As I write this, we are nearly nine months into the COVID-19 pandemic. Can you imagine that? While there are some hopeful signs in terms of developing vaccines and treatments, there's no end in sight. The most optimistic prediction of when life can return to anything approaching normal is late 2021 into early 2022.

Add to that racial turmoil, violence in the streets, a highly contentious election, and uncertainty about the future of the United Methodist Church as well as the Church in general, and you get a brew that breeds anxiety, despair, fear, and anger.

We're also approaching the holiday season, and we're aware that we can't (or at least we shouldn't) celebrate the way we'd like to and are used to with our extended family and our friends. What are we to do?

The best thing to do in this case, I believe, is to lament. Singer/Songwriter/Bible Teacher Michael Card calls lament "the lost language of worship." Throughout the Psalms, the Prophets, and even the words of Jesus in the Gospels, we encounter the language of lament. It comes as people pour out their hearts to God echoing the words on the lips of many prophets, "How long, O Lord, how long?"

To lament is to express to God our fears, our despair, our grief, and yes even our anger to God. It acknowledges that sometimes things aren't going right, and it seems that God is silent or in fact doesn't seem to care. It brings to the surface the anguish we feel deep inside.

Pouring that out brings healing. It helps us get out what we usually don't think we can express. It reminds us that, despite our feelings, God isn't really far away or uncaring. It reminds us that, even though we may feel disconnected from God and the world around us, God is right there weeping with us and holding us close.

I've heard and read many people who feel disconnected from God because of the massive upheaval in their lives. That's understandable and normal. If you feel disconnected from God, you're in good company. People throughout the centuries have felt this way when things are in turmoil. You're in company with Jesus on the cross when he cried out, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

We've heard this world we're living in called "the new normal." I don't believe that. I believe it's the "temporary normal."

We're living now, I believe, in what is called liminal space—the space in between the world that was and the world that will be.

The world we knew in January and February before the pandemic is gone—much of it forever. We aren't going to be able to flick a switch and go back to the world as it was. The pandemic has changed the world forever. That's a reason to lament.

Liminal space—the space in between what was and what will be—often feels like death. That old world is dying, but it's not dying easily. That's why we're seeing the increase of tensions and

violence. There are those who want to return us to the old, dead world because it promises a false sense of equilibrium. But it's a dead promise. We can't go back.

Our only hope is to go forward and let God lead us through this liminal space into a new world that will increasingly be like the Kingdom of God. Our hope in Christ is all about resurrection and new life on a remade earth.

But we're in the in-between time now. And it's painful. And we lament.

But God is leading us, as God has always led God's people, into a new and better world. Our nation is in trouble. Our world is in trouble. But God's Kingdom isn't in trouble.

We will get through this liminal space.

But until then, we lament.

I close with a prayer from the Northumbria Community (a new monastic order in the Celtic tradition). This is a prayer I pray every night during Evening Prayer. May it help us through this liminal space:

Lord, You have always given
bread for the coming day;
and though I am poor,
today I believe.

Lord, You have always given
strength for the coming day;
and though I am weak,
today I believe.

Lord, You have always given
peace for the coming day;
and though of anxious heart,
today I believe.

Lord, You have always kept
me safe in trials;
and now, tried as I am,
today I believe.

Lord, You have always marked
the road for the coming day;
and though it may be hidden,
today I believe.

Lord, You have always lightened

this darkness of mine;
and though the night is here,
today I believe.

Lord, You have always spoken
when time was ripe;
and though you be silent now,
today I believe.

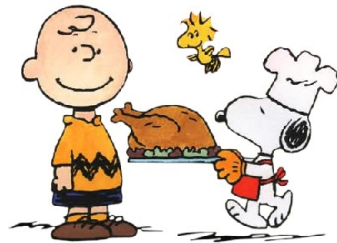

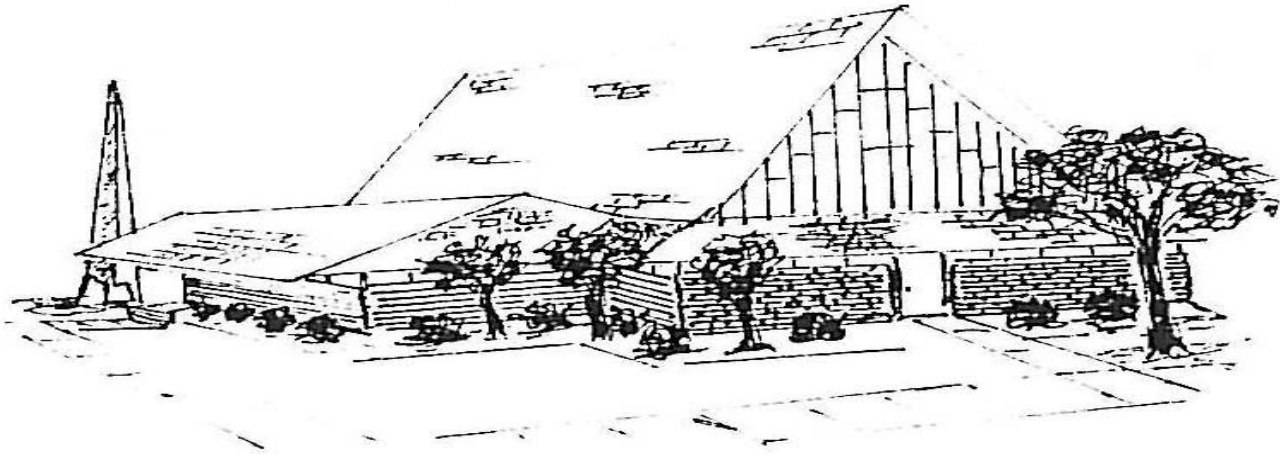

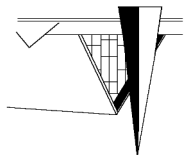
