Peter and his young family were sent to this East Asian country to plan new churches among the refugees who have come to escape the violence in their home country. Because of the difficult conditions in this country. Peter must start a business in order to both make a living and also have a reason to continue living here. Today let's pray for Peter and his family - that the Lord will keep them safe so they can keep serving. And let's pray for our missionaries we are supporting there. Even though we are not speaking their names today, the Lord knows them, for He has called them to this place of service. Remember that, because our church supports missions through the Cooperative Program, we are supporting missionaries across East Asia, even in some very dangerous places.
