Every year, among my personal Advent and Christmas traditions is the re-reading of Barbara Robinson’s masterpiece, *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever*, which begins:

“The Herdmans were absolutely the worst kids in the history of the world...”

The last place one would find children like the Herdmans is in Church. Everyone who met them “figured they were headed straight to hell, by way of the state penitentiary.” And yet, it happens one day that Herdmans find themselves in the children’s Sunday School class at the local Presbyterian Church. By providence, the particular Sunday on which they attend Church School is also the Sunday where the parts for the annual Christmas pageant are assigned. Not ones to be left out the spotlight—the Herdmans eagerly sign-up, much to the fear and

trembling of the other children. But the biggest transgression is not that they are simply going to be in the pageant (which certainly, is bad enough)—they alone will play Mary, Joseph, the magi, and the angel Gabriel.

The members of the church are offended that the Herdmans—who pilfered change out of the offering plate—would portray the Holy Family. But the pageant goes on. You’ll need to read the book yourself to learn how the Herdmans did in their first acting debut, but, as the title suggests, “it was the Best Christmas Pageant Ever.”

The Jesus we meet in the Gospels is rather offensive, too, and Advent is the season where we learn just how offensive our God can be. The Incarnation itself is God’s great Offense to the powers of oppression, of tyranny, God’s great scandal that God would be born in human likeness, born as one of the least of these. How offensive that God would choose to be born as the child of two nomad parents, who couldn’t even score a room at the Bethlehem Holiday Inn, especially since God could certainly pick any number of qualified parents with more wealth and resources at their disposal!

The Jesus we encounter, whom John the Baptist proclaims, is the sort of savior who reaches out to the Herdmans in the world, and reminds them that they, too, are worthy of the love of God. The Herdman children learn this during a church Christmas pageant; may we learn it, too, in the unexpected places Advent leads us. *May you have the Best Advent Ever.*







PRESBYTERIAN YOUTH TRIENNium 2019



It's TIME to register for Triennium July 16-20, 2019

The Presbyterian Youth Triennium is a five-day event for high school age youth (entering freshmen through graduated seniors). The Triennium is focused on equipping young people to be transformational Christian leaders and seeks to join the home churches of the attendees to help call young people into deeper discipleship in Jesus Christ. The Youth Triennium is a high energy, Biblically infused and focused, youth friendly conference. The Youth Triennium occurs every three years. The event is held at Purdue University and typically has more than 5,000 participants. We will travel to Kansas City on July 15, spend the night at a Presbyterian Church and take a chartered bus to this event. We are accepting registration forms with a \$50 deposit. Registering and paying a \$75 deposit online by December 18 will allow you the following discounts (excluding family and grand camps); if online registration or payment is not an option for you, a paper registration and \$75 check must be received in the church office by December 9 for the following discounts:

- ❖ 15% cost of camp by Heartland Center
- ❖ 1/3 cost of camp by Presbytery
- ❖ 1/3 cost of camp by Trinity Presbyterian.

Registering after December 18 you will only receive the 1/3 cost of camp discount by Presbytery. If you sign up for camp and have a conflict with the date you signed up to attend, you can switch to another camp date if there are openings by contacting Heartland Center.

We have donated 10 lap blankets and 15 prayer shawls, some of which have been shared with church members and others are awaiting to be distributed by the Deacons. 14 purple hats were donated to the Click for Babies

Project. 5 baby blankets were donated to the Ronald McDonald House and Every Woman's Resource Center and 48 hats were donated to the V.A. hospital. There, they are distributed to the Veterans and their families.

In May, we presented Trinity's 5 High School Seniors with neck scarves in the colors of the college they planned to attend in the fall. 81 dishcloths were sent to El Salvador this year with Ken Cott and his group.

The Topeka Shawnee County Library had a Community Poppy Project which we participated in. The community was asked to make 1,977 poppies to represent all Kansans who died in service during WWI. The poppies are displayed at the Alice C. Sabatini Gallery. Many groups have donated poppies and our group donated 60 crocheted and knitted poppies. 
