



# WHAT'S GOING ON?

Join First Baptist Church, Enid, January 17-20,2021 for our annual "January Bible Study" with Dr. Bobby Kelly from OBU. Between Sunday and Wednesday we will walk through all three of John's epistles!

John wrote to combat false doctrines about the identity of Jesus and how His identity impacted a believer's every-day life. Some questioned if Jesus was fully human and physical while others questioned Him being the Christ. In both cases, sin was minimized. Believers have fellowship with Christ, who is God incarnate. Through walking in the light of this relationship and living in love, they are secure in the eternal life given through faith in Christ.

The focus of this study is on how a person's understanding of Jesus impacts their daily lives in practical ways.

False teachers with an incomplete understanding of Jesus as both human and deity have sought to mislead believers and continue to seek to do so today. Dear Pastors and Church Leaders:

In 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a presidential proclamation designating the third Sunday in January as **National Sanctity of Human Life Day**. This year marks 48 years since Roe v. Wade, the ruling that protects a pregnant woman's liberty to choose an abortion.

At Journey House, we meet regularly with women who are facing unplanned pregnancies, many of whom believe abortion is their only option. We have found that the primary reasons women choose abortion include: finances, inability to financially or emotionally support a child, lack of support (or practical help) from family or their communities, fear, a desire to attend college or attain higher education, or they do not feel ready to be a parent. Some of our clients are considering abortion because they are being physically abused by their partner, and cannot imagine raising a child in that environment. Journey House provides a safe space for women to explore their options. As we listen to our client's stories, we have an opportunity to offer hope and practical support. Journey House also offers free limited OB ultrasounds. Studies have shown that 75% of women who were abortion-minded change their mind after seeing their child on an ultrasound.

Not only do our services help prevent abortions, but we also offer support and recovery services to women who have had abortions. Studies have shown that 1 in 3 women who have an abortion were attending church at the time. *In addition, 25% of women attending church currently, have had an abortion.* Abortion is often a secret, for many a shameful part of their story, that they will not share with their pastor or fellow church members. In February, Journey House will offer a

12-week closed study, called <u>Forgiven & Set Free</u>, for women who have had an abortion. As they walk this journey of recovery with other women who have experienced abortion, they find hope and healing.

Will you consider highlighting the ministry of Journey House during January? Here are some ways you can help:

- Advertise our upcoming postabortion recovery group, Forgiven & Set Free, by posting information in your bulletin or digitally during announcements.
- Provide opportunities for your congregation to give financially toward the ministry of Journey House. We are funded by donations and rely on the generosity of like minded individuals, churches, and organizations.
- Pray for Journey House, for our staff and volunteers, for our Board members, and for the clients we serve. We desire to be a light in this community as we love, serve with compassion, offer hope, and point people to God.

#### Questions

As a local Pastor in the Enid area, I have a couple of questions on my heart: "Do you know where I am coming from?" and "Do you know what I am going through?" Even as I have these questions on my heart at the beginning of this new year, I don't really know who I am wanting to ask these questions to or even what goal I would try to accomplish in asking these questions. I guess at the root of these questions is my need (and your need, Pastor and Church Leader) for solidarity, for someone to just know what you are going through and to feel what you are feeling.

Today, I would first remind you of what we have just celebrated in the Christmas Season that needs to spill over into this year in our hearts and minds: the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Remember, Pastor and Church Leader, that according to the Apostle John in his Prologue, the Son of God (the Word) was with God (even in the beginning) and was God, and the Word "became flesh and made His dwelling among us" (Jn 1:14). The author of Hebrews writes this concerning Jesus Christ, the Son of God and our High Priest, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin" (Heb 4:15). So, to answer the questions on my heart (and perhaps your heart), the answer is "Yes, Jesus knows." Jesus, our High Priest, is able to sympathize with our weaknesses (boy, there are many of those that have become clear in my life these last ten months) and our temptations. In fact, to be honest, Jesus probably knows more about the power and force of human temptations than we do, because we are prone to give in rather quickly to our evil desires and lusts, which give birth to sin (Jas 1:14-15). Yet, Jesus took on the full force of these temptations, and he never sinned. I encourage you, Pastor and Church Leader, to read the NT Gospels and pay close attention to the emotions and feelings described: Jesus was hungry, thirsty, tired, angry, and frustrated. Jesus can sympathize with you, with what you and your church is going through right now, January 2021.

You also have an Association that can sympathize with you right now. Remember, our purpose as an Association is equip, encourage, and extend the ministries of our local churches. Right now, it is apparent that there is a large need for encouragement for our churches, Pastors, and Church Leaders. We even have several churches in our Association in need of a Pastor. I want you to know that your Association staff is here for you. Matt and Trudi are members of local churches in our Association, and they are involved in their church ministries, and they are fully aware of how difficult things are for local church ministries right now. Your Moderator and Vice-Moderator (Les Washnock) are Pastors of local churches, and we are fully aware of the "decision fatigue" that you are having right now in your ministries. Let us be here to sympathize with you. We want to be faithful to carry each other's burdens and fulfill the law of Christ (Gal 6:2). Maybe this means a phone call (my number is 405-595-1053) so that you can vent. Maybe it means a cup of coffee or a bottle of Dr. Pepper together. Don't carry your burdens alone. Give us a chance to help you carry your burdens. Don't forget that in our rich Baptist heritage, along with the distinctive of local autonomous congregations, there is also the distinctive of cooperation (partnership), local churches of like faith and order doing kingdom work together. Let's do this new year, 2021, together.

#### A CROSS COUNTRY RACE TO REMEMBER

Don't know how many of you ran track in high school, but I did and thought I was a sprinter but my coach decided I was a half-miler (880 yd/800 m). This was probably because hardly anybody else wanted to run that race! The 800 m race is kind of the threshold between a sprint and middle distance, but it's clearly not a long distance or cross country race. That's why I was not filled with joy when coach decided I would fill in when he needed an extra runner for a **cross country race** in Memorial Park by downtown Houston. Despite its location, Memorial Park is a beautiful wooded area with lots of trails and often the site for these kinds of events. But I wasn't into it, and even before the race started was trying to figure out how to get out of it. Could I develop asthma and suddenly have an attack? Could I "accidentally" twist my ankle on the curb?

Before I could come up with anything, the starting gun sounded and we were off. The real cross country runners were literally "off" and out of sight before you knew it as well as most of the other runners. I kept thinking surely they were going wear themselves out and I'd see them dropping off as I passed them--never happened. In fact, I don't remember seeing much of anybody after the first couple of turns. What a lonely feeling! *I wanted out but couldn't figure out how to quit the race nobly*. Then I started feeling a stomachache coming on. That was it--I would throw up and then be forced to step out of the race! I stopped at a couple of turns and tried my best to throw up--but nothing. In the end, I had no choice but to keep plodding along and eventually finish the race, my first and last cross country event!

This **past year may have seemed like that race** to you. I know at times it's seemed that way to me. You make plans, only to have to cancel or postpone. No matter what you do, meet in person or virtual or not at all, still there's somebody who's unhappy. You don't know whether to "fist" or "elbow" somebody when you see them, and whether you need a mask at all times or just when you're within 6 feet. Zoom was fun at first and you still know how to do it, but the novelty's worn off. There may have been times you've wanted to quit or at least let somebody else make the tough decisions for a while.

Sometimes it's at those points where and when you realize you've been striving in your own strength, and you're running out of ideas and motivation to go on. I've had a few of those times this past year. What an encouragement at those points to turn to the Word and be reminded that "those who wait on the Lord will renew their strength, mount up with wings like eagles, run and not be weary." (Isa 40:31) and that though "our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" through the Lord (I Cor 4:). If there's one thing 2020 has reminded me of time and again, it's that I can't and shouldn't try to run this race on my own. We're not made to walk alone, but with our Creator and in His strength.

Back to my cross country race, the runners who do best stick together as a team to encourage each other and spur each other on. I was missing that when I ran my race because I barely even knew the other guys on my "team" and they took off and left me. Had I been with them, my story might have read differently. This past year, I've once again seen the **value of connecting with each other** as we run the race as believers. I can't imagine how lonely and draining 2020 would have been without you guys! There's a reason for "association"--I believe it's part of God's plan to keep us encouraged and challenged to stick with it and run the race well. The "one another" commands of Scripture can only be lived out in relationship with fellow believers. We're much better together than alone.

Here's to a 2021 drawing strength from the Lord and those around us--the only way to run the race!
