Boel went 17-for-20 for 249 yards and three touchdown passes and added a rushing touchdown on the opening drive. Boel posted the best completion percentage in a single game in school history (85%) with 20 or more attempts and the second-highest passing efficiency rating (249.0) in a game in Division III this season.

Helbig posted a career-high three sacks to go along with two forced fumbled and seven tackles (four solo) in a 41-10 win over Bates. Helbig recorded a tackle for loss and forced a fumble on a crucial 4th-and-goal play on Bates' opening drive to snuff a scoring chance. Early in the third quarter with Bates trailing by 10, Helbig strip-sacked the Bates quarterback to set up a Wesleyan touchdown two plays later. Through 19 career games, Helbig has 16 career sacks and 27 tackles for loss.

Devanny registered six saves to keep a clean sheet in a 3-0 win over Brandeis. Through four games this season, Devanny has three shutouts and 20 saves.

In a 1-0-1 NESCAC weekend Felitto led the Ephs with six points on three goals, as the Ephs defeated Bates, 4-0, and earned a 2-2 draw against Tufts. Felitto netted both goals against the Jumbos, including the equalizer in the 67th minute. Felitto's goal in the 13th minute against the Bobcats gave Williams a 2-0 lead and was the first marker of the season for the Eph. The draw marked the first time Williams earned points in a match against Tufts since 2013.

In a 2-0 week for the Mammoths, Papalia recorded 64 digs (9.14 per set) in NESCAC victories over Middlebury, 3-1, and Hamilton, 3-0. The libero registered a career-high 44 digs in a four-set win over the Panthers and totaled 12 assists in the two matches.

NESCAC Notes

Bates - First-year Ellie Asada (Honolulu, Hawaii) anchored Bates' back line with a match-high 26 digs at Bowdoin and followed that effort with a team-best 15 digs at Connecticut College. Asada is averaging 3.68 digs per set to rank eighth in the NESCAC...Bowdoin - Senior setter Ella Haugen (Minneapolis, Minn.) averaged 8.4 assists per set, had eight kills, and three service aces in a pair of weekend matches for the Polar Bears...Colby - The Mules snapped a 26-game losing streak to Bowdoin and posted a 2-0 mark in conference play last week. Senior Hannah Wyllie (Rockland, Mass.) led Colby to its first victory over Bowdoin and the team's first 6-0 start since 2005. Wyllie collected 13 kills and seven blocks in a win at Conn. College and hit .500 with 13 more kills in the victory over Bowdoin. First-year LJ Grant (New York, N.Y.) also contributed 14 and 20 kills against the Camels and Polar Bears, respectively. Grants leads the NESCAC in kills per set (3.73)...Connecticut College - Sophomore Katherine Randall (Chicago, Ill.) led the Camels to a split in NESCAC action last week, totaling 29 kills and 33 digs over eight sets. Randall posted match highs of 13 kills and 21 digs in a 3-0 victory over Bates, hitting a season-high .394 for the match and tied a season-high with 16 kills while adding 12 digs in a five-set setback to Colby...Hamilton - Junior Summer McClintic (Baldwinsville, N.Y.) posted 20 kills and 21 digs in a 1-1 weekend for the Continentals. McClintic tied a career-high with 13 kills and added nine digs and 14.5 points in a five-set victory at Williams. The win was Hamilton's first in Williamstown in at least 20 years...Middlebury - Sophomore Gabbie O'Toole (Overland Park, Kan.) extended a streak of dishing out 20 or more assists in every match played as a Panther. O'Toole leads the conference with 221 assists, including a season-high 37 against Amherst. Junior Kelly Ferrero (San Francisco, Calif.) leads the NESCAC with 5.65 digs per match and recorded a season-high 34 last weekend...Trinity - Junior Lola Craig (Los Angeles, Calif.) totaled 19 kills, 62 total attacks, and three assists in two matches last week. Craig led the Bantams in each match with 11 and eight kills, respectively, while also leading Trinity with 35 total attacks, two assists, and an ace against Tufts... Tufts - Junior Christine Audette (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.) led the Jumbos in kills (4.0 per set) and service aces (4) while averaging 2.86 digs per set as the team opened its NESCAC schedule. Audette had 14 kills against both Wesleyan and Trinity, leading Tufts against the Cardinals and tying for the team lead versus the Bantams. Audette also added 15 digs in four sets versus the Bantams and served three aces at Wesleyan... Wesleyan - Sophomore Michelle Jorba (New York, N.Y.) led Wesleyan to three more wins last week, as the Cardinals stand 7-0 on the season. She totaled 39 kills (3.55 per set) with a .355 hitting percentage. Jorba led the team in blocks, totaling 14 including four solo, and recorded a 14-kill, 3.5-block effort in the Cardinals' first sweep of Tufts since 2002. Jorba added a career-high 17 kills and a .640 hitting percentage to go along with two blocks against Keene State...Williams - Junior Marit Hoyem (Menlo Park, Calif.) helped the Ephs post a 2-1 record last week. The middle hitter registered 33 kills, including a match-high 19, in the Ephs' win over Middlebury. Hoyem hit .438 for the week and also chipped in 10 service aces, 13 digs, and 13 blocks.
