who has revealed himself to us.

In the context of music, it could be said that God has allowed believers throughout history the freedom to write and create music in many forms and styles, with many different instruments, to carry His message to us and our response to Him.

However, worship is an act of the heart and the mind. It is a choice. Whether it's a soaring anthem, a beloved hymn, or a modern song, it's still just music... until it becomes an act of worship. Until it is our heart reaching out to the heart of God in joy or in sadness, seeking wisdom or forgiveness, in recognizing His goodness, His power and greatness, or in thanksgiving for the myriad of ways He continually demonstrates His great love for us, it can still just be music.

In an effort to encourage worship in our services, whether music is happening or not, I'd like to encourage you to consider just a couple ways to help everyone who attends.

- 1. Come to church expecting to connect with God. In a service not long ago, I started our time together asking the question, "What do you want to say to God today?" This is just one short hour, out of the 168 in a week's time, that we have set aside specifically to connect with God. We're together. He's there. What do you want to tell Him?

  Recently we started a service by declaring "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God", acknowledging His strength and our weakness, that He never fails, and that while our bodies are only temporary, His kingdom is forever. Later, we declared the goodness of God, even though we don't deserve it. Did we say, "God, You're so good." quite a few times? Yes. Let me ask, how many times in the other 167 hours are we less grateful to Him for what He has done for us than we should be? If I had to guess, I'd say we still owe Him a few more. If we're just singing words, I can understand how that might seem overly repetitive. But, we're not. We're saying thank you to a God who repeatedly shows us that He loves us, even though there isn't a day that goes by that we don't choose ourselves over Him.
- 2. Sing every song. If your familiar with it, sing out strong, and think about what you're singing. If it's the first time you're hearing it, listen closely to the words. Look at them on the screen. Do they say something you agree with or want to say to God? Not able to sing them yet? Then pray them to Him. If you have to listen for a little while until you can join in, fine. The second time the Chorus comes around, sing every word you can get out. If there's a third time, you should be able to join in now. The scholarship committee will soon begin reviewing applications that have come in. Committee nominations were discussed as well as updating a lawn maintenance contract for the church grounds. There are lots of projects that need to be undertaken around the church properties.

The deacons received a financial update on the church and were pleased to see how God has provided through His children through these difficult days for the church.

As is the custom, feedback from the congregation was discussed before the close of the meeting. After this time of discussion, the meeting was adjourned.

Let us praise God for His provisions and guidance during these days and find joy in trusting Him in the future days of our church, submitting ourselves to following Him in potentially new and exciting ways.
