## *From the Desk of Our Senior Pastor*

PS 40:1 I waited patiently for the LORD; and He inclined to me and heard my cry. PS 40:2 He brought me up out of the pit of destruction, out of the miry clay, and He set my feet upon a rock making my footsteps firm. PS 40:3 He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God; many will see and fear and will trust in the LORD.

When I was in seminary I learned about a group of people called *The Desert Fathers*. This was a group of men, and a few women, who desired to draw close to God. Seemingly, they found intimacy with God difficult in large communities and the hubbub of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Century AD. (Perhaps every age thinks theirs is the most chaotic!) Anyway, these men and women chose to sell everything they owned, give the proceeds to the poor, and move to the desert to be alone with God. They chose a life of extreme asceticism, renouncing all the pleasures of the senses, rich food, baths, rest, and anything that made them comfortable. They would gather only on Saturdays or Sundays to worship God together. Other than that, they lived like hermits, alone with God.

As I first read about these men and women I found myself respecting their desire to draw close to God through isolation and asceticism and of course wondering what it would be like. Would God speak to me in new and deeper ways? Would isolation help me to become more like Jesus? What would I experience, what would I become, that might never be possible without the isolation of the desert?

More than ever, I'm certain I was romanticizing the life of the Desert Fathers. Because over the last five months of COVID isolation, which in reality is nothing compared to the Desert Fathers, I have discovered I am not a fan of isolation at all.

In our church staff meeting this morning I shared that nothing feels quite right to me – although in many ways, little has changed. Even so I often feel an unease that I have a hard time shaking. Am I doing enough? Am I doing the right things? Can we do better? But as I write this, I wonder if the agitation I feel is actually a holy unease, not to DO but to simply BE.

Psalms 131:2 says, *'Surely I have composed and quieted my soul; like a weaned child rests against his mother, my soul is like a weaned child within me.'* The author of the Psalm, David, enjoyed his walk with God in which he "stilled" himself and "quieted" his soul. This is a picture of true contentment, based on his wonderful relationship and walk with the Lord.

I wonder if in great part, this is what God is doing in this time of COVID isolation. He surely is forcing us to turn away from business; the hubbub and constant noise of culture. To stop deluding ourselves with our self-sufficient plans and take our lives off of auto-pilot...to stop doing and simply be the children of our heavenly Father and rest in Him.

Psalms 37:7 says, *'Rest in the LORD and wait patiently for Him.'* The words of Jesus say much the same; Matthew 11:29 *'Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and YOU WILL FIND REST FOR YOUR SOULS.'* MT 11:30 *'For My yoke is easy and My burden is light.'*

Rest; which sounds so much better than unease. Rest; which we don't have to run to the desert to find. We just have to stop doing for a moment and simply be. May you find rest, joy, peace and a quiet soul in your walk with Jesus.

## "Everybody Needs a Friend"

Just a couple weeks back, a group of men (ages 14-78) got together to do something I'm not sure any of us had ever done before... build a picnic table. The JHBC Missions and Outreach Committee had been made known of a need by Outreach Mission, Inc. (OMI), for four picnic tables for their mission homes, two for the men's home and two for the women's home. The need was then presented to the Baptist Men Coordinating Team, which quickly took action to plan the work day project. Outreach Mission is a faith-based ministry to Sanford's homeless men and women and is just one of at least ten local ministries that JHBC supports in our annual budget.

It was a good day (it started with donuts from Sandra's Bakery!). God blessed us with good weather, and while I know everyone would have been much more comfortable without them, all the men wore their masks the whole time (other than a couple brief moments to take a picture). And just a little after noon, the tables were completed, loaded up on a trailer, and delivered to the ministry locations where the prayer was that they would be well used and many lives would be changed by the gospel of Jesus Christ.



As easy as it would be to make this article about the various ministries that JHBC supports through your offerings, the point I really wanted to make is the need that people have (men, in this case) to connect with others. So, while I continue to relate this to men specifically, women, feel free to listen in. Because, in spite of the common assumption that women already have this down and are the masters of deep friendships, I periodically become aware that loneliness and disconnection are issues faced by both genders.

One of the unfortunate by-products of this COVID epidemic is that people have been forced to separate themselves from one another and the normal routine of face-to-face contact (Sunday worship, Sunday School, choir practice, prayer meeting, etc.). Email, phone calls, and Zoom meetings are good, and may come close to meeting the biblical admonishment to "encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing" (I Thess. 5:11).

But they don't quite satisfy the need for a real physical shoulder to lean on. Ecclesiastes 4 talks about the benefits of having a friend, someone to help you up if you fall down, or watch your back in times of trouble. That verse doesn't mention having a buddy to go fishing or golfing with, or sit in a deer blind with, or hold the end of a 2 x 6 while cutting it to length, but those can be just as valuable and necessary for maintaining a healthy man-spirit.

I hope each of you are doing well, and that you have a life-strengthening partner or group of people that not only speak spiritual truth into your life, but also make you laugh, comfort you when times are hard, and keep you going, even when the fish aren't biting. If not, take the first step (or two). Pray about it, then give someone a call to hang out, go get some coffee/ice cream/wings or something, and see if you can be a friend.

Soon, we will again have the opportunity to gather together again. Let's make the most of it. Love one another well, pray for each other, ask someone to go fishing (or whatever) and when needed, remember this - "opportunities for grace abound", for others and for ourselves.

### **Building the Wall and Growing the Church**

Serving in the Fellowship of Deacons this year has been both rewarding and challenging, as we are working hard to fulfill our mission of “embodying the presence of Christ to Sanford and the world through our worship, our witness, and our way of life.” Through the prophet Nehemiah, we see examples of the rewards and challenges of serving God. Nehemiah was called to lead the Jewish people in rebuilding the wall of Jerusalem. He faced opposition, but he did not fail in his obedience. Here at JHBC, we are faced with the challenge of building a different kind of wall. We are faced with the challenge of growing the church.

Pastor Cal has expressed a sincere desire for the church to grow, and it shows. The staff is working together. The deacons and committee members are working with the staff. Sunday School classes, groups, and individuals are reaching out and ministering to the needs of the congregation and community. Meaningful worship services where visitors feel welcome and where the messages and music focus on evangelism and discipleship convey the vision of building God's kingdom.

After reading the book of Nehemiah, I can see how his leadership in rebuilding the wall of Jerusalem can also apply to another situation at JHBC. We, too, need to make repairs and face the challenges as Nehemiah did. God has blessed us with beautiful facilities, some dating back almost 150 years. God is so good, and He is still working. Through Vision 2017, we now have an inviting children's wing and youth center. Our doors are open to all, but there is more work to do, other “walls to build.”

The called business meeting on August 5<sup>th</sup> revealed some specific challenges with regard to our facilities. Repairs are needed for roofs, HVAC systems, the parking lots, and columns at the main sanctuary, to name a few. In addition to repair needs, other challenges involve safety and security. Making repairs and implementing safety measures calls for working together as the body of Christ and giving of ourselves and our resources. Nehemiah did not build the wall by himself, and neither can we. It takes a cooperative effort.

Following Nehemiah's example, let us commit to pray for wisdom and discernment in prioritizing the needs and financing the projects. Let us earnestly seek God's will and be sure that our plan is God's plan for us. Let us be generous in our giving. Let us all be a part of the building.

The wall of Jerusalem was completed in 52 days. God's hand was upon Nehemiah, for without Him, the work could not have been accomplished (See Neh. 6:15-16). We serve the same God that Nehemiah served, and He is still in control.

May we at Jonesboro Heights Baptist Church be faithful to embody the presence of Christ to all the world. May we be His servants, committed to seeing His kingdom grow. May we be His good and faithful stewards, enjoying the rewards and facing the challenges. May we pray, work, and give so that we may accomplish all that He desires for us, for His glory only. May His hand be upon us as it was with Nehemiah.

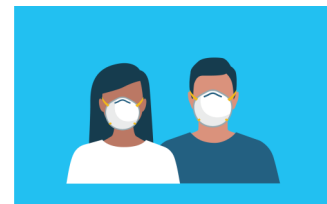

## DO YOU LONG FOR FRUIT?

I don't know about you, but this time of year I love fresh fruit—especially watermelon. But when God talks about fruit in Galatians 5:22-23, He is talking about a whole different kind of fruit, the fruit of the Spirit. The fruit that should be a part of our every day lives. Let's take a look at each part of the Fruit of the Spirit and how we can apply it to our lives today since we find ourselves dealing in these uncertain times.

*The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.*

Galatians 5:22-23

**LOVE** — Definition of Love — an intense feeling of deep affection

Matthew 22:37-39 says: *Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: "Love your neighbor as yourself."*

**JOY** - Definition of Joy - a feeling of great pleasure and happiness, delight, rejoice

1 Thessalonians 4:16-18 says: *Be joyful always, pray, continually give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.*

**PEACE** - Definition of Peace - freedom from disturbance; quite and tranquility

Matthew 5:9 says: *"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God."*

**FORBEARANCE** - Definition of Forbearance - a refraining from the enforcement of something that is due. Forbearance can also be known as patience.

Colossians 3:13 says: *"Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye."*

**KINDNESS** - Definition of Kindness - the quality of being friendly, generous and considerate.

2 Peter 1:5-7 says: *"For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love."*

**GOODNESS** - Definition of Goodness - the quality of being morally good or virtuous

Romans 15:14 says: *"I myself am convinced, my brothers, that you yourselves are full of goodness, complete in knowledge and competent to instruct one another."*

**FAITHFULNESS** - Definition of Faithfulness - the quality of being faithful. Faithfulness is the concept of unflinchingly remaining loyal to someone or something, and putting that loyalty into consistent practice regardless of extenuating circumstances.

Lamentations 3:22-23 says: *"Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."*

**GENTLENESS** - Definition of Gentleness — the quality of being kind, tender, or mild-mannered.

Philippians 4:4-5 says: *"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near."*

**SELF-CONTROL** - Definition of Self-Control - the ability to control oneself, in particular one's emotions and desires or the expression of them in one's behavior, especially in difficult situations.

Titus 2:11-14 says: *"For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, while we wait for the blessed hope - the glorious appearing of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good."*
