Girls Inc. implements girls-only after-school, sports, and outreach programs that give girls more opportunities to thrive and learn new skills.

Girls Inc. Outreach Programs are offered at off-campus sites that girls in Monroe County are already attending. These sites include schools, Boys & Girls Clubs, and other youth service organizations throughout Bloomington and Ellettsville. They currently have three programs planned for the 2017-2018 school year: Work It Out teaches girls about strong and healthy relationships and targets girl-on-girl aggression by building respect, empathy, and fairness. **Redefining Beauty** inspires girls to look past the messages society and the media send them about beauty by building up self-esteem and giving the girls the tools to challenge these messages. **Economic Literacy** is a program that builds self-reliance by giving girls the message that they are in control of their financial future, through exploring a wide range of financial issues.
