Hart to Heart

- God has been gracious to CNYBA this year. Souls are being saved and people are being discipled. But I was sorely disappointed in the attendance at our annual meeting, where the count was only 26 in attendance from 13 CNYBA churches. I did enjoy the fellowship and the challenge from our missionary speaker, Dr. David Pope.
- Please continue praying for Jessica DePugh, daughter of Pastor John DePugh (**Newark BC**), who has been in the hospital (most of the time in ICU) for the past 365 days (1 year). She is struggling these days. Let's lift her and her family up in prayer.
- Please continue praying for Diane Brown, wife of Pastor Mike Brown (Three Pines, Doraville), who will have further surgery connected with her fight against cancer. Let's lift her and her family up in prayer.
- Please continue praying for Pastor Gary Culver (<u>Emory Capel, Barton</u>), who is battling bone cancer. At the moment he is doing some better, but the battle continues. Let's lift him and his wife Margaret up in prayer.
- After church last night, and very shortly after I pulled out of the parking lot, Pastor Harold Lefler fell as he was getting into his car and broke his ankle in two places. He was taken by ambulance to the local hospital, where he remains at this writing. He will have surgery sometime today to install a screw at the inside break and a plate for the outside break. He will be laid up for a while. Let's remember to lift Bro. Harold, and his wife, Jan, up in prayer.

- The 2018 CNYBA Annual Meeting was held on Saturday past at **Emanuel**, **Cortland**.
- We voted to continue to cover the cost of essential maintenance, repairs, insurance, and utilities for one more year at the Genesee St. property in Syracuse and that the CNYBA Leadership Team review the progress of this project next fall and bring a recommend to the annual meeting in 2019 regarding its continuation.
- We voted to approve the proposed CNYBA Budget for 2019 of \$67,720.
- We voted to accept the proposed 2018 CNYBA Calendar
- We voted to revise the job descriptions of the Assistant Clerk and Assistant Treasurer by striking the requirement that they serve on the Executive Board and the Leadership Team.
- We voted to add one requirement to the Assistant Treasurer's job description: "Serve as one of two persons authorized to sign checks and withdrawals in behalf of the association."
- We elected Linda Cole, Bill Lower, Nehemiah Taylor, and Alex Rivera to serve on the CNYBA Leadership Team.
- We elected the following to serve outside the Leadership Team: Karen Sorensen as Assistant Treasurer (the back-up check signer) for CNYBA and Lyn Hart as Assistant Clerk for CNYBA.
- We accepted the slate of officers recommended by the Ad Hoc Committee on Nominations. They are Bill Lower (Moderator), Jeff Ford (Assistant Moderator), Linda Cole (Clerk), and Lary Hyde (Treasurer).
