Isaiah Chapter 34

Chapter 33 ended with God's people being made well and having their sins forgiven. Chapter 34 by addressing the all the nations of the earth, all of the heavenly realm and ends with a proclamation of judgment and potentially redemption.

1. Look carefully at the first verse of this chapter. Who is being addressed?

2. What does the LORD say to this group and why does He say it? (vs.2)

3. What is the final message to this group? (vs.3)

4. Verses 4 is a challenge and can be interpreted in two ways. Who or what is being addressed in this verse?

5. Verses 5-7 represent one thought or theme.

A) Who or what is Edom?

B) What is the significance of the slaughter of the lambs, goats, rams, oxen, steers and bulls? How does this relate to the first five verses of this chapter?

6. What is the day of vengeance? What is recompense?

7. What is meant by “the cause of Zion?”

8. Verses 9-10 bring this recompense into clearer focus. Some people believe that God’s judgment will destroy or eliminate all that have rejected Him; They will cease to exist. What do these two verses have to say about such thoughts?

9. Verses 11- 15 serve again as a single thought. Who is the “it” in these verses and what becomes of “it?”

10. What is the Book of the LORD? (Rev. 20:12)

11. What will not be missing?

12. Who is the “her” of verse 16? “Her Mate?” The message?

13. What has the LORD commanded? What is the result of this?

14. What were lots cast for? How does this relate to verses 16 - 17?
