Carley Daly | Amherst Junior, Forward, Allston, Mass.

Daly scored three goals in two games last week. She scored the only Mammoth goal of a 1-1 tie with Colby on Saturday, then scored twice as Amherst defeated the Mules 4-1 on Sunday. Her first goal gave the Mammoths a 1-0 lead just nine seconds into the contest and her second tally closed out the scoring with 90 seconds remaining. The win and tie against the Mules allowed the Mammoths to grab the No. 3 seed in the NESCAC Championship.

NESCAC Notes

Bowdoin - Junior goaltender Dani Marquez (Long Beach, Calif.) made 39 saves Saturday at Middlebury, surpassing 1,000 saves for her career in the two-game set against the Panthers... Colby - Trailing by a goal in the waning seconds of the second period Saturday night, junior Madi Aumann's (Middletown, R.I.) one-timer tied the score and the game would end in a 1-1 draw. The goal was Aumann's first of the season for the Mules...Connecticut College - Senior Natalie Witkowski (Cheshire, Conn.) netted the game-winner in a 1-0 victory over Hamilton on Friday...Hamilton - Junior Abby Kuhns (Skaneateles, N.Y.) scored a goal and blocked two shots in a 4-1 win at Connecticut College. Senior Sidney Molnar (Norfolk, N.Y.) made 41 saves on 43 shots on goal in two games against the Camels. One of the two goals she allowed was a power-play goal...Middlebury - Sophomore Cat Appleyard (Rye, N.Y.) scored four goals and tallied five assists in a 3-0 week for Middlebury, lifting the squad to a perfect 21-0-0 (15-0-0) regular-season mark. Appleyard recorded points in all three victories and all of four goals were of the power-play variety. She leads the NESCAC with eight power-player goals. Appleyard ranks sixth in the NESCAC with 22 points (11 goals, 11 assists)... Trinity - Sophomore Hannah Leclair (Kensington, Prince Edward Island) totaled 77 saves and allowed three goals in three games, as the Bantams went 1-1-1 to close the regular season. She had 21 saves in both a 2-1 win over Connecticut College and a 1-1 tie at Wesleyan. Leclair closed the week with 35 saves in a 2-0 loss at Wesleyan... Wesleyan - Junior netminder Rei Halloran (Boston, Mass.) allowed one goal across two games last weekend, helping the Cardinals earn a tie and win over Trinity. She started with 28 saves in a 1-1 tie in Hartford. Halloran followed up with a 21-save shutout in a 2-0 home win over the Bantams on Saturday. It was her third shutout of the season and career. The win over the Bantams secured Wesleyan the No. 8 for the NESCAC Tournament and a home game against No. 9 Connecticut College in the first round.
