JN 14:12 "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do, he will do also; and greater works than these he will do; because I go to the Father. JN 14:13 "Whatever you ask in My name, that will I do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. JN 14:14 "If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it."

'Whatever you ask...I will do' surely sounds appealing. Of course we note there is a clause; 'Whatever you ask **in My name**...' Intuitively most of us understand that adding 'In the name of Jesus' at the end of our prayer isn't enough, isn't a magical charm or an Aladdin's lamp.

Rather praying in Jesus' name is doing our humble best to align ourselves with His character and His purpose as we sense the leading of the Spirit and as we read His Word. What an incredible promise! "If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it."

So, what are you asking for? **What's the true desire of YOUR heart?** About a month ago I sat down with a piece of paper and tried to answer that question. I wrote it out because I wanted to make sure that it was focused, true, aligned with the Scripture, and that I could pray in the name of Jesus. This is what I wrote.

- In Jesus' name I pray that the hearts of this church, beginning with mine, would be turned and our one desire would be to bring glory to God.
- In Jesus' name I pray to experience a mighty movement of the Spirit in this church, empowering us to GO and share the Gospel.
- In Jesus' name I pray that many would come to know Christ through this people.

What do you think? Do such requests align with His character and His purpose? I continue to pray daily, fervently for these things. But what about you? Do these prayers reflect your heart's desire?

Dear church family, I want to ask you to do two things, perhaps the most important things I have ever asked. First, take time to consider, meditate, pray; '*What truly is my heart's desire?*' We all know the 'right answer' but just between you and the Spirit of God what is the true answer. Perhaps, like me, it will help you to write them down and edit them until the words are focused, true, and aligned with the Scripture. Perhaps it will help to mediate and pray over God's word; John 14:12-14, Colossians 1:16-18, or Revelation 4:5-11.

Secondly, if you come to similar conclusions as I did, I ask you, beg you, to pray fervently for this: On Easter Sunday, April 4th 2021, many will accept Jesus as their Savior. Pray fervently every day!

The ministry team and the deacons are working together to make this Easter service very special. There will be beautiful music and a clear presentation of the Gospel. But if we do not pray, in His name, aligned with His will, we can expect nothing. But if we do, praying, abiding and believing, we can expect wondrous things! All for God's glory and for the sake of the lost! Won't you take the time to ask yourself, ask the Spirit, 'What truly is my heart's desire?'

Hello everyone. I would like to give you another brief update on the status of our search for an Associate Pastor of Youth, Children, & Families.

In response to our postings made the first week in November we have received 16 resumes for consideration from potential candidates. In mid-January the committee began meeting to prayerfully review and discuss each candidates resume. After careful consideration and prayer, we were able to reduce those 16 down to a small number of semifinalists. Following additional consideration and prayer we reduced the number of semifinalists down to an even smaller number of finalists. Zoom interviews were held with the finalists the second week in February. In the coming weeks, God willing, we hope to have face-to-face interviews as well. We will go from there as God leads us.

As this process has progressed our goal has been and will continue to be to follow God's will for Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church as He lays it on our hearts and minds, thereby bringing glory to Him and to His church. As we continuously and earnestly pray for God's will to be done we humbly ask that you join us in that prayer of agreement. We feel nothing is more important to the successful outcome of this search than our dependence, obedience, and trust in God to be our sole guide and the prayers that we offer up to Him in that regard.

I will continue to keep you updated as we proceed.

Hey, look! Joy comes in the morning! Maybe Annie was on to something! Or not. Still, our God has great love for us, and only wants the best for us. Paul knew this, and in writing to the young Christian church in Colosse, he encouraged them to hang on as well, saying this. Colossians 1:11-14:

PALM SUNDAY SCRIPTURES

On Sunday, March 28, 2021, we will celebrate Palm Sunday. What does the Bible say about Palm Sunday? The following is a list of the top Bible verses about Palm Sunday from the Old and New Testaments that was compiled and edited by BibleStudy Tools Staff on September 19, 2019.

- John 12:12-19 The next day the great crow that had come for the Feast heard that Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem. ¹³ They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Blessed is the King of Israel!" ¹⁴ Jesus found a young donkey and sat upon it, as it is written, ¹⁵ "Do not be afraid, O Daughter of Zion; see, your king is coming, seated on a donkey's colt." ¹⁶ At first his disciples did not understand all this. Only after Jesus was glorified id they realize that these things had been written about him and that they had done these things to him. ¹⁷ Now the crowd that was with him when he called Lazarus from the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to spread the word. ¹⁸ Many people, because they had heard that he had given this miraculous sign, went out to meet him. ¹⁹ So the Pharisees said to one another, "See, this is getting us nowhere. Look how the whole world has gone after him!"
- **John 12:13** They took palm branches and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Blessed is the King of Israel!"
- **Revelation 7:9** After this I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands.
- **Psalm 92:12** -The righteous will flourish like a palm tree, they will grow like a cedar of Lebanon:
- **Deuteronomy 34:3** ...the Negev and the whole region from the Valley of Jericho, the City of Palms, as far as Zoar.
- **Exodus 15:27** Then they came to Elim, where there were twelve springs and seventy palm trees, and they camped there near the water.
- **Song of Songs (Solomon) 7:7** Your stature is like that of the palm, and your breasts like clusters of fruit.
- **Judges 4:5** She held court under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and Israelites came to her to have their disputes decided.
- **I Kings 6:29** On the walls all around the temple, in both the inner and outer rooms, he carved cherubim, palm trees and open flowers.
- Leviticus 23:40 On the first day you are to take choice fruit from the trees, and palm fronds, leafy braches and poplars, and rejoice before the Lord your God for seven days.
- **Zechariah 9:9** Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

PALM SUNDAY SCRIPTURES (Continued)

Matthew 21:1-11 - ¹As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, ² saying to them,, "Go to the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt by her. Untie them and bring them to me. ³ If anyone says anything to you, tell him that the Lord needs them, and he will send them right away." ⁴ This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet: ⁵ "Say to the Daughter of Zion, 'See, you king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." ⁵ The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them. ⁵ They brought the donkey and the colt, placed their cloaks on them, and Jesus sat on them. ⁵ A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. ⁵ The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Hosanna in the highest!" ¹¹⁰ When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, "Who is this?" ¹¹¹ The crowds answered, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee."

Mark 11:1-11 - ¹As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, ² saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.' "¹ They went and found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, ⁵ some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" ¹ They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. ¹ When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. § Many people spread their cloaks on the road, white others spread braches they had cut in the fields. § Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted, "Hosanna!" ¹¹0 "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Hosanna in the highest!" ¹¹1 Jesus entered Jerusalem and went to the temple. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.

Luke 19:28-44 - ²⁸ After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹ As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, ³⁰ "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it.' "³² Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. ³³ As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴ They replied, "The Lord needs it." ³⁵ They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. ³⁶ As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road. ³⁷ When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: ³⁸ "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" 'Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" ⁴⁰ "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stone will cry out." ⁴¹ As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it ⁴² and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes. ⁴³ The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. ⁴⁴ This will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you."

PALM SUNDAY SCRIPTURES (Continued)

Acts 12:4 - After arresting him, he put him in prison, handing him over to be guarded by four squads of four soldiers each. Herod intended to bring him out for public trial after the Passover.

II Kings 9:13 - They hurried and took their cloaks and spread them under him on the bare steps. Then they blew the trumpet and shouted, "Jehu is king!"


Psalm 118:26 - Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. From the house of the Lord we bless you.

Jeremiah 10:2 - This is what the Lord says: "Do not learn the ways of the nations or be terrified by signs in the sky, though nations are terrified by them.

Psalm 118:25-26 - O Lord, save us; O Lord, grant us success. ²⁶ Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. From the house of the Lord we bless you.

Luke 22:19-20 - And he took bread, grave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them saying, "This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me." ²⁰ In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you.

Jeremiah 10:5 - Like a scarecrow in a melon patch, their idols cannot speak; they must be carried because they cannot walk. Do not fear them; they can do no harm nor can they do any good."
