

Child Development Center



Each day begins with engaging circle time! Young preschoolers learn about colors, shapes, numbers, and letters. Arts and Crafts are incorporated into daily lessons. We like to get messy and create! We use different media such as paint, playdoh and other common (and uncommon) materials. We provide manipulative activities to develop eye-hand coordination, small motor skills and problem-solving skills. Developing an awareness of other children and people in their environment are a part of each day.

Classroom materials are always accessible, attractive, safe, and geared for a child's success. Each child has their own box which contains a variety of materials such as crayons, markers, glue sticks, playdoh and scissors (as age appropriate). Activities are changed regularly in response to children's need for variety and challenge as they grow and learn.

Ways we stay healthy

- Frequent hand washing is the best way to prevent many illnesses.
- Proper bathroom habits are taught and reinforced throughout each day.
- Covering coughs and sneezers is reinforced daily.
- We Clean, disinfect, and sanitize toys, furniture, and other objects in the Classrooms daily.
- The outdoor areas are clean and maintained.
- Menu consists of healthy meals to boost immunity.

Sensory/Oral Motor experience of the Month: Bubbles

 Bubbles are a great activity to learn many things. The ability to blow isn't the only thing you are working on when you blow bubbles. Structured bubble activities can help you to learn a substantial amount of information about the skills that your child has.

- Cognitive Development: See if your child is visually tracking the bubbles around the room. Watch for a head turn or the movement of the eyes to see the bubbles. Additionally, see how long they attend to the activity. Attentions is a cognitive processing skill. Talk about what will happen and see if your child is anticipating. "The bubble will pop!"
- Social/Emotional Development: See how your child expresses their emotions about the activity. Also, watch how they are interacting with others while making bubbles. See if your child will share with others.
- Fine Motor Development: Watch for grasping the wand with the fingers rather than the entire palm of the hand or using fingers to open the bottle. Encourage your child to use a single finger to poke the bubbles and pop them.
- Gross Motor Development: Watch as your child reaches out with their arms to grab a bubble. See if they will clap their hands to catch a bubble.
- Self-Help Skills: See how your child asks for your help. Encourage them to open the bubbles themselves or to find them in the air. As much as possible, let them do it themselves.
- Most of all, have fun with the bubbles!

Imagine looking across the plains of Texas 150 years ago and seeing a cloud of dust. You might have asked yourself, "What is that? A stampede or a whirlwind?" One of those things will make an impression; the other will make an impact!

Now through the eyes of the Great Commission, look across the nations of world at their myriad of unknowns, challenges, and dust and ask yourself "What will our church do to make a lasting impact on these peoples living in these nations?"

A very significant way to make an impact is to be engaged in the multiplication of church leaders. It is through biblically-trained, passionate leaders that many lost people receive the gospel and are nurtured to become disciples of Jesus who love and follow him.

And this brings us at First Baptist Church to our thirteen years of involvement with Uganda Baptist Seminary. Like many places of the world, central Africa is a cacophony of sounds and a collage of diverse peoples. Many of these African people are open to the gospel and want to be a part of a vibrant church. Well trained church leaders effectively evangelize and lead energetic churches. Sandi and I saw this first-hand the eighteen years we were at UBS. For example, between 2008 and 2016, the seminary grew from 350 to 550 students and as a result of their ministries more that 120,000 people accepted Christ as Savior and over 20,000 new believers were baptized churches.

I've recently talked with the current head of seminary, Anthony Shelton, an IMB appointed missionary. He told me about their 2020 challenges related to COVID lock-downs. However, the government has now allowed Uganda schools to reopen in November and engage in normal operation. This means that students can restart their academic studies and are now free again to plant new churches and baptizing new believers. It's very exciting. Thank you FBC for your generosity and prayers for your support of the Lottie Moon Mission Offering of foreign missions that results in an African-sized impact through your involvement at Uganda Baptist Seminary in 2020.
