Hart to Heart

- As you are probably aware, Lyn and I have been on a three week working vacation. I've been checking email from time to time (when we have Wi-Fi which has been sketchy in most RV parks), responding to texts, I-messages, Facebook posts, and phone calls. After nearly 4000 miles and twelve states (plus 5 of the states again on the way home) we arrived home late Monday afternoon. Even the boys were happy to be home. However, we did enjoy our time away. Highlights included spending a couple days with my brother and his wife touring the Ark replica and Creation Museum in KY & OH, visiting with my sister (who is receiving chemo as she fights pancreatic & kidney cancer) in Omaha, and visiting with long-time friends in Bemidji, MN, where we attended Sunday morning worship at the church we planted there back in the 1980s. We hadn't been back to Bemidji in 7 or 8 years.
- If you have emailed me in the past three weeks and did not get an answer, please re-email me. It is difficult on the road to delete emails without Wi-Fi. I can check them on my phone, but they keep building because I cannot find a way to delete groups of emails on the phone. They have to be deleted one at a time. So my in-box keeps getting larger and larger and I may have overlooked someone. AND I just deleted over 1500 emails and may have deleted yours accidently.
- We have a request from one of the churches we are partnering with on St. Thomas in the US Virgin Islands. They want to do a mission trip to Jamaica later this summer and are asking if we could help support the funding for that. They need \$500 to finish funding that project. - On June 1st I completed 23 years as a Director of Missions in upstate New York. From 13 churches in Southern Tier to 46 churches now in Central New York, much has occurred and much has changed in that time. In addition to many associational mission trips, several mission projects in Peru and the Virgin Islands, and many seminars and workshops that hopefully help strengthen churches, about half the churches in our association have been started since I arrive back in the state of my birth in 1996. I am deeply grateful to the pastors and churches for allowing me to serve. May the Lord add His blessings to our efforts for the Kingdom.

We owe an eternal debt of gratitude to men like Harold, who have invested their lives in the work of the Lord in upstate New York and upon whose shoulders we continue to build. Sometimes I think we don't honor those who have gone before us as we should. Bro. Harold has done much foundational work in upstate New York over several decades. He invested the most productive part of this life ministry here, when he could probably have served in more lucrative ministry elsewhere. Since coming to upstate New York way back when, he has buried two wives, raise two daughters, pastored churches, planted churches, and has been very active in the local association. He has been a real support to me over the past two plus decades. God's speed. My friend!
- Southern Baptists honored 26 new missionaries sent by their home churches through the International Mission Board during a June 11 Sending Celebration.

Missionary of the Week

• Today we want to talk about one of our seminaries - New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary - and I think you can figure out where it's located? Like the five other Southern Baptist seminaries our church supports, New Orleans trains hundreds of our future pastors, missionaries and church leaders each year. Our church supports all six seminaries through our Cooperative Program giving. For years, some of the New Orleans faculty and graduates have been helping train

pastors in the South American nation of Colombia. Teams have been trekking into the mountains north of Bogota, the capital city, to lead classes. They have partnered with Scott Lake Baptist Church in Scott Lake, Florida. Three years ago Abel Tovar was one pastor trying to serve five small churches. But Tovar has been busy training pastors, using what he learned from his New Orleans partners. Now there are six local pastors and others in training. The visiting teachers have counted 800 people attending the six churches and during one recent visit, 16 new members were baptized. Today let's pray for Pastor Tovar and the great work he is doing in Colombia. And let's give thanks for the fine folks teaching at New Orleans Seminary, that they don't just stand in the classroom, but also take their teaching where it's needed.
