OUR FAMILY CORNER

Isn't it wonderful that we seem to be seeing some light at the end of a long COVID tunnel! With every person that is vaccinated, I celebrate as we move a little closer to being able to lift all restrictions and return to a wonderful schedule of worship and discipleship activities.

As you receive this we will return to a modified schedule for Sunday School! This is one more transitional step back to normalcy and hopefully it won't be long before everyone can return to their regular classrooms and teachers.

So, as of May 2nd, 2021, we will have **three combined adult classrooms** for you to choose from. All three classrooms are large and so social distancing will be possible. You may choose any one of the three classrooms:

- Class #1: Vickie Wilkins in McDowell Hall: Bible Studies for Life
- Class #2: Ann Davis in the Choir Room: Biblical Studies From a Parent and Family Perspective
- Class #3: Randy Marsh (assisted by John and Sam) in the old fellowship hall: <u>Sermon on the</u>

We will also have a **combined Sunday School class for Youth and 6th – 8th Graders**. This class will be taught by Sandra and Jamie Bowen in the Youth Building.

Children's Sunday School (K-2) will meet in the K-2 Sunday School Classroom taught by Sandy and Ramona. **Children's Sunday School (3rd-5th)** will meet in the 3-5 Sunday School Classroom, taught by Billie Keye.

Two additional doors will be open – on top of those that have been open over the last several weeks: *The portico door outside of the nursery and the glass doors outside of the admin offices on the east side of the church.*

For those who graciously serve to unlock and lock the church, remember that doors will need to be unlocked prior to Sunday School as was done prior to the pandemic. If you have any questions about this or other security issues, please see Richard Sistrunk.

Again, I want to stress these are only transitional steps until you can return to your normal classes and teachers. The deacons, Sunday School director, and staff will review COVID statistics weekly and hopefully it won't be long before we can take the next step. Until then, please be patient, safe, and keep praying that JHBC will honor God in all things, and be a messenger of His Gospel!

Hurricane Florence Rebuild Project

On September 14, 2018 Hurricane Florence, a slow-moving category 1 hurricane made landfall along the southeastern coast of North Carolina with wind speeds of 90 mph and a massive storm surge, along with nearly 3 feet of rain in parts of that region.

Baptists on Mission (BOM) quickly responded and served 1,057,623 hot meals from ten different kitchens in the affected area. More than 100,000 homes were impacted by the storm, and BOM continues to maintain 4 rebuild center sites where volunteer groups are housed and fed, while they work to get people back in their homes. The project is massive and will still take two more years and thousands of volunteers to complete the mission.

JHBC sent teams in October and December of 2018 to join in the hard work of removing downed trees and debris so homes could begin to be repaired. Our men and women

worked tirelessly, not only clearing the fallen branches, but picking up the fallen people whose lives had been turned upside down.

In an effort to rejoin the rebuilding project, the JHBC Baptist Men are coordinating a Mission Trip to the Pender County (Burgaw) area to assist in the disaster recovery process from Hurricane Florence. This time, the efforts will be targeted inside of homes, installing drywall, flooring, and insulation, painting, and clearing away the debris.



The date of the project is Sunday, May 23 - Friday, May 28. While plans are still coming together, it is anticipated that the volunteers will leave from the church that Sunday afternoon, arriving in time to get settled, have dinner, and make plans for the following day. Team members will be assigned to work in teams. doing tasks that they already know how to do or will be trained to do. Meals and lodging are provided by the Rebuild Center at a minimal cost of only \$10 per day per person, which also includes insurance. Participants will be responsible to cover that expense.

Men, women, and even youth are invited to participate for as little as one day or as long as the entire trip. Whatever your schedule allows is just fine. "Come when you can, leave when you must" is our motto. While there, the teams will do whatever they are asked to do and whatever our skills allow.

Important Meeting Dates

Sunday, May 9 - Registration Deadline. All required forms must be turned in by this time.

Sunday, May 16, 12:30 pm - Team meeting for all participants, whether one day or longer. The entire team will meet for a FREE lunch, be presented the most up-to-date information on the project, and pray for all aspects of the mission.

Sunday, May 23, 11:00 am - The Team will be commissioned as part of the worship service. In the afternoon, the team will head out.

We invite you to pray about how you can best support this effort to help families recover from this devastating hurricane. Please pray for those impacted by this tragedy and those considering participating in this critical project. And, pray about participating personally in the project. Thank you.


