The van travels to towns bordering Boxborough and may be used for medical appointments and local errands. Medical rides to Concord are considered local. Medical rides to other towns are subject to availability. To book a ride, call 978-264-1730. Rides are free until further notice.

We offer Boxborough seniors and disabled adults transportation, through our **Go Boxborough!** program, to medical appointments that are outside the service area, time, or availability of our van. Presenting Yellowstone

Stephen Kent is a photographer whose images have appeared in *Wild Bird* magazine, *Galapagos Conservancy* calendars, and the British tabloid, *The Sun*. He has photographed wildlife on seven continents. His website, beenthereshotthat.us, provides thousands of photos and several videos from his world travels.

This presentation on **Wednesday**, **November 5** at **1:30 PM** in the **Community Center** illustrates how you can use the current version of iPhone to get beautiful images of geothermal features. The images were captured in June/July 2025 during a trip to Yellowstone Park. The presentation also includes images that require a conventional 35mm camera and super telephoto lens to contrast what types of images cannot be captured at high quality by an iPhone. Steve will bring the camera equipment he used for the non-iPhone images for illustrative purposes.


