From HART BEAT - 2 December 2012

- Lyn worshipped with the good folks at our home church, <u>Living Water</u>,
 <u>Owego</u> this morning. I worked in the BCNY Disaster Relief Feeding Unit on our last day of feeding on Long Island, oversaw taking it down and loading it up, then drove home. I will complete the task by taking the unit back to the BCNY office in East Syracuse tomorrow.
- Southern Baptist Disaster Relief --Ministry Report from Superstorm Sandy as of November 25: More than 1,200 volunteers from Canada and 34 states. 198 professions of faith and over 1.8 million meals cooked. I'm reasonably sure we're up over 2 million meals served by now.
- The 2013Keep the Fire Burning Pastors' and Leaders' Conference is scheduled for March 3-5 at Northside, Liverpool.
- Pastor Wayne Sibrava at <u>Living Water</u>, <u>Owego</u>, where I am a member, sent out the following email this past week. I thought you all should see it.

The Cooperative Program is the combined effort of more than 16,000,000 Southern Baptists from more than 45,000 churches to work together at helping reach our world for Jesus Christ. This year the Cooperative Program budget is \$186,000,000. This sacred trust from the churches is disseminated as follows:

North American Mission Board	\$42,389,400
Theological Education	\$41,217,600
Christian Ethics and Religious Liberties Ministries	\$3,069,000
Facilitating Ministries	\$5,952,000

Through the International Mission Board (<u>www.imb.org</u>), Southern Baptists support approximately 5,624 missionaries who are engaging 655 people groups, of populations greater than 100,000, around the world.

New churches numbering over 1,364 are planted through the efforts of more than 5,304 North American Missionaries, whose efforts are coordinated through your North American Mission Board (www.namb.net) and individual state conventions.

Working together, Southern Baptists saw 855,756 new believers baptized in 2009!

Six Southern Baptist seminaries (Southern, Southeastern, Midwestern, Southwestern, Golden Gate, and New Orleans) educate in excess of 16,000 pastors, missionaries, and future church leaders each year.

The Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission is dedicated to addressing social, moral, and ethical concerns, with particular attention to their impact on American families and their faith. They also provide print resources that offer scriptural responses to the moral and ethical problems of our culture.

Although they receive no Cooperative Program support, LifeWay Christian Resources, Guidestone Financial Resources and the Woman's Missionary Union (WMU) actively promote Cooperative Program in publications and missions resources.
