Dear Bowen Baptist Association and Friends Beyond:

The very fabric of our nation is being torn apart by violence as we speak. The social pundits of our day are scrambling to give meaning to the unrest by creating theories for the behaviors at hand: theories critical to or descriptive of the situation at hand. It seems that there are theories to attempt to explain everything these days, such as religion, race, sexuality, etc. According to those who study those matters, each theory basically presents two types of people at play: 1) The Oppressed and 2) The Oppressors.

The oppressed are unhappy because they have been told they cannot do something, while the oppressors are the ones who said "No". The oppressed have bonded together as an identity with respect to their religion, race, income, immigration status, ethnicity, sexual orientation, disability, etc. Some of these are the oppressed in certain situations, while they may be the oppressors in other situations. That overlapping is called "intersectionality".

We must note here that societal identities are not necessarily sinful. Having more skin color than someone else certainly is not a sin, nor is having a birth defect or debilitating injury. Sexuality of a man and woman within marriage is not sinful, but all deviations are.

Those oppressed believe they have the right to act out their frustrations, and they set themselves up as the moral authority. The more oppressed someone/group sees themselves, the more authority and influence they have. Those who sympathize with and publicly applaud the oppressed are the only ones they will cooperate with. These are the people who have become "Woke" for they have understood, sympathized, and accepted both the perceived plight and the response of the oppressed. Hence, the law is thwarted, and thugs rule the streets. The justice system is rendered almost useless. As Christians, we know that these matters represent secular humanism: man wanting to be what he wants to be without restraint.

What does the Word say about all this? Number one, the problem is not a skin or a status problem, it is a sin problem. "For all have sinned..." (Romans 3:23) Until man recognizes that salvation is the answer to ALL man's ills, these things will continue. Unfortunately, man's solution has often been to give the baby what he wants so he'll stop fussing. That fixes nothing and only serves to spoil the baby even more, so that he feels entitled to have what he yells for.


Number two, God is not a respecter of persons (Acts 10:34), nor should we be either. We ought to see everyone through Christ's eyes, a sinner in need of a Savior, then we should act accordingly. "...That whosoever believeth in Him...." (John 3:16) is our marching orders.

Church, may we not take our cues from the world and become sidetracked, thinking as society and some faiths believe, that social action leads to a type of salvation. We must certainly comfort the hurting and serve those less fortunate, but sharing the Gospel must be the Center of who we are as a church. May we not be diverted from The Great Commission: sharing the Good News!

Our SBC has already fought a battle with compromise, and another denomination is the result of that compromise of the Word. That need not happen again. Church, may Christ's sacrifice for sin be our only message, knowing that His Salvation solves all man's woes.
