### FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . .


With the arrival of September comes a lot of new things—a new school year, a new church year, and this year, a new mission initiative.

College students and our elementary, middle, and high students have started back to school. Please be in prayer for them as they begin their new year. The challenges that students, their parents, and educators face continue to grow. Pray for all these, that God would grant wisdom and the power to learn and teach, along with the motivation to do so to the glory of God.

We're at the beginning of a new church year as well. Some are moving to new Sunday School classes. New Deacons and committee members and other workers are moving into their positions of responsibility, while others are beginning to enjoy a needed respite from theirs. In every case, the work of the church moves on. It's a wonderful thing when we realize that God gives every follower of Jesus at least one gift for ministry, and that He places in the body everyone that is needed to carry on His work through the body. It's even more wonderful when we know what our spiritual gift or gifts as well as our natural abilities are, and put them to work in serving Christ through His church! As your pastor, please allow me to say *thank you* to all of you who have been serving and will serve this year and in the coming years.

Our Personnel Committee has begun its search for a new Associate Pastor for Family Ministry. Please be in fervent prayer for them as they search for the candidate God is preparing for us who will bring the character, skills, qualities, and passion that are so important to this area of our church's ministry and mission.

At the same time, we are launching *Mission Jonesboro*, our new mission initiative that will enable us to reach out to our immediately surrounding community. We are working with the administration of J. Glenn Edwards Elementary School to provide needed supplies and volunteers for the Book Buddies and Backpack Pals programs, as well as for other needed areas. We are also linking members of the faculty and staff with families and individuals in our congregation as prayer partners. This is just the beginning of how we hope that God will use JHBC to address family literacy needs in the Jonesboro Heights community. Through this constructive involvement, we will embody the presence of Christ to our community elementary school, its students and their families and its faculty and staff. We look forward to how God will use this involvement to open doors for ministry and a verbal witness to the people we encounter in this process. As we open the doors of our facilities to the community for things like English-as-a-Second-Language classes and Adult Education classes provided by Central Carolina Community College, we pray that the same thing will happen. Please be praying earnestly for these efforts, and about how God might want to use *you* in them.

***FROM THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE . . .*** (CONTINUED)

Beginning September 12 and continuing through much of October, our morning worship services (both the Celebration Service and the 11:00 a.m. Service) will focus on where we as the leaders of our congregation (staff and deacons) believe God is leading us in the various areas of our life together as a church. I will be preaching on the themes of worship, the role of music in the church, missions and outreach, family ministry, spiritual formation, and carrying out our work as a church. As a part of these services, we will also present an overview of the strategic plans our staff has developed and shared with our Deacons. These plans are not written in stone, and are more about direction than detailed goals. But we think it is important to share with the congregation the direction we believe God is leading us. These plans have been developed in alignment with our mission, vision, and values that the congregation adopted in 2006, and with careful consideration of and reference to the priorities that grew out of our spiritual directions forums in 2008 and 2009.

As we have begun our sixth year of ministry together as Pastor and People, there are many good and positive things that are going on in our life together. There have been many challenges over the past several years, but I believe we are heading in the right direction. As always, we still have some challenges before us! So at the beginning of this new church year, allow me to offer a brief pastoral challenge . . .

First, *attend faithfully*. Every week your pastoral staff and many members of our church work hard to prepare to lead worship and to provide opportunities for learning and fellowship. You can never be the disciple Jesus calls you to be without being an active part of worship and fellowship with other believers. We have an abundance of opportunities for all ages and at different times. Make attendance at church on Sundays (morning and evening), Wednesday evenings, and other times *a priority* as we begin this new church year.

Second, *participate faithfully* in the life of our church. There are so many avenues for involvement! Along with all the service opportunities within our church, we're now adding the needs of *Mission Jonesboro*. We will not be able to do what we have committed to do without significant involvement from a wide range of people in our church.

Third, *practice faithful stewardship*—of your time, your talents and spiritual gifts, and your financial resources. JHBC is a very active congregation. We cannot continue to minister at our current level, much less grow to greater levels without the faithful stewardship of the congregation as a whole.

And finally, *pray*. Pray for God to work in, among, and through us to accomplish His purpose. Pray for our staff and leaders, and especially for our Personnel Committee and Deacons. Pray for our community and our members. Pray for *Mission Jonesboro*. Focus your prayers on God's kingdom and purpose, not our own desires. And then pray some more!

Opportunities abound, but so do challenges. God is calling *each* of us to be faithful followers of Jesus, living out our life together as His disciples as we embody His presence to Sanford and the world.

Will you?

### ADULT VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL REPORT

Thanks to all of those who participated in our Adult Vacation Bible School. The theme and study was based on the book "Minister to Others". In addition to the study and discussions, we had special guests share their experiences in foreign, stateside, and local missions. Thanks to Dr. Marty Pate, Joy Scott, Daniel and Michelle Sims, Rev. Gordon West and Teresa Dew. Our missionaries took us from Romania, to Haiti, to Vermont, to Pennsylvania, and back home to Sanford.

As part of the offering for the week we collected "diaper change" to give to the "Children of the Son" ministry for the purpose of buying diapers for the orphanage in Romania. (Total change collected will be published at a later date.)

One of the projects for the week was that 30 individuals were given \$10.00 each to go out and minister to others. It was a blessing to see how the Lord used these individuals to minister to people who needed food, medicine, and fans to help keep them cool. Business cards were given to those who participated in the "no string attached" project. This project was to go and minister to others...for example - buy someone a cup of coffee, wash someone's car, wash someone's windows, ...then leave the card with a printed scripture verse on it, and the "no strings attached" statement. All the ministry experiences were free to all the recipients.

The week ended with taking a tour of the CUOC in Sanford, NC. What a joy and blessing it was to see everyone bring a mountain of peanut butter and jars of jelly for the CUOC food pantry. From that visit they gained several volunteers and many people with a better knowledge of this ministry that is so vital to our community. Thanks to Teresa Dew for sharing and especially for the beautiful prayer that she rendered.

A special thanks to Wanda and all the ones who helped prepare and serve our meals each evening. Also thanks to those that helped in washing the dishes, cleaning up the kitchen and the fellowship hall.

Eating 15 freezers of homemade ice cream was not a hard task for the 140 people in attendance. To add to the sweet feast, others made cookies and toppings. The evening was special and ended with the lighting of the windows. A plaque has been placed in McDowell Hall to commemorate the dedication of the window lighting.

All of this reminds us that fellowship among believers is an important entity of the church and its body of believers. Jesus promoted fellowship around the table. He broke bread with his friends and disciples and encouraged others to do likewise. Luke 9:13b-17 states "They answered, "We have only five loaves of bread and two fish—unless we go and buy food for all this crowd."<sup>14</sup>(About five thousand men were there.) But he said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each."<sup>15</sup>The disciples did so, and everybody sat down. <sup>16</sup>Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke them. Then he gave them to the disciples to set before the people. <sup>17</sup>They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over." (NIV) What an example Jesus gave us! The breaking and blessing of the bread. Let us be thankful in all things especially the times we come together as one family to gather around the table and just fellowship. These times together help us to create bonds together as a congregation.
