Requirements:

Twelve members, including six Division I representatives (including all subdivisions); three Division II representatives; three Division III representatives, and three student-athletes. The committee must include at least 8 ethnic minorities, four males and four females. One student-athlete from each division shall serve in an advisory capacity and may serve on the committee up to two years after the completion of his or her intercollegiate eligibility. In Division II and Division III at least one representative will be a member of the Management Council as addressed in Bylaw 21.8 and 21.6.
