## Agua Viva is a Christian ministry dedicated to helping vulnerable, at-risk Guatemalan children grow up to be well educated, godly families and serving their own people.

Agua Viva's vision is to rescue and educate children to be successful Christian adults with the desire and ability to help their own people.

Colegio Evangelico Agua Viva was established for grades K-8. With over 320 students from the area, Agua Viva School has the best reputation in the surrounding communities. They uniquely offer a computer lab, science lab and music department.

Guatemala Children's Mission is the state-side organization that oversees the ministries and organizes service projects for the home.

Hundreds of adults and teenagers have come to Agua Viva to do short-term mission work, bringing with them a heart for these children and needed supplies. The Sherwood Oaks team will be interacting at the school and doing work projects on the grounds. No prior experience in construction or teaching is necessary.

## SPECIFICS

### DATES: JULY 4-11, 2026

**PROJECTS:** The family team will be interacting with the children (playing, teaching, learning), doing work projects on the grounds as assigned by the Agua Viva staff, and touring cultural sites in the Guatemala highlands.

**TEAM:** A maximum of 25. The only criteria are flexibility, patience, and a servant's heart.

**TRAVEL:** Air travel from Indianapolis to Guatemala City. A bus will transport the team to Chimaltenango and while touring.

**HOUSING:** The team will stay at Agua Viva in dorm-like facilities.

**FOOD:** Varied Guatemalan and American meals will be prepared by the staff cooks. The best tortillas in Latin America are made in Guatemala!

**R&R:** The team will tour the beautiful city of Antigua, the colonial capital of Central America. There will be time to be refreshed spiritually, and to build relationships with God's family there.

**COST: \$1550 for adults / \$1450 for those 12-15 yrs. old**, includes airfare and ground costs, food and lodging at Agua Viva, and insurance. It does not include food on travel days or souvenirs. Please bring additional funds as desired for extras.

**DOCUMENTS:** A valid US Passport is required. Passport applications are available at any US Post Office. The process takes 4 to 8 weeks.

**FUNDRAISERS:** Fundraising packets are available through SOCC after registration. All funds raised are applied directly to individual project costs.
