NESCAC Player of the Week



Jack Forrest | Williams

Senior, Forward, Ridgefield, Conn.

Forrest assisted on the first Eph goal and scored the game-winner as No. 3 Williams defeated No. 6 Amherst, 3-1, in the NESCAC Quarterfinals giving the Ephs a three-game sweep of the Mammoths this season. Williams advanced to the NESCAC Semifinals for the 10th time since 2008-09.

NESCAC Notes

Amherst - First-year **Max Thiessen** (Alexandria, Va.) scored his first collegiate goal and the Mammoth's lone marker in a 3-1 NESCAC Quarterfinal at No. 3 Williams...**Colby** - Sophomore **John McElaney** (Walpole, Mass.) tallied four points on two goals and two assists in a 5-1 quarterfinal win over No. 8 Tufts. He assisted the first goal halfway through the first period to give the Mules an early 1-0 lead. McElaney scored his first goal early in the second frame to break a 1-1 deadlock and proved to be the eventual game-winner. His second goal and assist came in the third period to open up the game as the Mules eased to the win and the right to host the remaining rounds of the NESCAC Championship...**Hamilton** - Senior **Nick Rutigliano** (Upton, Mass.) scored his seventh goal this season and the 13th of his career in the Continentals' 3-2 NESCAC Quarterfinal win at No. 4 Wesleyan. The defenseman was also credited with two blocked shots. His goal against the Cardinals gave Hamilton a 1-0 lead early in the first period...**Middlebury** - First-year **Tucker Lamb** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) tallied his second goal in as many games, while goalie sophomore **Jake Horoho** (East Greenwich, R.I.) made 28 saves during NESCAC First Round action against Tufts on Friday...**Trinity** - Sophomore **J.P. Mella** (Stamford, Conn.) made 34 saves in Trinity's win over No. 10 Connecticut College in the NESCAC Quarterfinals, recording his first career shutout in a game that Trinity won, 5-0, despite being outshot, 34-33...**Tufts** - Sophomore **Andrew Gunlock** (Springboro, Ohio) had a hat trick for the first three goals of his career as Tufts defeated No. 9 Middlebury, 4-1, in the first round of the NESCAC Championship on Friday. His goal at 17:06 of the first period put Tufts up 1-0 and he scored at 2:17 of the third period for a 3-0 margin. His third goal was an empty-net, shorthanded tally with 1:52 remaining in the game. The win was Tufts' third against the Panthers this season.
