

"The Southern Baptist Convention is at a 70 year low with regard to the number of baptisms performed last year. What has happened to the church?" Johnny Hunt, former president, Southern Baptist Convention.

I did something kind of mean last week during Vacation Bible School for Adults and I guess I need to confess. After we did our study on the Apostle Peter, and his life as a 'fisher of men,' it seemed a good time to talk about our 'Who's Your One?' initiative. I said, 'Since we have been talking about this for three months, I'm going to walk around McDowell Hall and ask each of you, 'Who's your one?' So I took the microphone in hand and headed toward the attendees.

Suffice it to say it got very quiet and eyes got very big. Now, I really never had any intention of pointing the microphone at any one person and putting them on the spot. But I did want to make the point; 'Who's Your One?' isn't just a good idea to talk about – we must move from concept to practice. In fact my biggest fear about 'Who's Your One' is that we all agree that it's a good thing to talk about it and never moves beyond that.

In truth, as I moved with microphone in hand toward the attendees, I received the response I anticipated; the deer in the headlights look. I certainly do not say that in a flippant or disrespectful way but rather to make a point, which is...

Why do we get so uncomfortable talking about sharing our faith?

What is so uncomfortable about your pastor, brother and friend asking you, 'Who's Your One?' Shouldn't it be such a central and natural part of our lives as disciple makers that we could very comfortably answer, 'I'm still praying for the one God will lead me to. So, I'm praying but I'm also watching and looking for opportunities!' Excellent! I asked one of the women of the church, 'Who's Your One?' She responded, 'I know who it is, but it's going to be tough. So, I'm praying for opportunities.' Tremendous! Great response!

Last Sunday night, Johnny Hunt asked us the question; "What has happened to the church?" What happened to a church on fire for Jesus? What happened to a church with a passion to share the Gospel with the lost? But Johnny also cast a tremendous vision for the future. He said that if 1% of current Southern Baptists respond to 'Who's Your One?' then we can anticipate more people being baptized in 2020 than in all of the last 70 years!

So what if we moved from 'Who's Your One?' concept to a natural and comfortable practice? What tremendous changes we WILL SEE in our church and community!

Together we can...so one last question to consider; who's YOUR one?

Next month is Clergy Appreciation Month, and while I don't want to sound self-serving in writing this article, I've always believed it was important to appreciate ministers even before I became one. I could see the look of dejection on his face while people nit-picked every detail of the process until one woman finally stood up and said, "It's the middle of the winter. Our pastor and his family are cold. Fix this." At that point, all the complaining stopped and the heating system was fixed.

As a minister, I can tell you that we don't always help ourselves. I read a quote the other day that says that "ministers are the world's worst at self-care." Several of my minister-friends and I have had conversations about this. Ministry can take a toll on us physically, but more often, it takes a toll on us mentally and emotionally. From experience, I can tell you that is true. I've had a couple of times in my ministry where I have approached burnout and have had to do some serious self-reflection over the past few months about my own self-care. I've been trying to eat healthier and work out more, but I've also have been trying to focus on maintaining a better balance between work and family life. I still have quite a way to go, but it's something that needs to be done for the sake of my own health and well-being along with my family.

Speaking of family, I think Clergy Appreciation Month should be expanded to Clergy-Family Appreciation, because ministry does take a toll of families as well. This summer, I spent an entire week away on a mission trip and a lot of evenings away from home. There were times Megan kept asking why I had to go back to church after dinner or why I had to go make a hospital visit. I'm thankful for Beth's support because there were times where we had to sit down and figure out schedules and childcare among other things (which I'm sure you all have done as well with your jobs).

Some of you have kept up with me and my health journey over the past couple of years, and I'm thankful for your understanding and appreciation as I strive for self-care and balance because I want to be the best minister I can be to all of you. Also, I believe that our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, and we should encourage one another to maintain them. So, let us encourage each other, appreciate each other, and take care of one another so that we can continue to be on mission throughout Sanford and the world.

John Hall, chairman, called the meeting to order. New deacons were welcomed into the fellowship: Belinda Bond, Lynwood Jones, Roy Lowe, Tommy Matthews, and Ron Rouse. Current deacons reported Family Ministry contacts and voiced prayer concerns.

Mary Upchurch led the devotion, using scripture from Romans 10:13: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved"; and Romans 10: 9-10: "That if you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved."

The topic was "Who's Your One?" Mary told about the "Who's Your One?" conference the previous Sunday night at Temple Baptist Church in Fayetteville, with musician Charles Billingsly and Pastor Johnny Hunt, who brought a most inspiring message based on the calling of the first five disciples, as found in John 1. In closing, John thanked the deacons who are rotating off for their dedication and hard work here at JHBC. They are Jamie Bowen, Richard Sistrunk, Mary Upchurch, Johnny Whiteside, and Sam Wornom.

Ramona Bowling dismissed us with prayer.
