From the Pastor's Desk

I chuckled recently when I saw a print ad for a unique Christmas ornament. It was a sleigh that had toilet paper and hand sanitizer bottles inside, with "2020" painted on the side. The driver was a kitten wearing a mask!

We've had to work sometimes to find humor this year. Aside from the pandemic, we've been strained by racist conflict and election incivility... not to mention the difficulties in our own personal lives. Yet as Christians, we know there is always hope, and joy, and the love of God. No doubt this year has not gone the way any of us would have chosen, but nothing in it was a surprise to the Lord. Satan's been awfully busy wreaking havoc, but the Lord is not only in control, but overcoming. Only those of us with faith and the eyes to see His handiwork can attest to this, but we must!

For me, a beautiful symbol of 2020 is a box sitting on my dining room table. It is so full of cards and notes that I have to cram new ones in. But I am keeping each and every one of them forever, because they were sent to me by thoughtful and caring people who are walking with me through a serious illness. Thank you for them, and for all the other ways you have supported me during difficult days-- days when you could have been wrapped up in your own valid difficulties, but reached out to me anyway. I am deeply grateful, beyond words.

The success my treatments have had is truly due to the Lord answering your prayers—this is definitely a team effort. You have a hand in my wellness, and I praise God that so many of you have come alongside to help! The Apostle Paul knew struggles quite well. Yet in 2 Corinthians 4, he wrote about our certain hope: "God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made His light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of God's glory displayed in the face of Christ. ⁷ But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us. ⁸ We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; ⁹ persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed. ¹⁶ Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. ¹⁷ For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. ¹⁸ So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

When 2021 begins, it would be great if the pandemic and our other national and personal concerns would all evaporate, but that probably won't happen. Even so, we who follow Christ are His light-bearers. The light is most powerful in the darkest days. So no matter what, draw closer to Him, and shine His light through praying, encouraging, caring, and serving others. When so many feel that the world is spinning out of control, we can share hope by assuring them that they can be blessed by counting on our precious, holy Cornerstone. His name is Jesus, Emmanuel, God with us.
