Mitch Likins | Amherst

First Year, Goalie, Encinitas, Calif.

Likins made 40 saves in 104 minutes in goal for the Mammoths and allowing only 12 goals and posting a .769 save percentage. In a quarterfinal win over Williams, he had six saves on seven shots in the second quarter as Amherst pulled away for a 7-4 lead, and made six more stops in the fourth quarter to snuff out a Williams comeback attempt. In a 16-10 win over Trinity, he had stopped 11 of 13 shots he faced in the first half as Amherst built a 7-2 halftime lead. He also had three ground balls on the week.



Mac Bredahl | Tufts

Senior, Attack, Chatham, N.J.

In a showdown for the top seed in the conference against previously undefeated Bowdoin, Bredahl scored 12 points with four goals and eight assists in 23-15 Tufts victory. The eight assists and 12 points were both the second-most in a game in Tufts history. After Bowdoin closed to within 16-12 entering the fourth quarter, he set up four goals in the fourth as Tufts pulled away. Bredahl finished the week with five goals and 12 assists for 17 points, including a goal with four assists in the quarterfinal versus Connecticut College.

NESCAC Notes

Bates - Senior **Jackson Sell** (Mill Valley, Calif.) tallied a team-high three points in his final game as a Bobcat at Colby on Wednesday. His one goal and two assists against the Mules gave him 27 points on the season, tied for second on the team. Sell's 18 goals this year ranked first on the squad...**Bowdoin** - Bowdoin tied the school record for wins in a season (15) with its quarterfinal win over Hamilton, propelled by a one-goal, seven-assist performance from senior **Donal Mullane** (Washington, D.C.)...**Colby** - First-year goalie **Will Rickards** (Andover, Mass.) recorded 12 saves in a regular-season victory over Bates. The game marked the third straight for Rickards with double-digit saves...**Connecticut College** - Junior **Jared Rainville** (Watertown, Conn.) tallied nine goals and four assists for 13 points in the final two games of the season for the Camels...**Hamilton** - In his first game since March 8, junior **Torben Wunderle** (Tacoma, Wash.) scored two goals and assisted on two others in a 13-11 setback at Bowdoin in the a NESCAC Quarterfinal. He also scooped up one ground ball. The four points against the Polar Bears tied a career high...**Middlebury** - First-year **Russell Thorndike** (Brookline, Mass.) tallied three goals and two assists to factor into nearly half of Middlebury's scoring plays in a 13-10 win in the regular-season finale against Williams. Junior goalie **Finn O'Connor** (Stamford, Conn.) registered 21 saves over two contests last week...**Trinity** - Sophomore **Cooper Yaccino** (Kenilworth, Ill.) made 20 saves, scooped up three ground ball, recorded a caused turnover, and allowed just two goals to help the Bantams earn an 11-2 win over Hamilton. He added 14 saves and one ground ball in a 16-10 loss to Amherst on Wednesday...**Wesleyan** - Junior **Matt Gill** (Duxbury, Mass.) tied Wesleyan's NESCAC Tournament single-game scoring record as he recorded eight points in the Cardinals' 17-9 quarterfinal win over Middlebury. Matching his career-high with four goals to go along with four assists, Gill's eight points matches Carter Hawthorne's total of eight points in a semifinal win over Tufts in 2017...**Williams** - Sophomore **Calvin Caputo** (Pennington, N.J.) netted five goals and registered two assists in two games last week.
