

Who, Then, Can Be Saved?

Acts 2:40

Peter preached to a crowd of Jews in Judea shortly after Jesus gave him (and others) a commission to do so. In his sermon, Peter said, “Be saved from this perverse generation?” This begs the question: Who, then can be saved “out from among” this current, lost generation of Americans? Here are some considerations in an attempt to answer this question.

1. Occupations are irrelevant:

- You can be a FISHERMAN and be saved (Mt. 4:18-22)
- You can be a TAX COLLECTOR and be saved (Mt. 9:9)
- You can be a PHYSICIAN and be saved (Colossian 4:14)
- You can be a JAILER and be saved (Acts 16:34)
- You can be a TEACHER and be saved (John 3:10)
- You can be a PASTOR and be saved (Acts 18:8)
- You can be a SOLDIER and be saved (Acts 10:31)

2. Backgrounds and former character are irrelevant:

- You can be saved out of ADULTERY (John 8:11)
- You can be saved out of CHEATING/DECEIVING (Luke 19:6)
- You can be saved out of SATANIC OPPRESSION/POSSESSION (Luke 8:35)

3. Location is irrelevant:

- You can be DRAWING WATER FROM A WELL (John 4:1-42)
- You can be ON YOUR JOB (Mt. 9:9)
- You can be IN A CHURCH (ACTS 2:41)
- You can be IN YOUR HOME (Acts 16:14-15)

4. Age is irrelevant

- Old enough to experience CONVICTION OF SIN (John 16:8-9)
- Old enough to understand CONDITIONS OF SALVATION (John 16:8-9)
- Old enough to remember the CONVERSION OF THE SOUL (II Peter 1:9,13)

Who, then, can be saved? . . . YOU CAN!!!
