As epidemiologists attempt to determine what the Covid-19 pandemic has in store for the U.S. this summer and beyond, they see varied potential futures, differing by how severely The now very familiar coronavirus continues to disrupt humankind. But while these scenarios deviate on various key details – how much transmission will decrease over the summer for instance, and how many people have already been infected (and possibly acquired immunity) – they almost universally predict a world that, even when the present occurrences for the time declines, looks and feels nothing like the world we knew only three months ago. It is turning into a world where wearing a face mask is no more unusual than carrying a cellphone. A world where even as we begin to meet again in small social gatherings, a friend's occasional cough or sneeze will raise danger flags and set off alarms. A world where workplaces have a sense of hot zones, and where taking public transit will Be less environmentally correct as personally dangerous. "October 2020," said emerging diseases expert Amesh Adalja of the John Hopkins University Center for Health Security, "won't look nothing like October 2019."

It is not yet known whether weather and temperature affect the spread of COVID-19 because it may not behave like other mostly cold season viruses. So, what will the soon approaching summer of 2020 look and feel like for most of us? Summer camps and band camps may be on hold, as well as summer school, VBS and other educational programs, as well as youth sport leagues. When and how will ACT test be administered, as well as high school entrance testing? Will those of us who have summer homes be allowed to move back and forth freely? And what about summer vacation plans? While airlines continue to open up travel restrictions within the U.S., when will most hotels, resorts, campgrounds, state, and national parks reopen? Some already have, while many major vacation and amusement areas are yet on hold. And what or Airbnb and international flights? And even of more concern, when will everyone get back to work to pay for all of these things, let alone, the basic necessities of life? Things will be different. Major league sports teams may all be playing in no-crowd stadiums, and most all major concert events scheduled for this summer have already been cancelled. Most restaurants remain closed, but for take-outs and some have limited seating inside. Only a handful of states are reopening.

Which leads us to churches. Some of you have returned to worshipping inside while others of you remain outside and some are doing both while maintaining a online tape of the serve and some have moved to the radio as well. Whatever your "new normal" is I am praying for every church of the SBA as you continue to be faithful to sharing the Good News of the Gospel with your communities and beyond! While this so-called "new normal" has taken shape among us, it is good to know that the "essential," "old normal" is still around: The Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; and the Holy Christian Church – that is, the spiritual assembly of the followers of Jesus – those have attained holiness, according to Jesus Christ, through the only means by which this is possible: through Faith, Repentance and Baptism.
