

Biblical Philosophy of Missions

- We commit to glorify God in all that we do, which is the chief aim of missions (Revelation 4:11; I Corinthians 10:31).
- We commit to share the Gospel with the world, which is the biblical mandate for the church and all believers (Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15; Acts 1:8)
- We commit ourselves to evangelizing the lost and discipling believers, which is the foundational focus of the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20).
- We commit to planting, self-governing, self-supporting, self-propagating churches based upon the New Testament model found in the book of Acts (Acts 2:42-47). We believe this is the most effective means of fulfilling the Great Commission.
- We commit to train future leaders in the church by following the biblical example of Paul, who developed leaders, such as Timothy and Titus, through personal training for leadership roles (II Timothy 2:2).
