It also helps that people actually like the game. It's a pretty standard online FPS shooter with regular PvP as well as a 100-player battle royale mode. The regular PvP includes standard deathmatch along with some iterations. Players can also customize their gears and unlock more things. It's relatively new compared to most FPS games, but it's already one of the biggest names in all mobile games. Critical OpsPrice: Free to playCritiC Ops is one of the newer FPS games. It's technically still in public beta without a full release yet. In this one, you can choose to be part of an anti-terrorism unit and stop destruction or play as a terrorist and cause destruction. It features online multiplayer modes, leaderboards, and decent graphics to create a pretty complete overall experience. The game has evolved significantly from its early days and manages to be one of the really great FPS games on Android not named PUBG Mobile or Fortnite.Dead Effect 2Price: Free to playDead Effect 2 is a sci-fi FPS game with elements of horror, survival and RPG. You will play as the main character and you can choose one of three main characters. In addition, you have tons of equipment, weapons and body implants to find and level up during the game. It has more than 20 hours of campaigning and plenty of upgrade options. Of course you'll be leveling up your character as well. It has great graphics as well. This is one of the better FPS games for players who enjoy history and campaign more than competitive matchmaking. Hitman SniperPrice: \$4.99 with in-app purchaseHitman: Sniper is one of the more unique FPS games. Your character is out outside a building, looking in with a sniper rifle. Your job is to take the different goals without anyone being above your location. Den Den Contains over 150 missions, various sniper rifles to unlock, leaderboards, and it also has some strategy elements. It's relatively cheap and can be a lot of fun if you prefer a bit more strategy instead of raw, super quick action. Infinity OpsPrice: Free to playInfinity Ops is one of the newer FPS games on mobile at the time of this writing. It was launched under a different name and re-branded shortly after. It boasts a multiplayer online competitive experience in a sci-fi setting. The game contains above average social features, clans, various in-game weapons, jet packs, and a variety of game modes. Graphics and mechanics are also quite good compared to most average FPS games. Most of the game's feedback is surprisingly positive with the exception of those that run into the bugs. Into the Dead 2Price: Free to playInto the Dead 2 is one of the newer FPS games. It has a lot of the same mechanics from the first. You run through fields of zombies to survive. The player gets a ton of weapons to unlock and upgrade. This variant also includes some strategy elements and dog companions as well. The graphic is above average. It also plays well for being a mobile game and contains multiple endings. The game has a surprising amount of depth to be a mobile game. It's a freemium game and it's never ideal. But it is still an excellent FPS game. Modern Combat 5: eSportsPrice: Free to playModern Combat 5 is among the most popular and mainstream FPS games on mobile. If you have somehow never heard of it, Plants vs Zombies is basically an action-strategy game where you take on big and bad zombies with your army of plants, each of which has its own unique offensive or defensive capabilities. There is no word on when the game will officially be released, but we know it will be a free-to-play title with microtransactions.4. The title was developed by Spokko, which CD Projekt bought two years ago specifically to work on a new mobile game. We now know that the game will put you in the shoes of an early Witcher (hundreds of years before Geralt of Rivia) to travel around the real world hunting monsters. That's right, The Witcher is getting the Pokémon Go treatment. The game promises console-quality graphics and a robust crafting system to make potions, traps and more. Summoners War: ChroniclesSummoners War was one of the first mobile games to achieve huge popularity, and this upcoming Android and iOS game will let you relive the excitement in a whole new way. Even if you have long moved on to other games, it has a special place in many people's hearts as their first mobile game addiction. Summoners War: Chronicles is a real-time MMORPG that takes place 70 years before the events of the original game. In it, players can select teams of three characters, each of which can summon three monsters. These called armies take on massive commanders with the help of other players around the world. This is just the first game in Com2Us' efforts to expand the Summoners War universe, so expect to hear about more games soon. As for a release date, we know it will be some time by the end of 2020, but no further details have been released.6. NieR Re [in] carnationNew mobile games in an established console or PC series are often dumbed-down versions that extend life between Game and Slot Machine. Slot Machine. Nier Re [in] carnation looking to buck this trend. Although developed by a mobile-focused developer, the game will be produced by Yosuke Saito and directed by Yoko Taro, as will hit titles NieR Automata and its prequel NieR. The two have stated that the game does not feel like a smartphone game, and the goal is not to cash in on the brand, but rather create something interesting. The trailer above shows an absolutely amazing game that seems to be more about platforming and exploration than action. No release details have been provided, but we are keeping a close eye on this one.7. Pokémon UniteOne of the last thing fans expected from June 24 Pokémon Presents was a Pokémon mobile MOBA game, but that's just what they got in Pokémon Unite. The game allows you to take direct control of some of your favorite Pokémon in a 5v5 arena battle. Read also: Pokémon Unite: Everything you need to know! The standard MOBA formula has been somewhat adapted to Pokémon, with gameplay that favors catching wild Pokémon and depositing them in certain zones to get points. There are two levels instead of three and no towers, but apart from that the gameplay seems very similar to popular MOBAs like League of Legends or Dota 2.The game is being developed by Tencent's heavy-hitter team at TiMi studios, which as previously worked on two of the most popular games around: PUBG Mobile and COD Mobile. We still don't have a release date, but we should soon hear more about Pokémon Unite.8. Warhammer: OdysseyFans of the long-running wargaming series Warhammer Age of Sigmar should get excited about this upcoming Android game. Set in the old world, it's an MMORPG that allows players to explore some of the most iconic places in Warhammer lore. Apex LegendsBut news of a mobile version of Apex Legends is few and far between, we know for sure that Respawn Entertainment's hit battle royale title is coming to mobile devices soon. Shortly after the game's release, devs confirmed that a mobile version is in progress. Unfortunately, we haven't heard much about it since then. We may hear more about the mobile launch at some point in the near future, but at this point, it is unclear when exactly the game will be released. Still, another great mobile fight royale title to compete with PUBG Mobile and Fortnite is something to look forward to.10. Pokémon SleepAlthough this is the second Pokémon title on this list of upcoming Android games, it was announced much earlier. Pokémon Sleep was first announced way back in May 2019, although there has been little news since. Still, new games in the Pokémon franchise are always and this one takes a unique approach. Instead of actively exploring to capture them all, Pokémon Sleep is designed to make sleeping for entertainment by tracking your sleep patterns. It's not entirely clear how this will work, but Pokémon Go successfully turned going into entertainment, so who knows. Stay tuned for more details on this one some time in 2020.11. H1Z1H1Z1 is a battle royal game, similar to PUBG and Fortnite. You jump out of a plane with up to 150 other players and start looking for guns, ammunition and other supplies when you land. Then it's time to go hunting and take down as many opponents as possible. The last one standing wins. Playzone gets smaller and smaller throughout the game, bringing players closer together and making sure you're always on your toes. Just like in PUBG there are vehicles available so you can get from place to place faster. You can play solo or team up with one or even four other players. H1Z1 is not as popular as PUBG or Fortnite, but it still has millions of devoted fans. It is free to play and available on PS4 and PC. The company has confirmed a mobile version is in the works, but there are no details on when it will arrive.12. Project Cars GOProject Cars, a popular racing game on Xbox One, PS4 and PC, gets a mobile spin-off. Called Project Cars GO, it will come with lots of exotic cars and tons of customization options, like PC and console versions. Project Cars is known for an authentic racing experience, and the mobile version promises just that. The game has sold over two million copies worldwide so far and is one of the best of its kind. Little Food Studios CEO Ian Bell said racing fans will be trampling the gas pedal and burning rubber very soon, making us think it won't be long before Project Cars GO makes its debut. Diablo ImmortalBack in November 2018, developer Blizzard Entertainment announced that it is working on Diablo Immortal, its second mobile game. The title is being developed from scratch, so it is not a port in a previous Diablo PC or console game. Archangel Tyrael is believed to have died, while Worldstone has been crushed in various fragments. Path of Exile MobilePath of Exile was first released back in 2013, but constant updates and attention from developer Grinding Gear Games have kept the game relevant and popular all these years later. Now, a mobile version is one way and it seems to be a very faithful customization. In the official trailer above, it is revealed that the game is being developed in-house (with some delicious shadow being cast on PoE's main competitor Diablo's upcoming mobile title), which should mean that key gameplay elements remain intact. That said, there's a reason developers rely on studios with more mobile development experience, so don't expect PoE Mobile to have a smooth and efficient development period. For now, Path of Exile Mobile is still listed as an experimental title, so it's entirely possible that it never sees an official release date. Stay tuned for more news on this one.15.
