- I hope you are warm and comfortable after the winter storm that invaded our area this week-end. Now the temperature is dangerously low. I just plowed the driveway and the wind makes the temperature feel even worse. Be careful.
- The CNYBA Spring Mission Trip will be April 13-19 to do roof repair/and or replacement in Puerto Rico. We need 10-12 people. Right now we can go for under \$1000, which would include air fare AND food, lodging, and transportation on the field. If you can get the time off and want to take a few days of vacation, you can purchase your airfare individually to fit your schedule, as long as you show up by Saturday afternoon, April 13. It is cheaper to fly on Thursdays and Tuesdays. However food, lodging, and transportation will be provided only April 13-19. If you want to go, but need to put the money aside over the next two or three months, let me know and we can work out a payment plan. I need to know ASAP if you are interested. We need to get the trip registered with NAMB.

- <u>Nepali, Syracuse</u> will host a gathering of Syracuse Pastors praying for the city of Syracuse on Saturday, January 26<sup>th</sup> from 8-9 AM at their facility at 1501 Lodi Street. Bhim Biswa is Pastor
- <u>Casa dePaz, Syracuse</u> has begun a third Bible study group on the east side of Syracuse. In 2018 they started two Bible study groups a south side group and a north side group. They meet for worship on Sunday afternoon at <u>The Neighborhood Church</u> facility. Alex Rivera is Pastor.
- <u>Inlet CC</u> has a Deacon's Fund. Each month, on the Sunday that they observe the Lord's Supper, they take a special offering designated for the Fund, which operates outside our normal operating budget at the discretion of the deacons to meet tangible needs in our church family and community. Recently, this Deacon Fund has been flush with resources due to this fund being designated for contributions in memorial of a young man who recently passed away. To spread the blessing more widely than usual with numerous "micro-blessings" they came up with the idea for a "reverse deacon fund" for the month of December. Instead of collecting money on the week they observed the Lord's Table, they distributed money, giving \$20 to each person in attendance. They handed out around \$800 and invited people to pray about how they might use that money to be a blessing to someone and then put it to work. Reports of how the money was used were amazing. Only God knows the impact of these seeds that were planted and the inroads that were made for the glory of the gospel. Phil Huber is Pastor.

### **Missionary of the Week**

Today we are going to a South Asian country with many mountains. We cannot name it because the government there says they are "closed" to the Gospel. It is dangerous for Christian missionaries to live there. But we Baptists have sent missionaries anyway, because it is so important that people everywhere have an opportunity to hear about Jesus. Our two missionaries we are talking about today we will call Marcia and Kacey - and you understand these are not their real names. Remember that our church supports these two missionaries, just as we support many missionaries serving in dangerous, "closed" countries - through the Cooperative Program. Through friendship with Marcia, a local woman we'll call Asha and her husband accepted Jesus as Savior. How could Asha and another new believer, Maya, share their Christian faith? Marcia and Kacey helped them start teaching classes on cooking, which they combined with Bible study. As the two new believers shared recipes on spaghetti and other dishes, they also taught the Bible to women who had not heard of Jesus. Today let us pray that the Lord will keep our missionaries Marcia and Kacey safe as they serve Him there in Asia. And let's pray that the Lord will bless these two new believers, Asha and Maya, as they share recipes for pasta, but also the only recipe for eternal salvation - main ingredient, Jesus!
