From the Desk of Our Senior Pastor

On the 5th of October President Trump, after returning from a weekend at the hospital said, "Don't be afraid of Covid. Don't let it dominate your life." And oh my, the response was loud and angry! Yet I realized my reaction was a little different – I thought it was pretty good council, especially for we who are Christians. Don't get me wrong – if you have been infected or you have lost a loved one to COVID, then yes, it dominated your life and may leave a scar that will never quite heal. We grieve with those who suffer and those who have suffered loss. From the bottom of my heart, I pray for healing and comfort for all who have been infected and affected.

Yet for the rest of us, should we live in fear and allow COVID to dominate our thoughts? Certainly we should take thoughtful and healthy steps to protect ourselves, our families and community. $\underline{\mathbf{W}}$ ear a mask, $\underline{\mathbf{W}}$ ash your hands, $\underline{\mathbf{W}}$ atch your distance...seems like I've heard that somewhere. But after the Three W's, then what? Fear seems antithetical to faith and our faith should dominate our lives. Scripture should dominate our lives. For instance...

Joshua 1:9 "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous.

Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed,

This is one of my favorite verses and one I have spoken into my own life over and over again over the years. We do not have to live in fear because God goes with us! His Spirit lives within us. And our God is mighty, unshaken and unmoved by circumstance. Our God loves us, desires the best for us, and promised to never leave us.

An Encouragement for Mom's and Dad's

PR 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go, even when he is old he will not depart from it.

Parenting has never been easy. In fact, parenting may be the most difficult, most important responsibility we ever have. Now, in this COVID era, it seems that parenting is even more challenging than before – I don't think I need to prove my point – you know better than I do!

And, as the old saying goes, kids don't come with an instruction manual. All of this may leave parents wondering, 'Am I doing it right? Am I doing enough?' Answer? I don't know the details of your lives, but I know most of you well enough to believe you are making an incredible difference in the lives of your children, even if you can't see it day by day.

I was reminded this morning of a moment when our sons were young and I was probably asking myself the same kind of questions. One evening our family attended a Maundy Thursday service at our church. I drifted in and out of the service and thought about the cross, draped with a purple cloth, at the front of the church. I thought at the end of the service I could take my 12 year old, Joshua, to the cross and perhaps touch it and make it a little more real. That perhaps we needed to separate the Easter holiday (the Easter bunny and chocolate eggs) from the sacrifice Jesus gave us at the cross.

The service ended, someone asked me a question, and I was distracted from my family for a moment. When I turned back around, my wife pointed to the cross and said 'I'm not sure what they are doing.' Joshua (12) had taken Nathan (9) to the cross. They were both kneeling and praying quietly. Joshua cried quietly – it had been a tough week for him. Both prayed, giving thanks, asking for forgiveness. The service was over, people milled about chatting, and my boys continued kneeling and praying. I knelt beside them and tried to pray, but mostly just listened, a little overwhelmed. There is something especially precious about a child's heart and we must do everything in our power to nourish these sweet spirits.

I'm not sure of the moment that the boys figured out there was healing at the foot of the cross or when they gathered the courage to disregard what others might think and just go. I guess it was a process that began before each was born as Sandy and I prayed for them. For my part it was certainly an imperfect process as I stumbled, lost my temper, said words I regret and wished for more visible victories. But this was one sweet, visible moment when I could see God working with their precious hearts.

Here is my point; keep doing what you are doing. Keep on pushing and pulling and drag them to church, praying, and know that it is making a difference. You might not see every day or week but know you are joining God in His good plan; *Train up your children in the way they should go, even when they are old they will not depart from it!* God bless you and give you wisdom, strength and perseverance because there is something especially precious about a child's heart.

Outstanding Men, Terrific Weather, and Great Average Golf

It was dark and little bit chilly, but as the day wore on it turned into a beautiful day for a golf tournament. So it was on Saturday, Oct. 3 for the 2020 Baptist Men Golf Tournament. Thirty-two men, from the age of nine to eighty-two gathered for a great day of golf, fellowship, and spiritual encouragement.

Admittedly, it wasn't until just a few days before the tournament that I realized I had planned for the men to show up before sunrise at 7:15 AM! But, that's what needed to happen in order to get everything that needed to happen done before we teed off at 8:00 AM.. Thank the Lord for Bill Davis and his truck head lights. He was already at the course before I arrived at 6:15 AM, and the lights at the shelter house where we were meeting were not working. He's a good man.

All went well. All 32 men who had registered were there in time for our meeting at 7:15 AM, and proceeded to play in their groups of four. Meanwhile, back at the JHBC kitchen, our Food Team (a group of 8 wonderful volunteers) prepared the food that they would serve to the men following the round of golf. All went well and we all sat down to eat lunch and listen to Mark Abernathy for a few minutes before awarding the door prizes and trophies for the winning teams and specialty hole champions.

Mark is a Baptist Men Consultant at the Baptist State Convention of NC. He spoke at our Baptist Men meeting about a year ago, so when I invited him to come back, I knew he would have a good word for us. He spoke about being "Ready for the Moment". Mark recounted Tiger Woods' incredible play to win the 2005 PGA Masters Golf Tournament, noting that when he 'had' to make the tough shot, he was able to do it. Why? Because he had spent years preparing for it. He was ready for the moment. He asked those gathered if they thought what we are currently going through (COVID, civil unrest, contentious election) were days of testing, and suggested that now more than ever, we need to be strengthening our faith. Why? So we will be 'ready for the moment'. Mark then shared of how learning to hit his golf ball out of a sand trap was not that different from learning how to get his spiritual life unstuck from the drought and depression he had felt from this stifling COVID environment. For him it was learning to be quiet before the Lord, and then to be thankful. Lastly, he challenged the men to not be afraid to do the things they need to in order to finish strong in life and be ready for any moment God puts in front of them.

It was a wonderful day, one that I hope will be repeated many times in the future.
