Ellia Chiang | Williams First Year, Forward, Quincy, Mass.

Chiang had a hand in four of the five goals Williams scored in a pair of wins over William Smith last weekend. She was credited with the game-winning goal in both contests. She scored the Ephs' first goal in the first period of a 2-0 win and then netted the game-winner in the third period of a 3-2 victory. She also picked up assists on the two other Eph goals in the 3-2 win.

NESCAC Notes

Amherst - First-year Alyssa Xu (Bayside, New Brunswick) scored the Mammoths' lone goal in a 3-1 loss at Nazareth. She has scored three goals in the last four games and is Amherst's leading goal-scorer...Bowdoin - goaltender Meg Miranda (Mendon, Mass.) posted her third career shutout in a midweek win over Southern Maine. Miranda stopped 17 shots in the victory...Colby - Senior Nina Prunster (Salzburg, Austria) tallied her second and third shutouts of the season and was named the MVP of the Castleton University Spartan Invitational. The Mules outscored SUNY Potsdam and Castleton, 10-0, over two games to claim the title. Junior Bri Michaud-Nolan (Wells, Maine) tallied five assists while classmate Jillian Mazzocca (West Hartford, Conn.) scored three goals. Senior Lexi Cafiero (Guilford, Conn.) was named to the all-tournament team with one goal and three assists... Connecticut College - After defeating UMass Boston, 3-2, on Tuesday, Connecticut College placed third at the Spartan Invitational last weekend. The Camels tied Castleton, 3-3, and defeated SUNY Potsdam, 3-0. Senior Melissa Alexander (Bellingham, Mass.) led the way with four points. She picked up an assist against UMass Boston, two helpers at Castleton, and scored an insurance goal against SUNY Potsdam...Hamilton - Junior Nancy Loh (Syracuse, N.Y.) recorded four points in a 7-0 win over Saint Michael's. She registered her first hat trick at Hamilton and added an assist against the Purple Knights. She has 27 goals and 27 assists for 54 career points...Middlebury - The Panthers were idle last week...Trinity - Senior Ellie Fellows (Westport, Mass.) had a goal and an assist in a 4-3 overtime loss to Suffolk and added an assist in a 5-1 victory against Johnson and Wales... Wesleyan - First-year Christina Tournas (Redding, Conn.) posted the first three-point game of the season for any Cardinal as she tallied one goal and two assists to lead Wesleyan to a 6-1 win at Manhattanville on Saturday. The win moved Wesleyan to 6-0 on the season, marking the best start in program history. Tournas' first career goal came early in the second period and proved to be the game-winner.
