# **NESCAC Player of the Week**



# Patrick Callahan | Bowdoin Sophomore, Forward, Skaneateles, N.Y.

Callahan spearheaded a third-period rally for the Polar Bears on Friday night, assisting on two goals and scoring the game-tying tally in a five-goal outburst as Bowdoin rallied for a 5-3 win over Connecticut College. On Saturday, Callahan assisted on two more scores, including the overtime game-winner as Bowdoin beat Tufts. For the weekend, Callahan racked up five points on a goal and four assists as the Polar Bears locked up a NESCAC First Round home game.

#### **NESCAC Notes**

Amherst - Senior Sean Wrenn (Charlestown, Mass.) assisted on two of the Mammoths' three goals last week. He had one helper in a 3-2 overtime loss against Middlebury and added another in a 3-1 loss versus Williams. He is tied for the team-lead in goals (8) and points (7)...Colby -The Mules entered the final weekend of the regular season with a 0.5 point lead in the standings. Sophomore goaltender Andy Beran (St. Paul, Minn.) turned away every shot he saw (36 saves) to post shutouts against Tufts and Connecticut College and help Colby secure the top seed in the NESCAC Championship. Beran has five shutouts on the season. The last time Colby finished the regular season at the top of the standings was 2007-08... Hamilton - Senior Jordi Jefferson (Wasaga Beach, Ontario) had a hand in both goals in the Continentals' 2-2 tie with Williams. He had the primary assist on Hamilton's first goal and scored the second goal. The multi-point game was his fourth this season...Middlebury - Sophomore netminder Jake Horoho (East Greenwich, R.I.) recorded a .924 save percentage to help lead Middlebury to a 3-0 week in NESCAC play. The goalie stopped 85 shots over three games, registering a 2.31 goals against average for the week. Horoho was instrumental in the Panther's 3-2 overtime victory at Amherst, as he made back-to-back saves in the extra session to help lift Middlebury past the Mammoths. Junior Antoine Belisle (St. Bruno, Quebec) tallied three goals and an assist during the week, including the overtime gamewinner against Amherst...Trinity - Senior Cole Poliziani (Burlington, Ontario) had a goal and assisted on the game-tying tally in a 3-2 overtime win at Wesleyan. At home against Wesleyan, Poliziani added another assist in a 6-3 victory... Tufts - First-year Tyler Sedlak (Wyckoff, N.J) scored two goals for the Jumbos in their regular-season finale at Bowdoin on Saturday, including a goal with 12 seconds left that tied the score at 3-3 to force overtime. His first goal came early in the second period to tie the game at 1-1... Wesleyan - Junior Go Uemura (Albertson, N.Y.) scored three goals in two games against Trinity last weekend, including his first career multi-goal game as he scored twice in Saturday's loss in Hartford.
