MY SERVANT WILL SUCCEED!

Comfort, yes comfort My people...' (Isa. 40:1). In the latter years of his life, the future of Israel surely weighted heavily on Isaiah's mind. Despite his inspired warnings, the prophet knew that Jerusalem would surely be destroyed and her people taken into Babylon. Yet, he could also see something far better on the horizon.

Four Servant Songs are found in Isaiah 42-53 which were designed to give hope to Israel. Aspirations of the heathen notwithstanding, Jehovah would raise up His Servant whom no nation or idol could forbid (cf. Isa. 41:21-29). Each Servant Song paints a unique portrait of the Messiah. The first announces that He would succeed in His purpose.

Isaiah 42:1-4 identifies a purpose, method, and result. Justice has to do with law, rule, and government, and such is the purpose of the Servant's coming identified in this passage. "He will bring forth justice to the Gentiles" (v. 1), "He will bring forth justice for truth" (v. 3), and He will "establish justice in the earth" (v. 4). The Servants' rule would be just and righteous in character and universal in scope. But His dominion would not be inaugurated like the kings of the earth. There would be no fanfare, demonstrations, or public proclamations. Rather, He would conquer with truth (v. 2-3). He would not exalt the rich at the expense of the poor. Instead, He would restore life and strength to the weak and helpless (v. 3). And though He would face severe difficulty in His mission, He will be successful in what He sets out to do (v. 4).

If there were any question as to the identify of this Servant, Matthew puts it to rest by quoting Isaiah 42:1-4 and applying it to Jesus (Matt. 12:15-21). Though the Pharisees sought to kill Him (Matt. 12:14), Jesus did not fight back. Rather, "who when He was reviled, reviled not again; when He suffered, He threatened not..." (1 Pet. 2:23). He removed Himself from the situation. Though He had the power to take their lives, such was not the nature of the Son of God. God's Servant had a higher purpose than self-vindication (cf. Phil. 2:5-10). He came to "bring forth justice" and reign as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Though His methods were unconventional to the minds of men (cf. 1 Cor. 1:18, etc.), Jehovah's Servant was absolute in His success.

What happens when men read the Bible determined to find the will of God —(John 7:17)


"We're doing this for God-He'll accept it!"



It is interesting how man has made worship more about "man" and "man's likes" than he has about God and God's demands. There is a mentality, which is often voiced, regarding worship that, "We're doing this for God, to give the praise to Him. He will accept it." Unfortunately, such sentiments are actually proven completely contrary to what God will accept.

Many examples of worship in the Bible could be cited to show that God, in fact, does not accept just any effort of man to worship Him, including Cain (Gen. 4:3-5), Nadab and Abihu (Lev. 10:1-3), King Saul (1 Sam. 13:1-14), many Jews (Matt. 15:8-9), etc. But consider closely the sincerity of the persons who will say to Jesus at the judgment, "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?" (Matt. 7:22). It is not enough to think that the Lord will accept what I do for Him (including in worship)! We must truly do "the will of [the] Father in heaven" (7:21)! Does your worship follow the demands of God in the New Testament?

Close to Having a Heart Attack

When the Lord said, "Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life" (Prov. 4:23), He obviously is not talking about that large muscle in our chests. The Bible uses the word "heart" over 800 times and almost always, if not actually always, refers to that inner part of our being. When the Lord discussed the greatest commandment, He spoke of loving God will all our heart, soul, and mind. That inner part of us is our soul.

What does it mean to keep your heart with all diligence? Our time and energy is limited and priority must be given to those things which are truly important. When the Lord described the attention which must be given to the heart, He used the word "all." There is nothing more important than to devote ourselves and our time and energy to caring for our heart. Satan understands this and works to cause a severe "heart attack."

Look at some of the words used to describe how we are to keep our heart. We are to love the Lord with all our heart (Deut. 6:5). We are to seek the Lord will all our heart (Deut. 4:29). We are to serve the Lord will all our heart (Deut. 10:12). We are to obey the Lord with all of our heart (Deut. 30:2). We are to trust the Lord with all our heart (Prov. 3:5). We are to turn to the Lord with all our heart (Deut. 30:10). Consider carefully the words mentioned above—love, seek, serve, obey, trust and turn. What could be more important than these words!

Think about it for a moment. If you were Satan, how would you attack the heart of Christians? It would not be a full-frontal attack using temptations he might openly use against the most worldly individuals. Is it not reasonable to see him getting the righteous to modify the level of their dedication? Would he not seek to weaken the love, the seeking, the serving, the obeying, the trusting and the turning to God? Would he not do this

while at the same time deceiving us so we can hardly see the changes? In reality, it is a full-frontal attack, and we are not even aware of it. This is why the Bible speaks of the deceitfulness of sin.

Sometimes we measure our heart conditions by looking in the wrong places. Jesus described how the people in the first century focused on the external. "This people honors Me with their lips, but their heart is far from Me" (Mark 7:6). These same words seem to describe our own day. Can we not see the danger in the way he attacks us? Satan attacks our hearts in this same way, and he wins if we are deceived by him. Think about the list of words mentioned above, just make sure that you are not close to a heart attack.
