PHASE ONE

If Nashville experiences stable or sustained declining trend in new cases for at least 14 days, Phase One may begin.

- Retail and other commercial businesses open at $\frac{1}{2}$ capacity with physical distancing, cleaning of carts, hand hygiene and face masks for employees/patrons.
- Restaurants/bars serving food open at $\frac{1}{2}$ capacity with physical distancing.
- Other physical distancing measures remain in place.

Except when performing essential services, age 65+ and high-risk stay at home

All work from home if possible

All residents wear cloth masks in public

Schools closed

No gatherings >10 people

PHASE TWO

If, after a minimum of 14 days in Phase One, the trend of new cases continues to decline or remains flat, Nashville may proceed to Phase Two.

- Retail and other commercial businesses open at $\frac{3}{4}$ capacity with physical distancing.
- Restaurants/bars serving food open at $\frac{3}{4}$ capacity with physical distancing.
- Hair, nail, massage and tattoo businesses open but should follow CDC guidance, including limiting the number of patrons and staff to <10 , etc.
- Small gatherings of 50 or fewer people with physical distancing allowed.
- Parks reopen playgrounds and basketball courts.
- Other physical distancing measures remain in place.

Except when performing essential services, age 65+ and high-risk stay at home

All work from home if possible

All residents wear cloth masks in public

Schools closed

PHASE THREE

If, after a minimum of 14 days in Phase Two, the trend of new cases continues to decline or remains flat, Nashville may proceed to Phase Three.

- Retail and other commercial businesses open at full capacity with physical distancing.
- Restaurants/bars serving food open at full capacity with physical distancing.
- All remaining bars/entertainment/cultural venues open at ½ capacity with physical distancing.
- Fitness and personal hygiene businesses reopen.
- Small gatherings of 100 or fewer people with physical distancing allowed.
- Nonresidential K-12 schools reopened.
- Parks reopen playgrounds and basketball courts.
- Other physical distancing measures remain in place.

Except when performing essential services, age 65+ and high-risk stay at home

All work from home if possible

All residents wear cloth masks in public

PHASE FOUR

If, after a minimum of 14 days in Phase Three, the trend of new cases continues to decline or remains flat, Nashville may proceed to Phase Four.

- Work from home is optional and use of masks in public is optional but recommended.
- All bars/entertainment/cultural venues may open at full capacity.
- Sports and other live performance venues are reopened for >100 people with physical distancing.
- Other physical distancing measures remain in place.
 - Except when performing essential services, age 65+ and high-risk stay at home
