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Here are tips 7 on what you should not do when writing an essay.

1. Do not use a cliché

The first thing I remember was written by a teacher telling me when I was younger - "avoid clichés", and this is still true. Cliché in writing - excessive expressions, which over time lost their brilliance. Some examples are phrases like "many fish in the sea" or "add insult to the wound". We've all heard these expressions millions of times, and they just feel stale and unoriginal. One should avoid even the phrases used by many essay writers, for example, "at the end of the day" or "on this day and at the age."

2. Do not use pointless suggestions

When I write an essay, I start to go crazy, that every sentence should have a goal. Of course, no record is perfect, but you only get a limited number of words to write what you really want to write. Do not use your space with thoughts or suggestions that should be in the trash can. When you write, think of each sentence as a bridge to your next one. That's why there are contours. Although I'm not always a fan of outlines, half of the essay writing comes before you even type the word.

3. Do not use fill words

Yes, the completion of word counting is important, but do not give priority to the quality of your essay. Words such as "basically," "very," "really," "this," and "extra" are words that are often used unnecessarily. This is the equivalent of the word "mind", and you do not want it.

4. Do not be superfluous

A redundant letter is my pet. This topic is related to the idea of having meaningful proposals. Always change your vocabulary so that you do not use the same words throughout the entire essay. Do not make each offer long and do not make too short an offer. You must revive it. You do not want every chick every day to remain for the rest of your life; Sometimes you want a steak. The best way to avoid redundancy is to read your essay out loud. When you hear the flow of your essay, you will notice the changes that you must make.

5. Do not waste your quotes

Of course, it's important to know the basics of writing citations in an essay, but it's also important to know how to use quotes. Quotations should not be used randomly; They should only be used if the person you are quoting said something that you could not have said better. Common error writers do this to forget to enter a quote. Quotations are not intended to simply appear in a paragraph. Another important thing to remember is that quotes should only be used to expand your thoughts on an essay. Follow your quotes with the content that shows the reader why you chose the quote.

6. Do not stray from the topic

Do not start an essay without having an idea of how you want the whole essay to go. This may seem simple, but it's actually easy to make a mistake if you are not focused enough. Professors do not like

to read essays that begin with a strong, but tapering towards the end. Even the best writers in the world had to learn discipline. This can be avoided through a constant review and a solid foundation or plan.

7. Do not throw away your conclusion

Do not use your opinion as a one-off. The conclusion is a vital fragment of your essay that rounds off your thoughts and leaves a good or bad impression on your professor. Although your conclusion should not introduce new thoughts, do not forget to repeat what you have already said in your essay. A good way to start the conclusion is to remind the reader of your dissertation. Make sure that the last sentence is interesting and made an indelible impression on the reader.

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
