From the Desk of Our Senior Pastor

Jesus Christ; The Sweetest Treat of All "I have become all things to all men, so that I may by all means save some."

When I was a boy, Halloween was one of my favorite days of the year. I never liked monster costumes (and still don't!) We often made our own costumes from things around the house; clowns and hobos were two favorites. A little Vaseline applied to the cheeks, then covered with coffee grounds makes a pretty good hobo beard. Sometimes we would have great costumes and then had to cover up almost everything with bulky winter jackets because of an early Colorado winter snow... but it didn't stop us because we knew the payoff was coming!

Afterwards my best friend and I would dump out the Halloween booty to separate the good from the great. *Fruit or anything healthy? No, I don't think so. Tootsie Rolls? OK, fine. Snickers Bar? Gold!* We would eat till commanded to stop and then ration out the rest until the Tootsie Rolls were hard as rocks. I really enjoyed Halloween and still do.

Here at JHBC we have started to do Trunk or Treat to provide a safe place for the kids on Halloween, but most importantly to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. Every child will receive candy, and then a card that says Jesus Christ; The Sweetest Treat of All. Each card starts by asking the question: "What could be better than free candy?" That's what Halloween is all about. Just dress up in a costume, say 'Trick or Treat' and get free candy! What could be better than that? The answer is God's Love. That is the sweetest gift of all." The other panels go onto to tell the Gospel story in a loving and creative way. My sincere hope is that kids will take a moment, perhaps while chewing on a Tootsie Roll, and read through the card. Hopefully it will spark a conversation with mom and dad and encourage them to come back to JHBC to find out more.

This is what I love about Trunk or Treat. The Apostle Paul said in 1CO 9:22 'To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak; I have become all things to all men, so that I may by all means save some.' In other words, 'I am going to bend over backwards to share the Good News, I am going to adapt to my audience, without compromising the truth, I am going to do everything in my power to help some know Jesus and be saved!' I love that spirit and creativity and willingness to go the extra mile. For me, that's the spirit that inspires us to plan Trunk or Treat and reach out to our community; so that (we) may by all means save some.

This year Trunk or Treat will be held on **Sunday, October 31**st, **from 4-6PM** in the East Property parking lot and I hope you will consider participating. It couldn't be easier or more fun. Bring your car at about 3:30PM, decorate your trunk, and set out your beach chair. Wear your favorite costume and get ready for fun! We will provide the candy – you give it out. It's especially challenging in this era of COVID to reach out to the community, but we will be safe and distanced and wear our masks and ask participants to do the same. We are looking for about 20 cars/decorated trunks. And remember, each child that come through will receive a little information about the church AND Jesus Christ; The Sweetest Treat of All.

I'll put a sign-up sheet on the Family Life Bulletin Board and again, I hope you will consider participating. Hope to see you then!

"Honestly, I'm just looking for a home." Something said in passing, but something I have been trying to unpack for a couple weeks ever since Pastor Cal brought it back up. Where did that statement come from? I knew it had to go deeper than I thought, so I've been doing some thorough searching.

As the weather starts to cool off, one of my favorite things to make is chili. I love throwing all of the ingredients into the crock pot, and heading out to work for the day, and to come home to a delicious meal. You've got the meat (which is usually just seasoned hamburger for me), the beans, the corn, the tomatoes and tomato sauce, and diced onion. Some people say it is just a matter of opinion, but much like pineapple on pizza, there is only one right answer, and everyone else is wrong.
