TEACHER INTRODUCTION [GRADES 9-12]

Each of the videos has a viewer guide designed for teachers of high school students. You may use any or all of the episodes in social studies or science classrooms.

Each episode of Watershed 360° begins with the same two questions. "Who cares about a watershed? And why?"

Each episode ends with the question, "Do you know your watershed?"

Tell students that they should be able to answer these questions after viewing most or all of the episodes. However, the first two questions have many different answers.

If you are planning on using the Watershed series over the course of a few days, you may want to post these questions and remind students as they watch the videos to be able to answer these questions. Each video may have different answers to these questions. Since the videos are very short, don't be hesitant to replay multiple times to retrieve the information and view from different angles.

Captions appear throughout the videos to emphasize key points in each episode. Each of the view guides lists the captions and the times of their appearance.

The viewer guides, also, include sets of questions to be used before viewing and after viewing each episode.

Notice that in the upper left corner of the screen you can click on the arrows to rotate the viewing angle.

An introductory activity is provided to be used before watching the videos. Several culminating activities are provided to be used after viewing all or most of the episodes.

As the students watch the Watershed series have them pay attention and note the following:

- Locations
- Occupations
- Environmental
- Unfamiliar Terminology
- Uses of the water (For business, recreation, and life)

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
