- End of Year Report from Baptist Campus Ministry, Syracuse

 University: The end of the academic year is the time to reflect and give thanks for the work God has done. Last August, our opening event welcomed 90 people to Taco Tuesday, many of whom became involved all year and have become leaders already. From last semester to this one, we saw a 25% increase in Campus Church attendance, had over 325 people come visit on Sundays, and had two Sundays with over 110 people. Our music team grew from a single guitarist to a whole band that has truly led us to worship God in song. We hosted two one-day retreats which taught students to capture a sense of mission for unreached places, Christ's heart for the nations, and Gospel-sharing skills.

We saw many of our students do incredible work in their clubs and organizations for the benefit and blessing of their campuses. Along those lines, we blessed our campus with 1,000 breakfast bars and 2,000 free coffee coupons to People's Place. Our students served off-campus as well, preparing and handing out blessing bags in the community, making sandwiches for those in need, serving alongside other local churches through children's programming and community outreach events, and replacing hurricane-damaged roofs in Puerto

Rico.

We saw students grow in their relationships with Jesus, turning from idols and repenting of sin. Our students share with their friends and family members. We are excited to see the work that God does in our students over the break.

Missionary of the Week

• We know that people around the world are moving to other countries to live. People from China, for example, have moved all over the world. We don't think of Chinese people living, say, in South America, but millions of Chinese now live there. Our missionaries we are going to pray for today serve in South America - in Lima, the capital city of Peru. They are Joe and Kim Busching and they're our missionaries because we support them as our church gives to missions through the Cooperative Program. In 2016 Joe and Kim arrived in Lima, which is Spanish-speaking, of course. Then they learned that more than a million Chinese people were living in their city, but they could find only about 90 who were Christians. So they start praying about how these million Chinese can hear about Jesus. They made contact with a Chinese Baptist church in Kansas City and then with a Chinese Christian woman who runs a school to teach Spanish to Chinese. Gradually, Joe and Kim are making contacts with believers and figuring out other ways to share the Gospel. Let's ask God to bless Joe and Kim serving way down in South America. Let's thank God that, as Christians, we don't care much abo
