ACTION ITEMS.

1. Legislative Action Items.

- None.

2. Nonlegislative Action Items.

b. Division II Baseball Committee (*two vacancies*). (Attachment A)

- (1) Recommendation. **Harry Hillson**, head baseball coach, Mansfield University of Pennsylvania (Atlantic region); and **Brian Disch**, head baseball coach, Wayne State College (Nebraska) (Central region).
- (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
- (3) Rationale. Mr. Hillson is from the Atlantic region and Mr. Disch is from the Central region, which would satisfy the vacancy requirements. Mr. Hillson has served for two terms on the regional advisory committee (RAC). Additionally, he is from the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, which has not been represented on the committee since 2004. Mr. Disch does not have RAC experience; however, he has ranking experience from the College Baseball Newspaper Division II poll. He has been involved in baseball, both as a player and a coach, for 13 years. These committee positions have been advertised twice.
- (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
- (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

c. Division II Men's Basketball Committee. (Attachment B)

- (1) Recommendation. **Suzanne Sanregret**, director of athletics, Michigan Technological University.
- (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
- (3) Rationale. Ms. Sanregret would enhance the diversity on the committee. Additionally, she has extensive Division II experience, having served on the

Division II Management Council, the Division II Championships Committee and the Women's Basketball RAC for four years.

- (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
- (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.
- d. Division II Football Committee. (Attachment C)
 - (1) Recommendation. **Dell Robinson**, commissioner, Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, as its first choice and **Michael McBroom**, director of athletics, West Texas A&M University, as its second choice.
 - (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
 - (3) Rationale. The committee believes that both individuals would be excellent choices for the Football Committee; however, the committee selected Mr. Robinson as its first choice because he is an ethnic minority. Both individuals have been involved in Division II, serving on regional advisory committees.
 - (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
 - (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.
- e. Division II Men's Golf Committee. (Attachment D)
 - (1) Recommendation. **Ken Badylak**, sports information director, Saint Joseph's College (Indiana).
 - (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
 - (3) Rationale. Mr. Badylak serves as an administrator in the Midwest/Central region. He is a former golf student-athlete coach and, therefore, would add a great deal of first-hand knowledge of the sport as a member of the committee. There were no nominees with men's golf RAC experience. This position has been advertised twice.
 - (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
 - (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

f. Division II Women's Lacrosse Committee. (Attachment E)

- (1) Recommendation. **Lesley Graham**, head coach, women's lacrosse, Saint Leo University.
- (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
- (3) Rationale. Ms. Graham is the head women's lacrosse coach at Saint Leo University. She has been in Division II for a number of years and would contribute greatly to the committee, as she was also a former lacrosse player in high school and college. Ms. Graham was the only nominee. This position has been advertised twice.
- (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
- (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

g. Division II Men's Soccer Committee (two vacancies—South Central and West region). (Attachment F)

- (1) Recommendation. **Frank Kohlenstein**, soccer coach, Colorado School of Mines (South Central region).
- (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
- (3) Rationale. Mr. Kohlenstein is a soccer coach, with over 14 years of experience at a Division II institution. Additionally, he has been involved with regional advisory committees at both the Division I and Division II levels. He would satisfy the opening for the South Central region (coach). The committee determined that it should reopen the vacancy for the West region, with the requirement that it must be filled by an administrator.
- (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
- (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

h. Division II Women's Soccer Committee (Two vacancies; Atlantic and East regions). (Attachment G)

- (1) Recommendation. **Todd Diuguid**, Assistant director of athletics/head women's soccer coach, University of Charleston (WV).

(2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.

(3) Rationale. Mr. Diuguid is the assistant director of athletics and head women's soccer coach at the University of Charleston (WV). He has served on the Atlantic region women's soccer RAC for the past three years. He would satisfy the administrator requirement for the Atlantic Region.

The committee determined that it should reopen the vacancy for the East region, as the person it believed to be best for the vacant position would not promote the principle of conference rotation. The committee believed that the commissioners from the East region should discuss the vacancy and determine whether conference rotation should override the skills and experience of an eligible candidate.

(4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.

(5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

i. Division II Softball Committee (*Two vacancies; Southeast and Central regions*).
(Attachment H)

(1) Recommendation. **Terri Holmes**, senior compliance administrator, Northern State University, for the Central region; and **Vickee Hollifield**, senior woman administrator/head softball coach, Carson-Newman College, as its first choice for the Southeast region; and **Stacey Vallee**, head softball coach, Francis Marion University, as its second choice for the Southeast region.

(2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.

(3) Rationale. Ms. Holmes is involved in all phases of softball—as a player, coach and administrator. Additionally, she is a member of the softball RAC. The committee recommends Ms. Hollifield as its first choice for the Southeast region as she is the head softball coach and senior woman administrator for Carson-Newman College. Additionally, she is a former member of the Softball Committee and currently serves on the RAC. The committee recommends Stacey Vallee as its second choice for the Southeast region. Ms. Vallee is the head softball coach/senior woman administrator at Francis Marion University and was a member of the RAC from 2005-08.

(4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.

(5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

- j. Division II Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Committee (*Two vacancies*). (Attachment I)
- (1) Recommendation. **Tracy LaVoi Torgerson**, head men's and women's diving coach, St Cloud State University.
 - (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
 - (3) Rationale. Ms. Torgerson is the head men's and women's diving coach at St. Cloud State University. The committee believed diving expertise is essential to the committee. The committee determined that it should re-advertise the second vacancy on the committee to solicit an administrator.
 - (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
 - (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.
- k. Division II Men's and Women's Tennis Committee (*Two vacancies; Atlantic and Central region*). The committee determined that since the requirements for the vacancies were one female and one administrator, the positions should be re-advertised to solicit additional nominations.
- l. Division II Men's and Women's Track and Field Committee. There were no nominees for this position. It will be re-advertised to solicit nominations.
- m. Division II Women's Volleyball Committee (*One immediate and two September vacancies – Southeast, Central and West regions*). (Attachment J)
- (1) Recommendation. **Brian Jamros**, associate director of athletics for external relations, Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference, for the Central region (September 2012 vacancy); **Todd Caughlin**, head women's volleyball coach, Coker College, for the Southeast region (immediate vacancy replacing Taylor Mott); and **Robert Harris**, assistant commissioner, California Collegiate Athletic Association, for the West region (September 2012 vacancy).
 - (2) Effective Date. September 1, 2012.
 - (3) Rationale. Mr. Jamros is the associate director of athletics for external relations at Concordia University, St. Paul. He is currently a member of the Central region women's volleyball RAC. Mr. Caughlin is the head women's volleyball coach at Coker College. He also has RAC experience. In addition, he has experience in operations at Division II events and has attended NCAA

Conventions and regional rules seminars. Mr. Harris has been on RACs for both baseball and men's golf and has served Division II almost exclusively during his career.

- (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
- (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.
- n. Division II Wrestling Committee. There were no nominees for this position. It will be re-advertised to solicit nominations.
- o. Men's Basketball Rules Committee. The committee determined that it would re-advertise this position to solicit additional nominations.
- p. Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Rules Committee (*Two vacancies*). (Attachment K)
 - (1) Recommendation. **Todd Peters**, head women's swimming and diving coach, Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference; **Mary Samko**, swim coach, Bentley University.
 - (2) Effective Date. August 1, 2012.
 - (3) Rationale. Mr. Peters is the head women's swimming and diving coach at Minnesota State University, Moorhead. He has spent the last five years on the Division II Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving Committee and was a member of the swimming and diving rules subcommittee. Ms. Samko is the swim coach at Bentley University and served on the committee from 2008-11. She has been a meet director for many conference championships and is well versed in the rules of swimming. The committees believed the nominees' past committee service will significantly aid the work of this newly created rules committee.
 - (4) Estimated Budget Impact. None.
 - (5) Student-Athlete Impact. None.

- q. Men's and Women's Track and Field Rules Committee (Two vacancies). (Attachment L)
- (1) Recommendation. **Lou Andreadis**, assistant track and field coach, Grand Valley State University; **G. Anthony Grant**, associate director of athletics, Millersville University of Pennsylvania.
 - (2) Effective Date. August 1, 2012.
 - (3) Rationale. Mr. Andreadis is the assistant track and field coach at Grand Valley State University. He sat on the rules subcommittee of the Division II Men's and Women's Track and Field Committee and was chair during his last year. Mr. Grant is the associate director of athletics at Millersville University of Pennsylvania. He has tennis RAC experience and is the track and field sport administrator at his current institution.

Regionalization Talking Points

- ✓ The Division II philosophy statement (as legislated in Division II Bylaw 20.10) indicates that a Division II member "believes in scheduling the majority of its athletics competition with other members of Division II, insofar as regional qualification, geographical location and traditional conference scheduling patterns permit."
- ✓ Regionalization is a Division II championships policy that requires sport committees to select a predetermined number of teams in each of the regions of the sports involved. This policy is based on an assumption that due to the regional nature of most Division II schools, sport committees should evaluate and select championships participants based on regional results, as opposed to a national evaluation in which head-to-head and common opponents' results are less prevalent.
- ✓ The Division II regionalization philosophy provides access to national championships from every region of the country. Regionalization does not guarantee that the best eight programs in the country will compete for a national championship, but does guarantee that the different regions of the country will be represented at the championship by each region's best team.
- ✓ In addition, regionalization encourages a member school to compete against opponents within its region, instead of seeking contests against opponents outside the geographical region. This scheduling incentive is aimed at helping schools manage their regular-season travel budgets and limit missed class time for Division II student-athletes.
- ✓ The Great American Conference applied for active conference membership by December 1, 2010. Per the authority of the Division II Membership Committee, the committee approved the application from the Great American Conference inasmuch as the conference satisfied all legislated requirements. The conference shall be an active Division II conference, effective September 1, 2011.
- ✓ With the approval of a new conference, the Division II Championships Committee was required to place the conference in a geographic region for championships selections.
- ✓ Per Bylaw 31.3.4.5, to be eligible for automatic qualification, a conference must be a member of the Association for two consecutive academic years, unless granted a waiver by the Championships Committee. Thus, the Great American Conference shall not be eligible for automatic qualification until September 1, 2013. The Great American Conference shall be eligible for at-large selections in 2011-12 and 2012-13.
- ✓ During its deliberations, the Championships Committee considered three models. With each model, the following factors were considered in totality as all factors must be considered together and not as stand-alone items (i.e., no one factor is more important than another):
 - conference membership and location of institutions;
 - number of institutions in each region to ensure fair access ratios to the championships;

- size of each region (e.g., mileage between institutions);
- possible future growth of new conferences;
- maintaining no more than three AQ conferences in each region; and
- a transition time for institutions to either adjust or begin scheduling institutions in their new region.

At no time during the deliberations by the Championships Committee did historical or perceived strength of conferences factor into the recommendation.

Recommendation by the Championships Committee:

Effective 2012-13, the Great American Conference and the MIAA will move to the Central Region and the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference will move to the South Central Region.

DIVISION II REGIONALIZATION MODEL

The following regionalization model was approved June 2007 by the NCAA Division II Championships Committee with a mandatory implementation date of 2008-09.

Principles for establishing regions:

- Regions will be determined by state boundaries.
- A state may reside in more than one region.
- All opponents within your geographic region are in-region contests.
- Conferences will be assigned to specific regions for automatic qualification and post-season competition.
- Conference opponents will count as in-region contest regardless of geographic location.
- Opponents residing within your state regardless of conference affiliation are in-region contests.
- All opponents (regardless of conference affiliation) in states contiguous to your state are in-region contests.

The committee has approved the following principles and any changes or additions to these principles must be approved by the committee.

Additional Principles:

- Institutions in the state of Montana will be able to consider Nebraska and Colorado as contiguous states (and vice versa). (There are no Division II institutions currently in state contiguous to Montana's southern border.)
- The west region may consider the states of North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, Colorado and New Mexico as contiguous states (and vice versa).
- Institutions located in MINNESOTA and MICHIGAN may compete against each other and be considered as contiguous states (those contests count as in-region).
- Institutions located in Colorado and Texas are considered contiguous and may count competitions between these institutions as in-region contests.
- Institutions located in Texas and Mississippi are considered contiguous and may count competitions between these institutions as in-region contests.
- Institutions and conferences with a common mission (i.e. Historically Black Colleges and Universities) may consider interconference contests or independent contests against schools with similar missions as in-region, regardless of their geographic location and/or regional assignment.
- Institutions in the Atlantic and East Regions will be able to consider the District of Columbia as in-region contests.

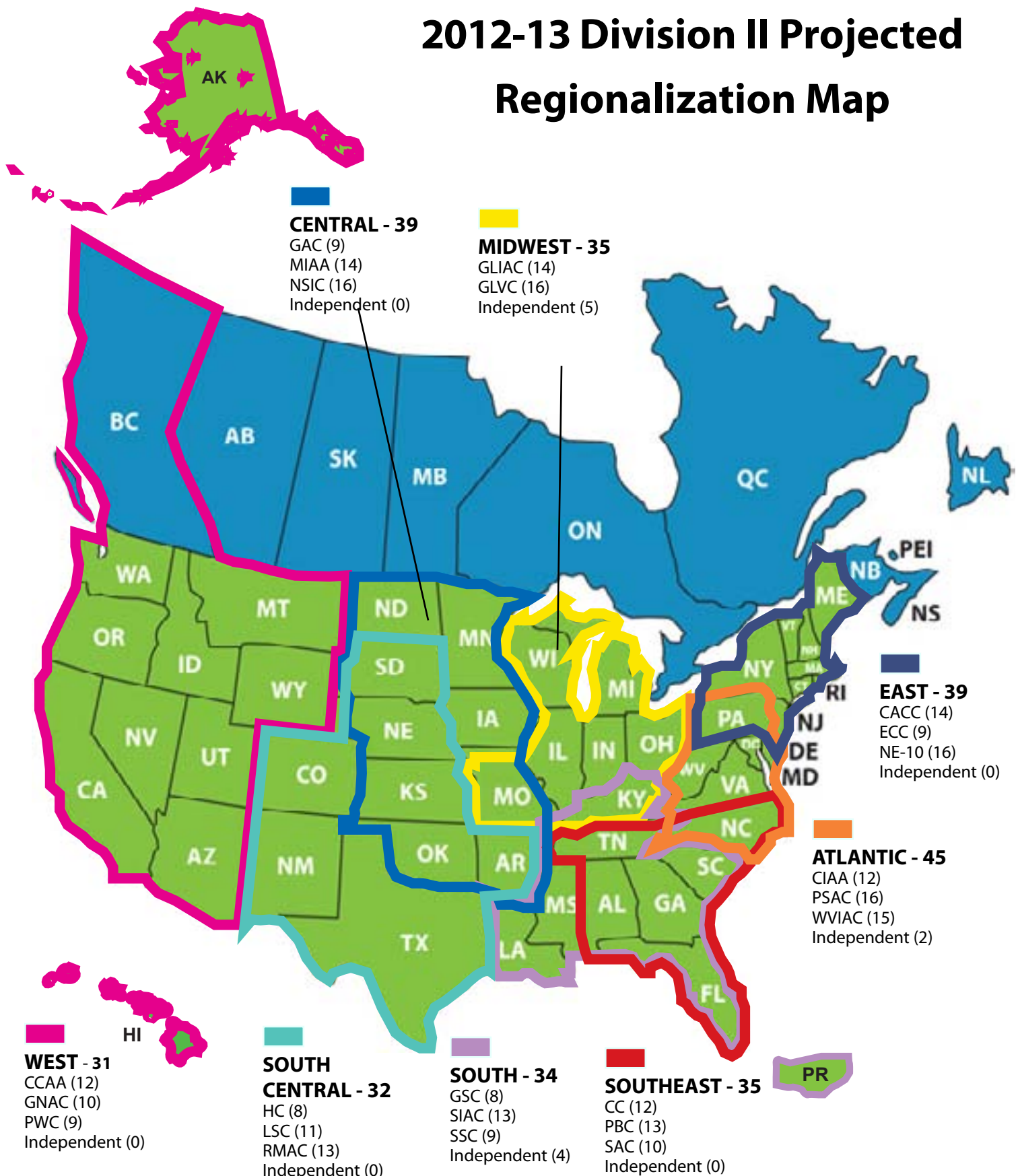

NCAA DIVISION II CHAMPIONSHIPS COMMITTEE
July 9, 2012 Teleconference**

ACTION ITEMS.

1. Legislative Item.

• **Women's Bowling - Number of Dates of Competition.**

- (1) Recommendation. That the Management Council sponsor legislation for the 2013 NCAA Convention that would limit an institution's total playing schedule with outside competition to 32 dates of competition, and that an individual student-athlete shall limit her participation each academic year to 32 dates of competition. Further, all dates of competition of a tournament shall be included in the maximum limitation.
- (2) Effective Date. August 1, 2013.
- (3) Rationale. Under current legislation, institutions and student-athletes may participate in as many as 46 dates of competition, due to the tournament provision, which permits institutions to count up to 10 three-day tournaments as single dates of competition (i.e., $10 \times 3 = 30$ plus 16 additional dates of competition = 46 total). By eliminating the tournament provision, this recommendation standardizes the total dates of competition for institutions and student-athletes and also reduces the total dates of competition for institutions and student-athletes by as many as 14 dates.

This proposal was adopted by Division I, effective August 1, 2011, and by Division III, effective August 1, 2012.

- (4) Budget Impact. Potential cost savings to institutions due to decrease in dates of competition.
- (5) Student-Athlete Impact. This change limits the dates of competition in which student-athletes may participate and reduces travel and missed class time.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS.

1. **Welcome Remarks.** Erin Lind, chair of the Division II Championships Committee, welcomed the new NCAA Division II governance intern, Molly Poitevint, to the teleconference.
2. **2014 and 2015 Baseball Championship site.** Approved that Cary, North Carolina, be designated as the host site for the 2014 and 2015 NCAA Division II Baseball Championship. The championship will be conducted at the USA Baseball National Training Complex with the town of Cary and Mount Olive College serving as co-hosts, effective immediately.
3. **2013 Women's Golf East Regional Site Selection.** Approved that Romeoville, Illinois, be designated as the site for Super Regional One. The championship will be conducted at Prairie Bluff Golf Course with Lewis University serving as the host, effective immediately.
4. **2013 Women's Golf South Regional Site Selection.** Approved that Lakeland, Florida, be designated as the site for Super Regional Two. The championship will be conducted at Lone Palm Golf Club with Florida Southern College serving as the host, effective immediately.
5. **2013 Women's Golf Central Regional Site Selection.** Approved that St. Joseph, Missouri, be designated as the site for Super Regional Three. The championship will be conducted at St. Joseph Country Club with Missouri Western State serving as the host, effective immediately.
6. **2013 Division II Football Championship.** The Championships Committee was updated on the current standing with North Alabama as the 2013 Division II Football Championship host. At this time, the NCAA Division II Football Committee is proceeding to plan for the championship to occur in Shoals, Alabama, through 2013. The next open bid will be for the 2014-15 academic year. The committees (Championships Committee and Football Committee) are both interested in ensuring a host is affiliated with Division II.

The Championships Committee will continue to receive updates on the membership status of North Alabama and the football championship selection process in upcoming meetings.

7. **Division II Athletic Directors Association (D2ADA) and Conference Commissioners Association (CCA) Summer Meeting Recap.** The committee was provided an update on the Division II ADA and Division II CCA summer meetings. The committee will receive a written recap with requests for possible next steps from the D2ADA and CCA summer meetings at its September 2012 meeting.
8. **2012-13 and 2013-14 Regionalization Maps and State Charts.** NCAA staff provided the updated regionalization maps and state charts per the Championships Committee action taken (at the May 2012 meeting) on the placement of South Dakota School of Mines and Technology in the South Central region during the 2013-14 academic year. The maps and charts shared on this teleconference reflected that change. No action or updates were necessary.
9. **2012-13 Women's Tennis Automatic Qualification (AQ).** Following the May 2012 Championships Committee meeting, it was noted that the Heartland Conference was excluded from automatic qualification in women's tennis; the Championships Committee took action to update the automatic qualification accordingly.

The Championships Committee approved that the following conferences receive automatic qualification for the 2013 NCAA Division II Women's Tennis Championship: Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference; Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association; Conference Carolinas; East Coast Conference; Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference; Great Lakes Valley Conference; Gulf South Conference; *Heartland Conference*; Lone Star Conference; Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association; Northeast-10 Conference; Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference; Pacific West Conference; Peach Belt Conference; Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference; Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference; South Atlantic Conference; Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference; Sunshine State Conference; and West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

10. **International Membership Hosts.** The Championships Committee received a brief update related to the ongoing Canadian law on single-game betting, which is pending action by the House of Parliament. The Championships Committee will add this to its agenda for the August teleconference to continue to monitor whether action is needed related to postseason hosting by international institutions. No action or updates were necessary on this agenda item.
11. **Future Meetings.** The Championships Committee reviewed its upcoming meeting schedule. The next teleconference is August 2 and the next in-person meeting and joint

12. meeting with national governing sports committee chairs is scheduled for September 10-12 in Indianapolis.
13. **Other Business.** The Championships Committee asked to review roundtable topics for the September 2012 joint meeting on the August teleconference.
