Course Description: This course is designed for students who are almost ready for elementary algebra. Those who place in this course study all processes of fractions, decimals, ratios, proportions, percent, measurement, integers, basic geometry and algebraic expressions / equations.

INTRODUCTION

Hello, welcome to Math 25 On-line Course. Most of you are probably taking this course to prepare for (Mth 70) Elementary Algebra, Technical Math or Business Math. I hope you will see this as a helpful step towards completing your future math and educational goals.

****This course is a combination of on-line homework and written exams (exams are taken at BMCC testing centers or under special arrangements, prearranged proctoring).

To finish this course, you need to:

- *complete the assignments listed on-line,
- *pass the two proficiency exams,
 - **proficiency exams will not be graded until your homework assignments for the coordinating work has been submitted.
- *pass the exit exam,

and

*take two chapter exams.

**Watch the given dates on the Mth 25 class schedule for the exams!!!!!

You may always take exams early. All proficiency exams, chapter exams, and the exit exam are to be taken at a BMCC Center. Exceptions will be made only for students with disabilities or residence outside of BMCC's five county service area. Please verify the hours at your local BMCC center, the testing centers may have different hours throughout the region.

Six required exams, taken at a BMCC Center or as listed above:

- 1. Two--Proficiency Exams:
 - -required grade to pass each proficiency exam, 90% or above -- integers and 80% or above -- fractions
 - -closed book with no notes:
 - -no calculators allowed;
 - -unlimited attempts through November 15, 2016.
- 2. One -- Exit Exam:
 - -requires a percentage of 80% or higher to pass this class with a grade of "C" or higher and at least 2 or more correct in each area
 - with two attempts max, completed at a testing center on a computer.
 - -closed book with no notes;
 - -and no calculators allowed.
- 3. Two -- Chapter Exams:
 - -will be closed book, no notes, and taken only once; students may use a calculator.
 - If a "<u>chapter exam"</u> is not taken on the scheduled day, you will serve the consequences (an hour timed, intense, proctored, comprehensive final --- taken on-line the day after the Exit Exam, November $30^{\rm th}$),
 - -unless there is an emergency and I'm contacted before the due date.

GRADES: Your grade will be determined using standard percentiles, in other words,

90-100% = A, 80-89% = B, 70-79% = C, 60-69% = D, and below 59% = F.

TIME MANAGEMENT: In a regular 4 credit course you should spend 2 hours out of class for every hour you spend in class, therefore, you would spend a minimum of 8 hours total a week on assignments and review. If you want to finish this course in a timely manner, you will need to spend 8 or more hours a week working on it. You may work as rapidly as you want in this course. In other words, you can complete the course early if you want. But, please be sure you understand the concepts before you proceed to the next exercises. Math builds on prior knowledge. If you are having difficulty with even a small area, it will come back later and haunt you. So please be sure you thoroughly understand the material.

CALCULATORS: A fraction calculator. A fraction calculator is able to calculate fractions and has a key with an A b/c symbol on it. The fraction calculator can be purchased at any store where calculators are sold and usually cost around \$15.

**A note of CAUTION: Be sure you know how to do the problems by hand or the long way as well as being able to do them on your calculator. No calculator can be used during the proficiency exams and the exit exam. So, do not rely on your calculator completely, be sure you thoroughly understand the process you go through to solve a problem before you use your calculator.
