2023 NESCAC Baseball Weekly Release

NESCAC Notes

Amherst - **Jack Sampedro** (Miami, Fla.) batted .571 with three doubles and scored five times last week for the Mammoths with one walk. In an 8-4 win over WPI, the sophomore went 3-for-5 with a double and a run scored. Sampedro also pitched 1.1 innings to earn a save. First-year **Naaveen Narayanan** (Malvern, Pa.) earned his first collegiate victory in an 8-4 win over WPI, throwing five innings, allowing six hits, walking four, and striking out eight.

Bates - **Brandon Biggane** (Rensselaer, N.Y.) went 8-for-15 at the plate over four games last week, tallying two hits in every contest. The sophomore homered twice, drove in eight runs, scored seven runs, drew four walks, and stole three bases in three attempts. Biggane leads the Bobcats on the season with a .405 batting average and his 16 RBIs are tied for second in the NESCAC. Junior Noah Timmer (Keene, N.H.) earned his first collegiate win in his first start for the Bobcats, tossing five innings of two-run ball, scattering six hits, and striking out two in an 18-6 win for Bates at Dean.

Bowdoin - Junior **Gabe Peckler** (Newton, Mass.) batted .667 in the Polar Bears' final three games in Florida, including four runs scored, three RBI, and three extra-base hits. For the trip, Peckler finished with a .474 batting average, a .524 on-base percentage, and a .789 slugging percentage.

Colby - **Marcus Forrester** (Marshfield, Mass.) led the Mules with seven hits as Colby won four of its last five contests last week. The junior collected three RBIs and scored three runs, and four of his seven hits were doubles. In Friday's walk-off win over St. Olaf, Forrester doubled in the final inning to knock in the tying run and scored the winning run moments later on a sacrifice fly. **Ryan Grecco** (Andover, Mass.) appeared in relief in three of Colby's last five games. The sophomore totaled 4.2 innings of scoreless baseball without allowing a hit. He walked one and struck out three.

Hamilton - **Jackson Sattinger** (Port Washington, N.Y.) hit .500 (7-for-14) with eight runs scored, nine runs batted in, and eight walks in a 5-1 week for the Continentals. The highlight was an 11-1 win against St. Lawrence when Sattinger hit a three-run homer, singled, walked, and drove in five runs. In a 13-3 victory against SUNY Canton, the junior doubled, tripled, and plated a pair of runs. **Peter Jones** (Concord, Mass.) went 2-0 and allowed one run on nine hits and five walks, and struck out eight in 10 innings for the Continentals. Jones allowed a solo home run in six innings of a 10-2 win against St. Lawrence. The sophomore finished the week with four shutout innings and six strikeouts in a 16-9 victory against Cazenovia.

Middlebury - First-year **Spencer Dessart** (Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla.) helped Middlebury post a 10-0 shutout in the nightcap of a doubleheader versus California Lutheran on Saturday to complete a three-game series sweep. The rookie earned his second win on the mound, striking out a career-high nine batters and allowing just two hits over six innings of work.

Trinity - **James Stefanowicz** (Norwalk, Conn.) went 9-for-16 with nine runs, four doubles, and three RBIs to help Trinity win four of five games. The junior went 3-for-3 with two runs, with a stolen base, and was hit by a pitch in a 13-2 win at Washington & Lee. Stefanowicz was 4-for-4 the next day with three runs, three doubles, and two walks with another stolen base in a 12-11 victory at Eastern Mennonite. **Jonathan Link** (Holmes, N.Y.) pitched 2.2 innings of scoreless relief, allowing two hits and striking out three to earn a win at Eastern Mennonite. The sophomore also pitched four innings with four strikeouts, allowing one run, and four hits in a loss to Endicott.

Tufts - Senior **Jimmy Evans** (Norwalk, Conn.) went 7-for-16 (.438) with a run scored, two doubles, and two RBI. Evans is second on the squad with a .313 batting average while having hits in his last five outings.

Wesleyan - **Kyle Sylvester** (Hanover, Mass.) prolonged his hitting streak to 12 games as he went 5-for-11 at the plate in three games last week. The graduate student scored three runs, drove in five, and had three extra-base hits (all coming in the same game). Sylvester went 3-for-5 with two doubles and a triple against Oberlin to record his second career three-hit game. **Ian Appleby** (Cohasset, Mass.) entered in relief and went five innings without allowing an earned run in a 14-4 win over Carleton. The junior struck out four and didn't issue a walk in his five innings of work.

Williams - Sophomore **Henry Juan** (Big Flats, N.Y.) went a combined 7-for-16 in the batter's box, with six runs, five RBIs, two home runs, and two doubles, in a 1-3 week for the Ephs. **Michael Amendola** (Rumson, N.J.) earned his first collegiate win, going five innings in an 11-6 win against Knox. The first-year gave up five runs and seven hits while striking out three batters and walking one. Amendola retired the side in order in the third and fifth innings.

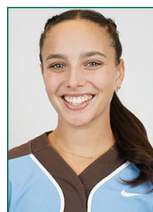

NESCAC Notes

Amherst - **Randi Finkelstein** (Merrick, N.Y.) went 6-for-11 (.546) last week in a 3-1 week for the Mammoths, hitting three home runs, driving in nine runs, scoring seven times in the four-game stretch. The junior also walked twice and was hit by a pitch, giving her OBP of .643 for the week. **Abby Moravek** (Libertyville, Ill.) went 2-0 in the circle in a 3-1 week for the Mammoths. The rookie posted a 1.62 ERA for the week, allowing 10 hits in 13 innings, walking four, and striking out eight. Moravek pitched a complete-game shutout in a 5-0 win over NESCAC foe Bowdoin, allowing four hits and walking two while striking out six.

Bates - Senior **Cassidy Musco** (Walpole, Mass.) hit safely in seven of eight games last week for the Bobcats. Highlights included going 2-for-4 with a run scored, two RBI, and a double in a win over Carleton, going 3-for-4 with two runs scored in a win over Keuka, and going 3-for-4 with two runs scored and a double in a win over Lawrence. Musco is hitting .514 on the season, the fourth-highest in the NESCAC. **Katherine Merisotis** (Coventry, Conn.) picked up her first two collegiate wins and her first collegiate save last week for the Bobcats. The senior made her season debut with an inning of shutout ball in a 4-3 victory over Wisconsin-Platteville, earning the save. She allowed just one run on two hits and struck out three to pick up the win in a 12-4 victory over Keuka. Her best performance of the week came against Lawrence, where she tossed four innings of one-run ball, earning the win in a 9-1 victory for the Bobcats. Overall, Merisotis sports a 3.50 ERA in 10 innings pitched so far this season for Bates.

Bowdoin - **Chloe Garcia** (Bakersfield, Calif.) batted .400 across seven games for the Polar Bears. The rookie scored five runs and reached base at a .500 clip thanks to four walks.

Colby - Senior **Amanda Cabral** (Whittier, Calif.) led Colby with 11 hits and batted .440 in eight games last week. She went 4-for-4 against Wisconsin-Platteville and 2-for-3 against Elmhurst. **Abby Orso** (York Harbor, Maine) made six appearances in the circle last week, totaling 28 innings pitched and 18 strikeouts. The junior threw a complete game in a 3-2 win against Manchester, allowing one earned run and striking out five.

Hamilton - **Katlynn McGivney** (Shoreham, N.Y.) hit .750 (9-for-12) and scored six runs in a 3-1 weekend against two NESCAC opponents. McGivney started the weekend with a career-high four hits, including two doubles, and a stolen base in a 7-5 setback against Bowdoin. The senior went 2-for-3 in an 8-0 win against the Polar Bears, 2-for-2 with a walk in an 8-0 victory against Wesleyan, singled, was hit by a pitch, and drove in two runs in an 8-4 triumph against the Cardinals. McGivney has hit safely in all 14 games this season. **Natalie Beebe** (Glenmoore, Pa.) went 4-1 with an ERA of 1.55 in five appearances for the Continentals. Beebe allowed five earned runs on 14 hits (two for extra bases) and four walks with 13 strikeouts in 22.2 innings. The junior tossed a six-inning shutout against Bowdoin and blanked Wesleyan over five innings in two 8-0 wins. Beebe came back in Game 2 against the Cardinals and gave up one run and fanned five in five innings of an 8-4 victory. The shutouts were the second and third of Beebe's career.

Middlebury - Over eight games, **Kristyn Carroll** (Kennelton, N.J.) paced the Panthers with a .476 batting average and recorded team-bests in runs (10), hits (10), RBI (10), and triples (3), while also recording a home run. The rookie also went 1-0 in the circle, recording an ERA of 0.00 as she gave up just two hits and did not allow a run in three innings while striking out a pair to help Middlebury top Kalamazoo 11-7. **Jewel Ashbrook** (Fremont, Neb.) posted an ERA of 2.68 over a pair of games. The senior pitched 15.2 innings and gave up just six runs, while striking out five batters. The Panther also batted .500 over the two games, recording three hits, a trio of RBI, one run, and a triple.

Trinity - **Tiffany Stowers** (Burke, Va.) went 9-for-18 with three runs, two doubles, a triple, two RBI, a stolen base, and was hit by a pitch in six games. Stowers doubled and scored the game-tying run in the seventh inning to lift Trinity past St. Lawrence, 5-4. The junior drove in the game-winning run with an RBI single in the third inning of a 4-5 victory against Buffalo State. Stowers also contributed in the circle for the Bantams. She allowed just three earned runs over 21 innings pitched with nine strikeouts in three appearances. Stowers picked up three complete game wins, a 6-0 shutout of Old Westbury, a 5-4 win over St. Lawrence, and a 4-3 victory against Buffalo State. Stowers tossed a five-hit shutout with seven strikeouts against Old Westbury and a two-hitter with no earned runs allowed against St. Lawrence.

Tufts - **Emilie Doty** (Arlington, Va.) earned three wins and did not allow an earned run during 13 innings in five appearances (two starts) for Tufts last week. The rookie allowed just five hits and struck out 15. Doty had four strikeouts and did not allow a run in three innings against Wisconsin-Platteville, then struck out six Kalamazoo batters while allowing no runs.

Williams - **Kelly McGuigan** (San Mateo, Calif.) recorded at least one hit in every game and hit .350 in a 2-4 week for the Ephs. The junior tallied one RBI, one run scored, and one double. Sadie Leonard went 2-0 in the circle last week.

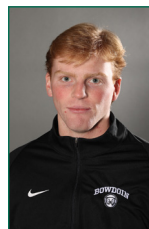

Fitzgerald scored eight goals, handed out three assists, and had seven ground balls in a pair of Polar Bear wins last week. In Bowdoin's NESCAC win over Wesleyan, Fitzgerald scored a game-high five goals with five ground balls. That was after a three-goal, two-assist effort in a midweek comeback win over Endicott. Fitzgerald has a team-best 27 goals this season for the Polar Bears.

NESCAC Notes

Amherst - **Jake Bennett** (Philadelphia, Pa.) scored seven goals and added six assists for 13 points in a 2-0 week for the Mammoths. The junior was credited with the game-winning goal in a 17-8 win over Springfield and had four goals, three assists, three ground balls, and a caused turnover in a 22-15 win over St. John Fisher... **Bates** - **Garrett FitzSimons** (Garden City, N.Y.) recorded 15 saves and posted a season-best save percentage of .517 against Middlebury. The senior also tallied three ground balls in the contest... **Colby** - **Jack Goller** (Napa, Calif.) tallied a career-high five goals in a setback at Hamilton. The senior added two assists to factor into seven of Colby's 11 goals... **Connecticut College** - **Aidan McAvo** (Charlotte, N.C.) netted a game and career-high five goals in an 11-9 victory over Williams last week. The attack scored twice in the final 2:41 of the contest and notched the first game-winning goal of his career.
